

If you love like me, Jesus tells his disciples, they will know you are mine. We shouldn't leave any room for doubt in the minds of each and every person we encounter. Let the whole world know: we love like Christ, and we belong to Christ.

**First Reading:** And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them

and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles. (Acts 14:27)

**Psalm:** I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God. (Ps 145) Or: Alleluia.

Second Reading: I heard a loud voice from

the throne saying, "Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race. He will dwell with them and they will be his people and God himself will always be with them as their God." (Rv 21:4)

**Gospel:** I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. (Jn 13:34)

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

I've always found it amazing that Jesus never says to his disciples the straightforward and bumper stickery words "I love you" or "I will always love you" (a la Dolly Parton's song). Why doesn't Jesus say, "I love you"?

Well, actually he does, but in particular ways. He says, "As the Father loves me, so I love you" (John 15:9) thereby rooting his love for us in the space of the Holy Trinity. This week he commands, "Love another as I have loved you" (John 13:34). He presents his love for us as a completed action which continues into the present moment. How has he loved us? By becoming one of us, one with us, and finally giving his life for us in his suffering on the cross. We weren't there when he did that, but neither were his Apostles (except one). Still, that action is his great "I love you" to us.

His love is also hedged in a command: "Love one another." So how can we practically follow it? The great St. John XXIII wrote in his diary that each day he followed this rule: "Only for today, I will do one good deed and not tell anyone about it." The hidden nature of a good deed is a sign that it is truly loving. This week, take on St. John XXIII's practical method of following Jesus' great commandment of love. It's a splendid way to say, "I love you."





#### Catholic Life Explained: GOOD & EVIL?


Question: If God is good, why is there evil in the world? Answer: The problem of evil is perplexing. If God is all-powerful and all-good, why doesn't He stop bad things from

happening? He must either not be all-powerful, or perhaps He's not very good after all. Human beings have faced the possibility of evil since the very beginning



of our existence. In granting us free will, God gives us the ability to make free choices. God does not force us into moral perfection. We are not forced to love Him or to love our neighbor. We must make the decision ourselves. This means, of course, that we have the ability to choose against love. One small decision of selfishness, jealously, or pride may not seem so bad. But every decision — good or bad — is like a stone dropped into a still pond. The ripples extend much farther than the original stone. When decisions against love begin to compound, they affect families, neighborhoods, and nations. This is all the more reason for Christians to be faithful to our baptismal call to love one another as Christ has loved us!

#### Q: "Can a man cease to be a priest if he gets married?" - Christopher R., 15

A: Strictly speaking, once a man is validly ordained, he remains a priest forever (Ps. 110:4, Hebpermission to stop ministering as a priest. If he desires marriage, he must also get dispensed from his sacred promise of celibacy.

Once laicized, the man would still have priestly powers to forgive sins and consecrate the Eucharist, but he would be forbidden to do so, except in emergency circumstances.

#### **PROLIFE UPDATES**

Ninth Month of Unborn Baby Development: In the ninth month, a baby will gain one half pound per week as it is getting ready for birth. The bones in the head are soft and flexible to help with the journey down the narrow birth canal. Of the 45 generations of cell divisions before adulthood, 41 have already taken place. Only four more come before adolescence. Ninety percent of a person's development happens in the womb.



Our Ss. Peter and Paul Parish Baby Shower will be Saturday, May 31 and Sunday, June 1 at front entrance of church and cry room. Pick up some literature, ask questions, grab a couple of cookies and a bookmark for the kids.

We will have baskets available at each of the church entrances and in the school office two weeks before the baby shower weekend for anyone who cannot attend and would like to donate a baby shower gift.

Baby shower gifts needed are as follows: baby lotion, head-to-toe body wash and shampoo, nail clippers, pacifiers, diaper rash ointment, newborn diapers to size 5, infant sleepers through size 1, and infant clothing through size 1. Baby thermometers, and white onesies size newborn and 3-6 months are also needed.

Items will be taken to My Life Clinic and a pregnancy resource center. We toured the centers that do so much to support parents of an unplanned pregnancy with no cost: sonograms, counseling, educating parents on caring for their baby, helping mothers get jobs, managing a household, cooking and a place to stay as needed.
