#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

The famous Russian novelist Fyodor Dostoyevsky said, "Love in action is a harsh and dreadful thing." In the Gospel reading this week, Jesus does something harsh and dreadful — he watches his own disciples abandon him. What could possibly be loving about that?

Well, we notice the context is Jesus' teaching about eating and drinking his body and blood. His followers hear this and say, "This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" (John 6:60). We shouldn't imagine we'd do anything different, because not even the ones who stay, like Peter, seem to understand what Jesus is saying. Then we hear this devastating line,

"Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him" (John 6:66). Besides the night of the Last Supper, only now do Jesus' disciples abandon him. And, painfully, Jesus just lets them go.

The best way to make sense out of this is love. Jesus is God's love in action. He wants to become one with those whom He loves. He wants to love them as His own body. Yes, the oneness manifested in the Eucharist sounds harsh and dreadful because it is rooted in love which is willing to risk abandonment and separation to attain its goal: to be one body with the beloved. It is both terrifying and wonderful that Jesus will risk losing us in order to be one with us. Our response? Lord, we cannot grasp a love so great, but please help us never to abandon it, either.







## Q: "What are mortal sins and what makes them different from venial sins?" -Jared K., 15

A: Mortal sin is a serious offense against God that deprives the soul of sanctifying grace, which is necessary for salvation. It also takes away all merit of our previous good actions and separates us from God. This grace and merit can be restored once we are reconciled to God. A sin is mortal sin when it involves a serious matter (such as one of the Commandments), when we sufficiently reflect on its seriousness, and when we choose to do it anyway by giving the full consent of our wills. With mortal sin, we lose the virtue of charity (love). We may retain the other two theological virtues of faith and hope, but these are not sufficient by themselves for salvation.

Mortal sins are like the nails

that were driven into Jesus' hands and feet. It Is precisely beause of these sins (past, present, and future) that He died on the cross.

Venial sin is a less serious offense against God that does not cause us to lose sanctifying grace. Strictly speaking, we do not have to go to Confession for venial sins, although it is certainly helpful to our spiritual development to confess them when we think of them. A sin is venial when it is not seriously wrong or, if seriously wrong, it is done with less than full knowledge or full consent. Venial sin harms us by making us less fervent to serve God. If mortal sin is death to a soul, then venial sin should be considered a wound to the soul. If left unattended, venial sin can weaken us and make us susceptible to more serious sin.






