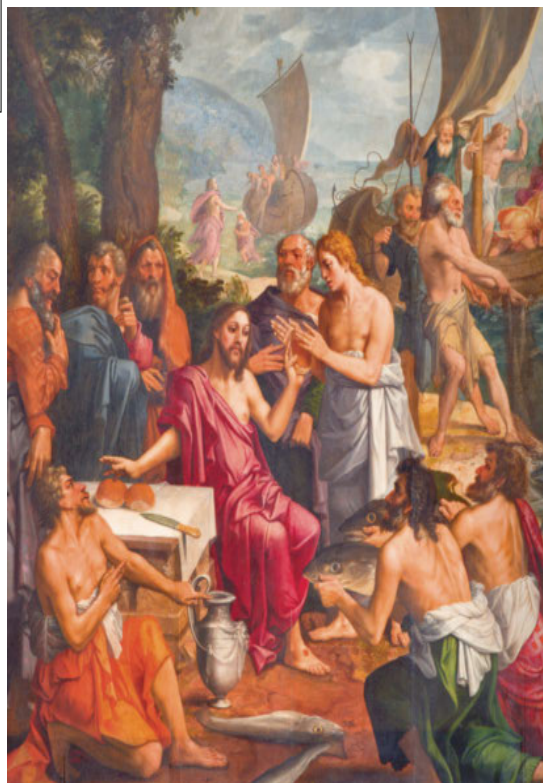

May 4, 2025 3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. - Jn 21:12-13

Jesus bids the disciples to bring their bounty of fish to the fire, to gather around it, to be warmed and fed. God's invitation is for all of us: come to the fire of His love. Be warmed. Be fed. Then, go forth, and feed the sheep.

First Reading: God exalted him at his right hand as leader and savior to grant Israel repentance and forgiveness of sins.

(Acts 5:31)

Psalm: I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me. (Ps 30) Or: Alleluia.

Second Reading: "To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and

ever." (Rv 5:13)

Gospel: Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. (Jn 21:5-6)

GOSPEL MEDITATION

I eat breakfast. If I don't have something substantial, I'm fading by midmorning. Breakfast is my key meal because it sets up my physical wellbeing for the rest of the day.

Spiritually speaking, we need sustenance to get us going. This is true for the Apostles in this Sunday's remarkable Gospel reading. The risen Jesus makes his third appearance to them in the early morning light and calls, "**Come, have breakfast**" (John 21:12). The exhausted and cold fishermen sit, and he feeds them bread and fish as the dawn breaks. They are overwhelmed by his presence to the point of awestruck silence. As they eat, their bodies and their hearts come alive. Once refreshed by their morning meal, they will be ready to feed others — indeed, the whole world — with the love of the risen Jesus. But first, they need breakfast from him.

Do you realize how essential early morning prayer is? Jesus desires to refresh us every morning with his word of love, with his grace-filled presence. This week, hear Jesus calling to you: "Come, have breakfast!" Embrace some form of spiritual, meditative practice each morning for spiritual strength to get you going.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained: RESPONDING TO GOD

Question: I can't explain it. I feel a nudge from God to something out of the ordinary. How do I respond?

Answer: You're in good company! Abraham was asked to leave all he knew and loved for a strange land, with only abstract divine assurance that such a sacrifice would be worth it. Plenty of prophets protested against God's call, whether it was claiming they were too young (Jeremiah) or running away entirely, only to end up in a whale's belly (Jonah). St. Joseph was asked to do something very strange. He was asked to believe — on the word of an angelic appearance in a dream — that his betrothed was pregnant not from another man, but by a miraculous intervention of God. Then he was called to marry her.

Author Flannery O'Connor once wrote, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you odd."

Sometimes God's invitation might seem strange or challenging. It might require sacrifices we never expected to make.

Our life might look different than we had always imagined.

But as we all know, life throws its own curveballs, regardless of whether or not we're listening for God's will.

Better, one would think, to be open to the promptings of God and to follow along the strange trails that they lead.

We have the assurance that, eventually, we will find green pastures.

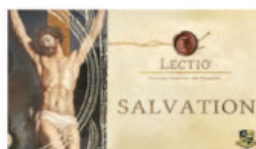

Q: "How does one become a priest?" — Charles C., 13

A: By first contacting the local diocese or a religious order. The process includes some psychological evaluation to determine whether you are a good prospect for the trials and demands of ministry. This evaluation may also focus on your views, beliefs and ability to interact socially and personally, which is almost always needed in such an important form of work. Another important thing will be an assessment of your reasons for wanting to become a priest.

After one is accepted, the applicant will receive spiritual, academic, psychological and social guidance to prepare him for ministry. This can be a rewarding (but lengthy) training process and will include a firm grounding in the doctrines of the Church. Some dioceses even require special language training. All this is to prepare the future priest for ordination and challenges ahead in his life of service to the Lord.

Naturally, each diocese has different needs so this makes identifying the exact "characteristics" of the desired type of priest very difficult to pinpoint. Canon Law does require that a priest be at least 25 years old. (Can. 1031)
