## 7™ SUNDAY OF EAS1

Jesus prayed saying: "Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word." - Jn 17:20 Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass @2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.

"Father, they are your gift to me." This is what Christ says of his disciples. It is what he says of us. "I wish that where I am, they also may be with me." Do we have the courage to be where Christ is? Can we be the gift?

First Reading: Stephen, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked up intently to heaven and saw the glory of God. (Acts 7:55)

Psalm: The Lord is king, the most high over all the earth. (Ps 97) Or: Alleluia.

**Second Reading:** "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end." (Rv 22:13)

**Gospel:** "Father, they are your gift to me. I wish that where I am they also may be with me, that they may see my glory that you gave me, because you loved me before the foundation of the world." (Jn 17:24)

### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

The famous 20th century St. Padre Pio said once that he would wait outside the gates of heaven until the people in his life had entered. I'm not sure that I, or frankly many people I know, would say that and mean it. Yet that is precisely the kind of attitude we see in Jesus as he prays for us in the Gospel today. Having celebrated the Ascension of the Lord just a few days ago, we now hear the Son of God at the Last Supper pray to his Father "that they may be brought to perfection as one" (John 17:23). What does this mean for us?

I'd wager that we are not surprised that Jesus wants to make us perfect — that is, happy, whole, and healed. The shocker is that he desires this for us collectively and not just individually. Perfection is a team sport. We need each other to be perfect. Jesus is like a mother longing for her adult children to learn how to be in loving support of one another. He wants the perfection of his disciples to be not some individualistic plan of moral uprightness, but a loving communion of brothers and sisters.

Let's apply this practically. Do I see my participation at Mass as something I do merely for my own peace and edification, or as something I do with and for the people around me? Do I see my ongoing need for forgiveness as something that simply makes me feel better, or as a task that heals those around me, too? Is my dearest hope to individually get to heaven when I die, or is it to be part of the great procession of souls, together marching towards the heavenly Jerusalem? Do I want to be in heaven with people I currently find difficult? How would my life change if I did? — Father John Muir





## **PROLIFE UPDATES**

Ninth Month of Unborn Baby Development: In the ninth month, a baby will gain one half pound per week as it is getting ready for birth. The bones in the head are soft and flexible to help with the journey down the narrow birth canal. Of the 45 generations of cell divisions before adulthood, 41 have already taken place. Only four more come before adolescence. Ninety percent of a person's development happens in the womb.



Our Ss. Peter and Paul Parish Baby Shower will be held Saturday, May 31 and Sunday, June 1 at front entrance of church and cry room. Pick up some literature, ask questions, grab a couple of cookies and a bookmark for the kids.

We will have baskets available at each of the church entrances and in the school office two weeks before the baby shower weekend for anyone who cannot attend and would like to donate a baby shower gift.

Baby shower gifts needed are as follows: baby lotion, head-to-toe body wash and shampoo, nail clippers, pacifiers, diaper rash ointment, newborn diapers to size 5, infant sleepers through size 1, and infant clothing through size 1. Baby thermometers, and white onesies size newborn and 3-6 months are also needed.

Items will be taken to My Life Clinic and a pregnancy resource center. We toured the centers that do so much to support parents of an unplanned pregnancy with no cost: sonograms, counseling, educating parents on caring for their baby, helping mothers get jobs, managing a household, cooking and a place to stay as needed.

## Catholic Life Explained: LECTIO DIVINA?

Question: What is Lectio Divina, and how is it associated with the Benedictine Monastic tradition, whose founder, St. Benedict, we honor on July 11?

Answer: Benedict desired his monks to live in community, praying the Liturgy of the Hours together, contemplating sacred texts, and doing manual labor. The monks developed a



technique to facilitate a spiritual and devotional reading of the Bible known as Lectio Divina, the holy reading of a text. This method encourages the reader to hear the biblical text with an open heart and focus on whatever God wants to highlight and then apply it to daily life.

There are variations on Lectio Divina, but essentially, the technique consists of a three-step process of reflection. When the reflection is done with a group, the responses are shared by all the participants. Once the text is selected, it is read meditatively, and the following are then explored: a word or phrase that attracts you; how and where the content of this reading touches your life today; what you believe that God wants you to do during this coming week (month, year, lifetime).

Thanks to Benedict, the Christian community has been gifted with this special way of entering into the biblical text. This week, use the Lectio Divina process on one of the readings for the coming Sunday and make a note of the life connections you are making. How is this reflection on the biblical text drawing you closer to God and others?

## Q: "Why aren't women allowed to be priests?" — Megan M., 14

**A:** The Church's teaching about male-only priesthood is difficult for some people today to accept. They overlook the fact there are two crucial truths about gender, equality and difference, not just one — equality.

Jesus made the priesthood a male thing — like fatherhood. It has nothing to do with men being superior to women — they aren't. Men and women are equal in their human dignity; they are equally made "in the image of God." But such equality does not mean "sameness" in all respects, nor does it mean men and women must be entirely interchangeable or that they cannot have different roles in a community.

Furthermore, because some women have been unjustly discriminated against in society and by some Church members, some assume that allowing only men to be priests must be an injustice. But it isn't.

Jesus is the One Who established the priesthood, and He's the One who called only men to be priests. People sometimes say He did this because of the prevailing customs of His time. This is not a strong argument. Jesus freely broke with those customs in other instances, especially regarding women — for example by allowing women to be among His close followers, by addressing them in public and by upholding their rights in marriage on the same terms as men. That He didn't call any women to be priests is a clear indication He intended priestly ministry to be exclusively male.

Further evidence of this is His mother, the Blessed Virgin. As Pope John Paul II has said, "the fact that the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God and Mother of the Church, received neither the mission proper to the Apostles nor the ministerial priesthood clearly shows that the non-admission of women to priestly ordination cannot mean that women are of less dignity, nor can it be construed as discrimination against them" (*Ordinatio Sacredotalis*, No. 3). "Rather," he write, "it is to be seen as the faithful observance of a plan to be ascribed to the Wisdom of the Lord of the Universe."

The Church doesn't have the authority to change what Christ has established. Even if the pope wanted to, he couldn't allow women priests because the Church isn't the pope's Church, it is Christ's Church.

Through the Care Fund, we live out our discipleship by lifting up the vulnerable, affirming the dignity of life, and being the hears of Ss. Peter & Paul in times of need. Thank you for supporting this ministry.

Perhaps it might help to consider why the priesthood is an exclusively masculine thing. The Church itself has always been considered in "feminine" terms. We speak of the Church as the Bride of Christ. Even the term "Body of Christ" is linked to the femininity of the Church by St. Paul in Ephesians, chapter 5. There the Church is the "Body of Christ" because she is "one flesh" or "one body" with Christ, as the wife is one flesh or one body with her husband.

Why is the Church feminine? One reason is because she receives grace from outside herself and nourishes the new life of believers within herself as a mother nourishes her unborn children from within. This is why we sometimes speak of the Church as "Holy Mother Church."

What has this to do with male priests? The priest is a sacramental sign of Christ as Bridegroom of the Church — an inherently male identity. It is no accident that the Second Person of the Trinity became a male human being. His identity in relation to God's people is masculine and their relationship as a people is feminine.

The male priest stand in the person of Christ (*in persona Christi*, in Latin). He is a sacramental sign of Christ the Bridegroom (Matt. 9:15; 25:1-12; John 3:27-30; Eph. 5) before the Church, His bride. It wouldn't make sense for a woman to try to fulfill this role, anymore than it would for a man to try to be a "mother." There is no inequality here, only the God-given difference between men and women.
