

**September 14, 2025** THE EXALTATION OF THE **HOLY CROSS** 

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "No one has gone up to heaven except the one who has come down from heaven, the Son of Man." For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. - Jn 3:13, 17

God did not send his son into the world to condemn it. The cross is not a symbol of judgment — the cross is what mercy looks like when it is lived out. How will we bring the cross into our lives this week? How will we live the mercy which has saved us?

First Reading: "We have sinned in complaining against the LORD and you. Pray the LORD to take the serpents from us." (Nm 21:7)

Psalm: Do not forget the works of the Lord! (Ps 78)

Second Reading: He humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross. (Phil 2:8)

**Gospel:** For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. (Jn 3:16)

### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

One of my favorite movies is the 1991 comedy What About Bob? Bill Murray plays a troubled, paranoid hypochondriac named Bob Wiley who innocently but annoyingly hounds Dr. Leo Marvin, played by Richard Dreyfuss. Bob is paralyzed by his fear of, well, everything, and is convinced the psychologist can heal him. But Dr. Marvin's failed attempts to heal Bob end up driving the doctor to attempt to murder Bob. He fails. The surprise is that, having faced death head on, Bob is suddenly healed. He attributes his healing to Dr Marvin for break-through "death therapy." In facing the cause of his deepest illness and dysfunction, Bob is healed.



Underneath this light-hearted comedy is a dead-serious resonance with this week's feast: the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Christ is lifted up on the cross to force us to face the truth of sin and death. In that reckoning we find healing. Like Moses' snake on a pole, the cross says: this is what is causing your sickness – rebellion, disobedience, sin. Look at it! Don't run from it. Now seeing it exposed, we see life. We see our physician mercifully healing us. In this sense, we are all like Bob Wiley. The "death therapy" of the cross is our only hope for healing.

This week I invite you to "exalt the cross." If you don't have one in your house, get one. Use it for prayer. Gaze on it frequently. It teaches us to not be afraid. It heals us.





# Q: "If you could not have children would it be OK to use artificial insemination and not adopt children?" — Christine J., 16

A: Be sure to read my answer to the end because this is another one of those difficult questions that requires an openness to the explanations of and, ultimately, faith in the Church's authority on questions of faith and morality. No, artificial insemination is not morally acceptable. Children should be "begotten, not made."

Although parents who engage in artificial insemination may be well-intentioned, the means they choose to bring new life into the existence is morally unacceptable. It amounts to manufacturing people by a technological process, rather than allowing human beings to be begotten by a truly human act of self-donating love (sexual intercourse).

Remember, for an act to be morally

acceptable, the means (the way one does something) as well as the end (what a person wishes to achieve) must be morally

good.

There is no doubt that a couple's inability to have children can be extremely painful and frustrating. But that doesn't make it OK to have a child through artificial insemination, anymore than it would make it OK to kidnap someone else's child because he or she already has 10 children. The end doesn't justify the

means.

What about fertility drugs to help couples have children? The idea of using a drug to help fertility isn't, in itself, a moral problem. But there are some related issues that can be, so the matter needs to be carefully thought through and all the health risks considered, both to the mother and her potential offspring. For example, sometimes fertility drugs

result in the conception of multiple preborn children. Not just twins or triplets, but even quintuplets, septuplets, etc. To diminish health risks to the mother or to some of the children in the womb, doctors may propose "selective terminations" abortions, in other words, of some of the embryonic babies. That is not morally acceptable; it amounts to unjustly killing innocent human beings. Imagine how you would feel knowing that your little brother or sister was "selectively terminated" and that it might just as well have been you? Although this may be difficult to accept, God may have allowed certain people to be infertile to challenge them to open their hearts to adoption. There are countless children here and abroad in need of loving parents. Adoption is a better, more loving, and generous choice than artificial insemination.


# Catholic Life Explained: DAILY PRAYER VS. MASS?


Question: I have a friend who says she doesn't need to attend Mass because she prays to God every day. What are your thoughts on this justification?

Answer: If the only reason for going to church were to talk to God, your friend might be right. Prayer is not something limited to a physical place or even a holy place. If the sole purpose of the Church were prayer, it would be a narrow purpose indeed. The Church is a community of believers, formed by "one Lord, one faith, one Baptism." It is an outward sign of our faith in God instituted by Christ, and the purpose of the Church is to give us grace, that is, a share in God's life.

Coming to Mass is not really for God's sake, but for ours. If we believe that Jesus is truly present in the holy Eucharist, then we will want to be in his presence. We will want to be fed by him. Our daily prayer and good works are

strengthened by our authentic encounter with our Lord. For Catholics, it is at Mass that we celebrate the source and summit of our faith. If this is true, why would we ever stay away?

### **PROLIFE UPDATE**

Preborn Baby at One Month: "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you." At one month, a baby's heart starts beating. Tiny arms and legs start growing. The brain is developing in three parts: language and emotion, hearing, and seeing. The baby is around 1/4 inch long.

The Missouri General Assembly passed HJR 73, a proposed constitutional amendment that would repeal the voter approved "Right to Reproductive Freedom Initiative." This amendment is to be placed on the ballot in November 2026. It includes health and safety standards for mothers and their preborn babies.
