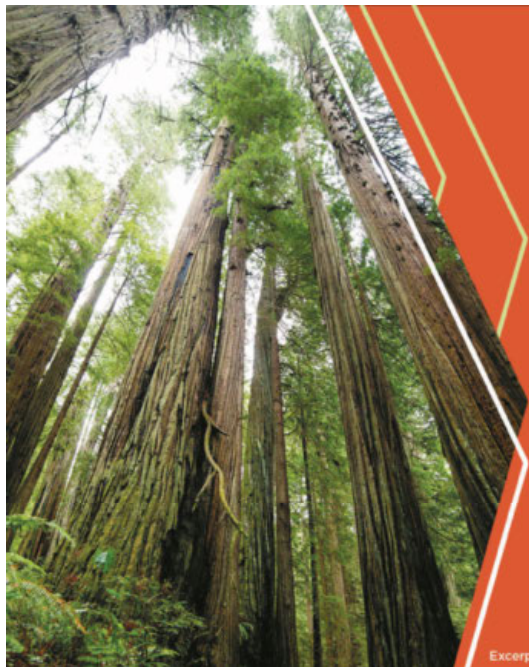

First Reading: But you shall say to them: Thus says the Lord GOD! And whether they heed or resist — for they are a rebellious house — they shall know that a prophet has been among them. (Ez 2:4-5)

Psalm: Our eyes are fixed on the Lord, pleading for his mercy. (Ps 123)

Second Reading: I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me. (2 Cor 12:9)

Gospel: "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." (Mk 6:4)

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Recently I watched a bunch of YouTube videos on how to optimize willpower in the face of weakness. The message was: do not accept your weakness. Crush it. Dominate it. In one video, however, at the end of a rant by a willpower coach, the muscular stoic admitted, "You'll never actually get what you want, no matter how hard you try." Amazingly, he admitted that willpower alone is not sufficient for us weak-willed humans.

What does God want us to do with our weaknesses, if crushing them with willpower won't work? For example, what should I do with my tendency to arrogance and self-isolation? Or my procrastination? Or my intellectual and physical limitations? Or my selfishness?

The counter-intuitive answer is clear in this week's words from St Paul, "**I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses in order that the power of Christ may dwell in me (2 Cor. 12:9).**" Boast of our weaknesses? Paul isn't promoting weak-mindedness or laziness. Rather, he perceives that Jesus loves us not despite our weaknesses but because of them. Boasting of our weakness means claiming human will is not all we have. It means turning to God whenever we feel weak, which—let's face it—is almost all the time. When we do, we learn to love our weaknesses, because it's there that we meet the strength of Christ. This week, I challenge us to find ways to boast not in willpower but in weakness. — *Father John Muir*

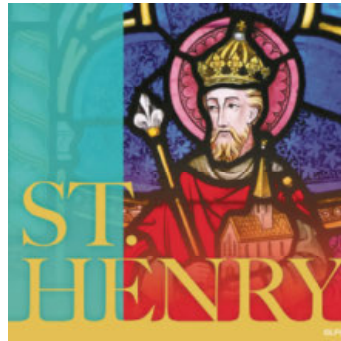

Dear Parishioners of Ss. Peter & Paul, Boonville, and St. Joseph, Pilot Grove,

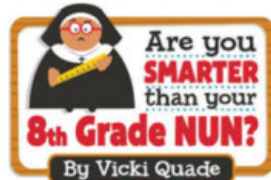

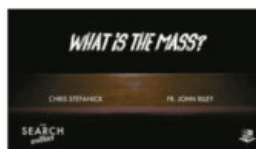

Q: "Does the Church advise against marrying a non-Catholic?" — Helen M., 17

A: The Church encourages marriages between Catholics and warns against the added difficulties which can accompany mixed marriages (marriages between a Catholic and a baptized non-Catholic) and what are called marriages with disparity of cult (marriages between a Catholic and non-baptized person.) There are serious dangers in mixed marriages. The couple risks bringing the issues of Christian disunity into their marriage and family life. Catholics and non-Catholic Christians often have profound differences on matters of doctrine, morality, sacramental worship, and church practice that can pose grave problems, especially with respect to raising children and their religious formation. Problems are even more severe where Catholics and non-Christians marry. Here's another reason: When someone marries a non-Catholic, the Catholic might have a more difficult time practicing his or her Faith. The

two people are not taking advantage of the most valuable marital resources available: God and His Church. When questions of morality, finances, the raising of children or some other important issues arise, the spouses may approach the problem from different perspectives. This can even happen to two Protestant Christians who worship in different denominations. Because the Church has 2,000 years of collective wisdom on the topic, it knows the challenges and sacrifices that couples face. When both parties have devotion to the Eucharist or Our Lady, and take advantage of frequent Confession, they are well equipped to handle problems due to the special grace that comes their way. Catholics need the express permission of Church authorities to marry lawfully a non-Catholic Christian and the same to validly marry a non-Christian. WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Face-to-Face Confession

Question: In Year B, we hear primarily from the Gospel of Mark. Since each Evangelist has a unique perspective, what are the key issues that Mark addresses in his Gospel?

Answer:

Gospels are a particular faith community's reflection on Jesus. Each



Gospel's author reflected that community's faith in Jesus. Jesus' message is made relevant to the community's situation and context.

Mark was the first Gospel to be written. When Matthew and Luke wrote theirs, they imitated and adapted Mark for their communities.

Mark's Gospel seems to be addressed to a faith community undergoing turmoil, rejection, and persecution—forces that threaten to overwhelm them.

This provides the context around which Mark fashions

the story of Jesus. He presents Jesus as the One sent by God to confront the forces of evil. That is the good news of Jesus. Jesus' struggle with the demonic forces leads to confron-

tation, rejection, outright opposition, and a conspiracy to do away with him.

Realizing this, Jesus is not deterred. Rather Jesus calls for total faith in God who helps us to overcome the forces of evil. Suffering and even death seem to be the consequences of this struggle. Yet, that is not the end. The one who suffers for the sake of others, the suffering servant, will be the one through whom redemption and salvation will come to all. For Mark, this is what discipleship demands and what true faith in God can and will accomplish. See if you can detect these themes as you read Mark's Gospel.

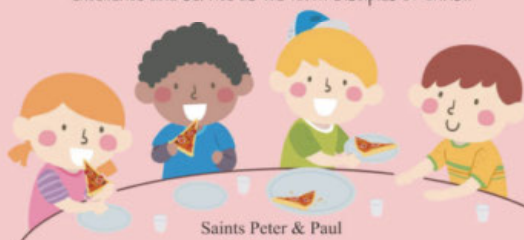

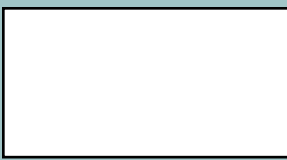


