# -ST. IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

First Reading: "Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength." (Dt 6:5)

Psalm: I love you, Lord, my strength. (Ps 18) Second Reading: But Jesus, because he

remains forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away. (Heb 7:24)

Gospel: "The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than [this]." (Mk 12:31)

# **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

Americans have long been fascinated with public debates. Farmers stood in muddy fields for hours to hear Lincoln and Douglas dispute each other in the 1860 presidential run-up. The televised debate between Kennedy and Nixon in 1960 fascinated the nation. These days, cable news outlets and social media parse every word spoken by candidates. We still love seeing public, rational disputes in the service of our nation.

In his day, Jesus also captured attention as a public debater. Mark tells us, "And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, 'Which commandment is the first of all?'" Jesus' brief but allencompassing response is the double command to love God and neighbor. Notice that he includes the importance of loving God with "all your mind." Loving God is not simply a question of affection, loyalty, good deeds, and religious dedication. It demands honest and intense intellectual engagement — just like an accomplished debater.

How do we do this practically? One simple way is by embracing ourselves as life-long learners. Setting aside time for reading, book studies, online classes, and, perhaps most difficult, engaging in open, honest, and curious conversation with those who think differently from us. These are all great ways to love God with our minds. Our country and our Church depend greatly on souls who love God in this way with their minds. Let's commit to loving God with all our minds in tireless pursuit of truth. — Father John Muir

### Q: "What does the Catholic Church teach about what our bodies will be like in heaven?" — Jesse G., 13

A: We are told in Scripture and in Sacred Tradition that our bodies will be perfected (1 Cor. nature as we were on earth. 15:40-58, Phil. 3:21.)

Theologians have suggested four characteristics that best describe what they will be like: impassable, subtle, agile, and clarity.

Our glorified bodies will be *impassible*. They will experience no pain, suffering, weariness, hunger, or thirst. Scripture says, "God will wipe away every tear from our eyes, for the former things have passed away" (Rev. 7:21).

We will also have the gift of subtlety. We will have a human body with the characteristics of a spirit. Just as Christ could walk through walls after His Resurrection (John 20:19-20), so too should we be able to walk through walls. God will assimilate the characteristics

of a spirit to the body without destroying the body's material characteristics.

We will also possess the gift of agility, which means we will not be subject to the forces of Our playground will not be

limited to the small area we can presently cover with our human powers. Rather, the farthest reaches of the
