

**First Reading:** I prayed, and prudence was given me; I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me. I preferred her to scepter and throne, and deemed riches nothing in comparison with her. (Wis 7:7-8) Psalm: Fill us with your love, O Lord, and we will sing for joy! (Ps 90) Second Reading: Indeed the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any twoedged sword. (Heb 4:12) Gospel: "Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." (Mk 10:21)

### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

This week we hear of the man who inquires of Jesus how to obtain eternal life. He rejects Jesus' invitation to sell his goods, give to the poor, and follow Jesus. Mark tells us this devastatingly sad line, "At this saying, his countenance fell and he went away sorrowful; for he had great possessions" (Mark 10:22). The man's heart wasn't centered on Jesus, but on his possessions. Perhaps Jesus intuited this. Now, we don't know if Jesus intended to actually make him go through with it, like God's call to test Abraham's willingness to sacrifice Isaac. But sadly, in this case the willingness was not there to entrust everything to Jesus. And this made the man deeply sad.

For most of us, the literal dispossessing of our goods is not our call. But as Christians, a consistent renouncing of them is. This week, especially if you're noticing a persisting sadness, I invite you to hear Jesus calling you to acknowledge that none of your possessions are finally yours. They are God's and on loan to you. We get so addicted to that stuffy and sad word, "mine." At Mass, we rehearse this attitude of joyful detachment by giving bread, wine, and money to the Lord, as if to say, "Lord, all I have is yours." And what we get back is a sadness-defeating joy beyond all description: knowing that He is ours, and we are His.

What possessions are pre-occupying you at the moment? Write them down. Intentionally offer them to the Lord at the next Mass you attend. — Father John Muir




### Q: "If you sin, can you still get into heaven??"

### Her Divine Motherhood

Early Church; Upheld by the Council of Ephesus in 431 A.D. Mary is properly called the Mother of God (Theotokos) because her son, Jesus Christ, is both true God and true Man. Never did Christ give up any of His two natures since His Incarnation.



## Her Perpetual Virginity

Early Church; Upheld by the Church Fathers The Incarnation of Jesus did not spoil the virginity of Mary. God preserved her virginity before (ante parturn), during (in parturn), and after (post parturn) the birth of Christ. She remained a virgin for life.



### Her Immaculate Conception

Early Church; Formally defined by Pope Plus IX in 1854 In Mary, God prepared a dwelling place for the Incarnation of Jesus. At the first moment of her conception in the womb of her mother, St. Anne, Mary was preserved free from all stain of original sin.



### Her Assumption, Body & Soul

Early Church; Formally defined by Pope Plus XII in 1950 Mary, being the immaculate, ever-virgin Mother of God, after finishing the course of her life on earth, was taken up body and soul to heaven. Free from the stain of original sin, her body was not subject to decay.

scholars and the catechism (#2760) indicate that the doxology was connected to the celebration of the Eucharist and was not used apart from

Ironically, a remnant of a prayer used during the celebration of the Eucharist has comes to be used widely by many Christian churches that do not celebrate the Eucharist!
