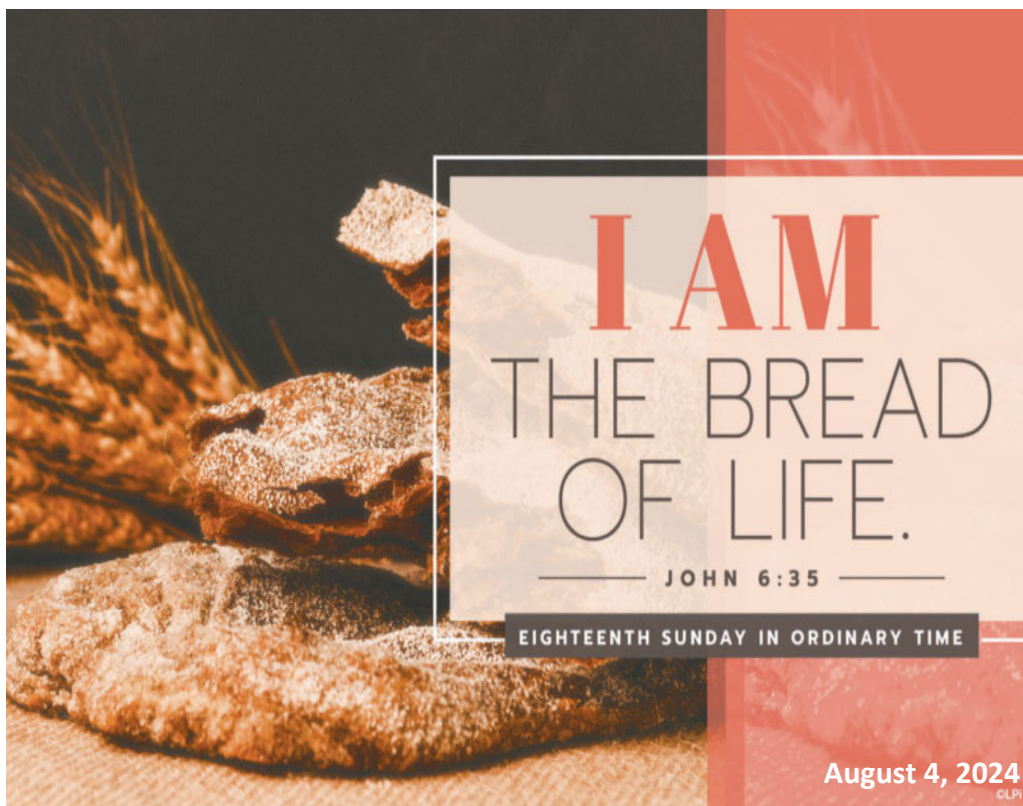

First Reading: "I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion." (Ex 16:4)

Psalm: The Lord gave them bread from heaven. (Ps 78)

Second Reading: Be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth. (Eph 4:23-24)

Gospel: "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." (Jn 6:35)

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Since my college days I've loved a song called "Dance with You" by the rock band Live. It touches on the deep mystical hunger of our heart: "I've tasted all the wines/ a half a billion times/ came sickened to your shore/ you showed me what this life is for." These lines resonate with anyone who has feasted on the good things of this world only to be left spiritually hungover and unsatisfied.

We see a similar dynamic evoked by Jesus' words after he feeds the crowd with bread and fish. To teach them to hunger for God, he recalls God's gift of manna-bread for the hungry ancient Israelites. Those folks had grown spiritually sick from the idolatrous food of Egypt yet still longed for more worthless pagan food. So, God sent heavenly bread to nourish their bodies, but also to heal their distrustful hearts. His people — like us — must learn to hunger and thirst for God alone. Before we can receive that which will not disappoint, we first must cease expecting that earthly goods will satisfy us.

We will get to the Lord's teaching on the Eucharist in the next two weeks. But first, he asks us: do you trust me to take care of you? Do you trust me to give you what you need for each day, and to not worry about the next day? Do you see that when you hungrily stuff yourself with the things of this world you become sick and lose your taste for the bread of life? So, our hungry hearts cry out: Lord, help us to trust that you'll provide for our every need. Help us to use only what we truly need. Help us hunger for the goodness of your Son, who is the true bread from heaven. That is what this life is for.

Q: "If a woman is abused by her husband, could she get an annulment?" — Gabriela S., 17

A: Only if the "marriage" was not valid to begin with. Spousal abuse *may* be an indicator of other problems which could have been present when the marriage was contracted that invalidated it, but this is by no means certain.

It is also possible that someone in a valid marriage later chose to become abusive.

In an abusive situation where the marriage is valid, an annulment is not possible. A spiritual advisor or counselors such as a priest may recommend a temporary or even indefinite separation because of the danger to one or both of the involved parties, but the hope is that the situation is temporary. If it ends up being an extended situation, neither of the parties can remarry.

Again, the abuse may be a symptom of some deeper problem. This deeper problem may offer some reason to render the marriage invalid. If not, then the abused party should offer up his or her sufferings with the sufferings of Christ. Picking up this heavy cross will difficult, but it can be the path to eternal life.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Confession

Question: If God knows everything we do, why do we need to go to Confession?

We are not alone in our walk of faith!

Answer: Another term for the Sacrament of Confession is the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



We go to this sacrament not only to confess our sins, but to be reconciled with God.

Of course, this begs the question, "If I can pray to God on my own, why can't I be reconciled to God on my own?"

In the seven sacraments, we recognize the importance of community. Sacraments like baptism or matrimony happen in the context of the wider church to remind us of the communal impact of our lives.

We don't need to confess our sins in front of the whole community – thank God! But going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a

tangible reminder that our sins affect not only ourselves and our relationship with God, but others as well. Jesus gave his Apostles authority to forgive sins in his name.

Through this sacrament, we are really, truly forgiven by God Himself. We receive an outpouring of grace and strength to sin no more and our relationship with Christ and his Body, the Church, are restored.


