

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

June 2, 2024

Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." - Mk 14:23-25

Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God. (Heb 9:14) **Gospel:** "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." (Mk 14:22-24)

GOSPEL MEDITATION

The best way to understand the Eucharist is to recall God's long, careful teaching process beginning in the Old Testament. This week in Exodus 24, we learn the basic pattern. Moses reads the dictates of God's law to the people, who profess their allegiance to it. Then Moses takes representatives of Israel's twelve tribes and splashes the sacrificed blood of animals in two directions: on the altar and on the people. It's clear and serious business: clear, because the participants are entering a blood-bond with God Himself; serious, because the dead animals symbolize the life-and-death stakes at play.

Many centuries later, God uses the experience at Sinai to teach us something new. At the Last Supper, like a new Moses, Jesus proposes to "pour out" blood as a new covenant. It will land on the altar of the cross and the lips of his disciples. They have promised to be obedient to him who is God's law in flesh. This renews and elevates the breath-taking romance God wants with His people, unfolding from Sinai to this Supper. The Body and Blood of Christ is the sacrificial action whereby this covenant is strengthened.

How hopeful that, like us, the Israelites and the apostles repeatedly fail to live up to their promises and discover that the blood of the covenant continually renews and refreshes them. Today the blood of Christ faithfully flows, to unite and renew, moving us forward toward where our great teacher is taking us. This week, we should say a renewed "amen" to God who so carefully teaches us how to be one with Him in this new covenant.

The Junipero Serra Route is the longest of the four paths pilgrims will travel with the Blessed Sacrament across the United States this summer. This route will stop in Sedalia, Pilot Grove, Boonville, Columbia, Jefferson City, and Starkenburg.

There will opportunities to worship:

Encounter the abundant love of God in the Eucharist at one of the community events:


- July 1: St. Vincent de Paul, Sedalia

- July 3: Newman Center, Columbia, and Cathedral of St. Joseph, Jefferson City

- July 5: Our Lady of Sorrows Shrine, Starkenburg

There will opportunities to walk:

Between the community events, the 12 perpetual pilgrims who have community to walk from San Francisco to Indianapolis will process the Eucharist along the Katy Trail from parish to parish. Individuals are welcome to join them, assuming responsibility for themselves. All distances are approximate.

- July 2: From St. Joseph, Pilot Grove, to Ss. Peter & Paul, Boonville (12.5 miles)
- July 3: From Ss. Peter & Paul to New Franklin (3.5 miles); from the outskirts of Columbia to St. Thomas More Newman Center, along the MKT Trail (4.7 miles); from the outskirts of Jefferson City to the Cathedral of St. Joseph (4 miles).
- July 5: From the Cathedral of St. Joseph to the Proto-Cathedral of St. Peter (2 miles).



Q: "Do any other Christian faiths have communion?" --Elisabeth G., 18

A: Most Christian churches have some form of communion. But, excluding a few rare exceptions, only the Eastern Orthodox, have the same Eucharist as the Roman Catholic Church — the Body and Blood of Christ made present under the "appearances" of bread and wine. Like Catholic priests, Orthodox priests have apostolic succession and valid priestly orders, so they are able to change bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ.

Most Anglicans (and their American counterparts, Episcopalians) and Lutherans

believe in a form of the Real Presence — that Jesus' body and blood are present along with the "substance" of bread and wine - a view the Catholic Church rejects. Most Evangelical or Fundamentalist Protestants deny any form of "Real Presence" of Jesus in Communion. They teach that Jesus is either only "spiritually" present, as He is at other times when Christians gather, or symbolically present, with the bread and wine simply representing Him. The Catholic Church also rejects these views as incomplete at best.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED: Deacons

Question: At a parish council meeting, our pastor mentioned the need for deacons. It is something I am considering. How do I know if I have a vocation? What steps should I take next?

Answer: Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the Body of Christ, what one member does affects all. What the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then acknowledged by the official

call to orders or to service. If you are considering

becoming a deacon, the first step would be to talk to your pastor. He will be able to give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how you apply. You might also begin to see a spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer, your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply. Best wishes!
