

"Go, and sin no more," Jesus tells the woman caught in adultery. Her life, like ours, has been saved. She, like us, has a chance for a new beginning. So he begs her, and he begs us: be changed by it. Let the mercy transform you. Go, and sin no more.

**First Reading:** Thus says the LORD, who opens a way in the sea and a path in the mighty waters. (Is 43:16)

**Psalm:** The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy. (Ps 126)

**Second Reading:** Just one thing: forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead, I continue my pursuit

toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus. (Phil 3:14)

Gospel: Then Jesus straightened up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She replied, "No one, sir." Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more." (Jn 8:10-11)

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

"The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle" (John 8:3). Why do they make her stand in the middle? Why not expose her on the periphery? The reason is something that affects us practically every day.

The center is what stabilizes a community's identity. We humans tend to center ourselves around an accused and condemned victim — though we rarely admit it. This renews our fragile communities and our power as those who weaponize the accusation. This is effective because it is often a victim who represents something truly dangerous for the group. In this case, adultery stands for the breakdown of a community and those within it, because it forces questions like: who is my father? Whose child is this? Is this child one of us, or that of an outsider? The accusers place the adulteress in the center because their community, like most, is built around turning an enemy into a victim.

Once you understand this, you'll see it almost anywhere humans group together (families, politics, workplaces, sports, schools, etc.). The good news is Jesus exposes this dynamic by deftly pointing out the sin-infected hearts of everyone besides the woman. They all leave, symbolizing the breakdown of the old order, and she is "left alone before him." A new community has begun, structured around the merciful love of Christ.

What is in your center? What is in the center of our parish and family communities? Strive to center on Christ's forgiveness, and we experience the new, lasting community we call the Church.



#### Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained: PRIESTHOOD

Question: If someone is interested in becoming a priest, how does he go about it?

**Answer**: Discerning a vocation can happen in any number of ways. It might come as a surprise to the person called or to family or friends. Sometimes it is a gradual process, and other times it is as quick and bright as lightning.

Regardless of how it starts, a vocation to the priesthood or religious life requires a process of discerning, testing, and preparing. The best place to begin would be with lots of prayer, receiving the sacraments, and attending daily Mass whenever possible.

Then talk to your pastor or a priest you know and trust. Your diocese may have a vocation director who can provide you with guidance and information. The Serra Club is also a great resource for information and contacts to help you discern if indeed God is calling you.

Remember that many young Catholic men have considered the priesthood. Some are ordained and others realize this is not their calling. However, we are all called to be of service to others as we practice our faith. These are extraordinary times in which we live, and they require an extraordinary witness to faith and to God's presence in the world. Our work, our ministry as Catholics, is to be the body of Christ with and for others. The Church needs priests. If God calls you to ordained service in the church, He will provide the grace, direction, and support you need. Just listen and respond with all your heart, mind, and soul.

#### Q: "How can the pope be totally infallible? If he is, why does he not win the lottery?" — Paul K., 13

A: The pope isn't "totally infallible." His infallibility extends only to matters of faith and morals, and it can operate only when he is defining something pertaining to faith or morals for the whole Church.

Infallibility is a special gift given by God to the Church to protect it from teaching as true what is, in fact, false. It is not new revelation, but a special protection to ensure the Faith will not be distorted by error.

The pope has no "hotline" to God. He must Sometimes infallibility is also confused get his doctrine the same way we do — he must pray and study. Infallibility says only after he has done his study and when he defines something as part of the Catholic Faith, the Holy Spirit protects what he teaches from being wrong. It refers to his function as official teacher, not as a private person, nor even as a private theologian. Not only the pope, but all the bishops of the Church in union with the pope are protected from teaching error, when they meet to define a matter of faith or morals or when, scattered throughout the world, they agree on how a matter of faith or


morals is to be definitively held.

Because it applies only to matters of faith or morals, the gift of infallibility does not mean the pope can't be wrong about the winning lottery numbers. Nor is he guaranteed to correctly predict the winner of the Super Bowl.

Also, infallibility is not inspiration. This means the pope isn't automatically given the proper words with which to teach. Infallibility is a *negative protection*. The Holy Spirit will never allow the Pope to teach as truth something which is actually false.

with "impeccability," which is the idea that the pope is sinless or cannot sin. That's not what infallibility means. A pope could live a sinful life, as a few popes have, yet his teaching would still be protected by the Holy Spirit. This is the point of infallibility — to protect the Church's teaching from error. A pope may end up in hell for a sinful life, but his teaching would still have been protected by the Holy Spirit. Here are the conditions necessary for infallible teaching by the pope:


The pope must make it clear he is exercising his supreme ex cathedra



("from the chair," which refers to his office as teacher) authority;

- He is defining a matter pertaining to faith or morals;
- The pope must use terms which make it clear he is rendering an infallible judgement;
- 4) He must address the whole Church, not just a part of it;
- He must make it clear that his teaching binds the consciences of the faithful.

Afterward, we may plan to go for pizza after at G&G or Shake-speare's.



#### **PROLIFE UPDATES**

**EIGHTH MONTH OF UNBORN BABY DEVELOPMENT:** In the eighth month, a baby swallows a gallon of amniotic fluid per day and often hiccups. The baby kicks, and mom may be able to feel an elbow or heel against her abdomen. The baby sleeps and wakes in a pattern, and senses the difference between light and darkness. Fingernails reach the end of a baby's fingers. A baby can weigh 4 or 5 pounds.

Baby shower celebration: This year our parish family will celebrate the birth of babies we have been praying for during the last nine months of our spiritual adoption program for unborn babies. We will celebrate with a baby shower the weekend of May 31 and June 1 after Masses at the front entrance of church extending into the cry room. Items for Baby Grace and My Life Clinic will be listed in the future.

We will have baskets available at the entrances of church and in the school office in May for the baby shower weekend for anyone who cannot attend and would like to participate.
