

The disciples followed Jesus' careful instructions for his entry to Jerusalem, even though they did not understand his words. Today, we too, look ahead to his arrival. In obedience, let us prepare the way for the King.

**First Reading:** The Lord GOD is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame. (Is 50:7)

**Psalm:** My God, my God, why have you abandoned me? (Ps 22)

**Second Reading:** Because of this, God greatly

exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name. (Phil 2:9) **Gospel:** Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying,

"This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me." (Lk 22:19)

# **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

"As he rode along, the people were spreading their cloaks on the road." (Luke 19:36)

Consider how useless it is to spread your clothes on the ground for a donkey to walk on. The clothes get smeared with hooves, and who knows the grimy places where they've been? The animal may leave some unsavory presents on them. They may get stolen by a thief looking to make a buck. The thorns, thistles, rocks and muck of the road will leave stains. The clothes may never be useful again, and you'll probably walk home shivering without your normal covering. Yet this is precisely the gesture the people employ to welcome Jesus and his donkey. Why does this detail matter?

Wastefulness is an essential part of celebration. Consider the unnecessary extravagance of Christmas decorations, confetti and ticker tape parades, baseball players spraying each other with bottles of champagne after a victory, birthday gifts for kids and so on. This wastefulness signals celebration and therefore participation in higher identities (as believers, winners, and parents, to mention the above examples). That's what the wasted cloaks are all about. Those who donate their cloaks participate in Christ's kingship in Jerusalem — and we savor it two thousand years later.

The lesson? Learn how to "waste" money, time, clothes, and food on Christ. We do this at Mass, but in so many other ways, too, like serving the poor, going on retreats, and doing prayerful study. When we practice this holy wastefulness, Jesus will ride into our lives and we'll be more deeply members of his kingdom.



# Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained: PRIESTHOOD



**Question**: Where do Palm Sunday palms come from and where should they go?

**Answer**: The Palm Sunday celebration has ancient origins. Beginning the liturgy "outside" the church, we symbolically reenact Christ's

entry into Jerusalem. The crowds in ancient Israel waved palm branches – a symbol of royalty – to welcome Jesus. These days, obtaining palms takes a lot of planning and coordination, as hundreds of thousands of churches worldwide need them on the same day! Many in the United States order palms from Florida, California, Texas, or Central America. Many companies stress the sustainability of their production and the just wages paid to their workers.

The palms used on Palm Sunday are blessed at Mass. This means they shouldn't end up in the trash! Many people weave palms into crosses or families display them in their homes. If you do not plan on displaying your palms throughout the year, they should be burned, buried, or left at the church. In the final case, the palms are burned to provide the ashes for next year's Ash Wednesday service.

#### SPIRITUAL HOMEWORK: QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

**First Reading:** Isaiah bears witness as one who did not lose his faith despite persecution and ridicule. Can you discuss a time when your faith was put to the test?

**Second Reading:** Paul teaches the Philippians that Jesus was humble and obedient to God even to the point of death by crucifixion. Why do you think humility and obedience are important virtues in

following Jesus?

Gospel: In his passion narrative, Luke is the only evangelist to highlight that both Pilate and Herod (Antipas) find Jesus innocent of the charges against him. Is there a friend or co-worker you could help this week who is being treated unfairly?



Q: "Why can't we eat meat on Fridays in Lent?" — Rachel P., 13

A: The Church asks us to abstain from meat as a means of sacrifice. The Church only asks us to do what is ultimately good for us. It is not a



mean-spirited "killjoy" whose purpose is to make life touch for us. The Church is truly working in our best interest.

Abstaining from meat is a part of the whole penitential approach to Friday that should be maintained throughout the year, and especially in Lent. As a young person, you did not grow up in an environment when all Fridays throughout the year were days of abstinence from meat. Yet, even today, we are obliged to do some form of penance.

We do penance for several reasons: (1) as a way to expiate or atone for our sins of the past, (2) to learn to master our instincts (which will help us fight sin), (3) to help us prepare for the spiritual feast of the Resurrection of Jesus on Easter, (4) as a sign of our conversion, (5) and as a way to purify our soul (CCC #2043).

Mastering the little challenges in life prepares us for the big challenges. A person who can't even control little challenges like abstaining from meat one day a week is more likely to fall prey to more difficult challenges.

The rules for days of fasting are that we can eat one full meal and two small meals which together add up to no more than one meal. Abstinence days have the same requirements as the fast days and also involve the avoidance of meat for that day only.






## **PROLIFE UPDATES**

**EIGHTH MONTH OF UNBORN BABY DEVELOPMENT:** In the eighth month, a baby swallows a gallon of amniotic fluid per day and often hiccups. The baby kicks, and mom may be able to feel an elbow or heel against her abdomen. The baby sleeps and wakes in a pattern, and senses the difference between light and darkness. Fingernails reach the end of a baby's fingers. A baby can weigh 4 or 5 pounds.

Baby shower celebration: This year our parish family will celebrate the birth of babies we have been praying for during the last nine months of our spiritual adoption program for unborn babies. We will celebrate with a baby shower the weekend of May 31 and June 1 after Masses at the front entrance of church extending into the cry room. Items for Baby Grace and My Life Clinic will be listed in the future.

We will have baskets available at the entrances of church and in the school office in May for the baby shower weekend for anyone who cannot attend and would like to participate.

Since Birthright has changed to Loving Hearts Pregnancy Help Center, a new flyer has been placed in the bathroom to help any pregnant mother in need. The reason for change is the need to include faith in helping pregnant women.
