

Jesus knew how it would be. He knew we would stumble in the dark, grasping for answers. And so he sent us a light: the Holy Spirit, the illumination of all that is true. Dare we look into the light? Are we ready to see the truth?

First Reading: "When the Lord established the heavens I was there, when he marked out the vault over the face of the deep; when he made firm the skies above, when he fixed fast the foundations of the earth; (Prv 8:27)

Psalm: O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth! (Ps 8)

Second Reading: Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. (Rom 5:1) Gospel: Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you." Jn 16:15)

GOSPEL MEDITATION

I am amazed at how my four siblings teach their many kids in age-appropriate ways. For example, now that my nephew Brandon is 24 years of age, they give him insights and freedoms that would have been positively confounding or even dangerous when he was a toddler. Imagine if they had taught him at age four how to drive a car, use a credit card online, or handle power tools. But eventually, they did, and he is a high functioning young man, I'm proud to say. They are good teachers.

This week we learn that Jesus teaches us in a similar way. He says to his Apostles, "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now" (John 16:12). How disappointing for them. But imagine at that moment, before his resurrection and ascension, if the Lord had started telling them about synods and sacraments, popes and parishes, martyrs and monasteries, rosaries and relics, catechisms and crucifixes? They would have been absolutely overwhelmed, confused, and discouraged. He tells them what they need to know, when it is time for them to know it.

So he does for us. Jesus has unceasingly taught the Church as she matures through the centuries, just as he teaches you and me through our lives in ways we can understand. Our task should be to learn what he is teaching us now, knowing that (although revelation per se is complete in him and his Apostles), he never ceases to teach us as we spiritually mature. Be confident: he knows what you are ready to learn now.



Q: "Is feminism compatible with Catholicism?" — Maria O., 18

A: It depends on what you mean by feminism. If you mean women should have the same basic human rights as men, then certainly Catholic teaching agrees. If by feminism you mean there should be no social distinctions between men and women or for true equality to exist between genders in the Church women must be ordained to the priesthood, then the answer is "no."

The latter view is sometimes called "secular" or "radical feminism." Some views commonly held by secular or radical feminists are actually contrary to true feminine dignity. For example, a woman's ability to conceive and bear children is a wonderful gift from God. Yet many radical feminists view childbearing as little better than a curse. They support things which actually degrade women, such as contraception and abortion.

Catholic Life Explained: ROSARIES AS DECORATIONS?

Question: I've seen people hang rosaries over the rear-view mirrors in their cars and a few of them wear them around their necks. Is it OK to do that?

Answer: The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?

One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.
