

Maybe things would be more peaceful devoid of these seemingly arbitrary difficulties. 



## Catholic Life Explained: QUEENSHIP OF MARY

Question: Why do we have a feast for the Queenship of Mary?

Answer: For many of us, the language of kings and queens may seem like they belong to history or a medieval movie. Royalty have absolute authority over a kingdom and their subjects, a concept that is foreign to many of us today. While Jesus doesn't rule a political kingdom, we honor and recognize him as the King of Kings, Lord of Heaven and Earth. To God alone belongs absolute authority over all of existence.



We may think of queens as the spouse of the king, but there is another key relationship: the king's mother. In Biblical history, we see instances where the mother of the king is given due as a queen herself, complete with a throne! Mary's guiding influence over her Son is seen most notably in the Wedding Feast at Cana. Mary is not Queen on her own merit. She is "full of grace" and "blessed" in "all ages" because of the reign of her Son.

## Q: "Are Catholics allowed to have an abortion for any reason?" — Katie V., 14

A: Since abortion is the direct taking of an innocent human life, one may not deliberately have an abortion or assist another in doing so for any reason. I realize there are difficult situations, such as when a pregnancy jeopardizes the mother's life, the child is conceived through a rape or incest or if the child is severely handicapped. These hardships should not be minimized. But, as difficult (even tragic) as they may be, such circumstances do not justify killing an innocent human being. Furthermore, thanks to modern medicine, situations where the life of the mother is truly at risk are extremely rare.

Direct abortion should be distinguished from indirect abortion, where an unborn child's death is an indirect consequence, and therefore unintentional, due to a necessary intervention to treat a dangerous medical condition. One such condition is the ectopic pregnancy, or a "tubal pregnancy," where the child implants and develops outside the uterus (usually the fallopian tube) and were there can be a serious threat to the mother's life

Under the moral principle of "double effect," dangerously pathological maternal tissue of the fallopian tube can be removed as a threat to the mother's life, even if the tissue is also the location of the implanted fetus. The death of the fetus is an unfortunate and *unintended* (although foreseen) consequence of removing the diseased tissue.

Although certain principals can be stated regarding procedures addressing situations such as ectopic pregnancies, the moral evaluation of medical procedures in specific cases can differ. Consultation with a sound Catholic moralist and a medical doctor would be advised in this type of case.

Regarding rape or incest, statistics show the woman carrying the baby will much sooner forget the rape or incest than the abortion. Women know deep down that abortion is wrong. This is why so many women suffer depression and other psychological problems after abortions.

Regarding handicapped children, it is a very dangerous thing when individuals are allowed to decide whether someone else should live simply because that person is perceived to be of less value because of a physical ailment. Since when is someone's value determined by what they do or what they are like? People with handicaps have much to offer society. And even if the person is severely handicapped and unable to function on his or her own, that person is still a gift from God who can bring about tremendous love in the family if they are embraced and viewed with the respect and value they deserve.

We should also be reminded that our Lord wants all involved with the sin of abortion to seek forgiveness. Those who have had abortions are welcomed with open arms if they turn back to God.
