(16 July) Our Lady of Mount Carmel

In our diocese we are blessed to have the Carmel of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Located about 20 miles northwest of Lincoln, it is home to over 30 contemplative religious nuns. They follow the great Carmelite tradition in the footsteps of St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, St. Therese of the Child Jesus, St. Elizabeth of the Trinity, St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein), and many others. The Carmelite Order traces their beginnings all the way back to the Prophet Elijah who on Mt. Carmel witnessed to the true God of Israel against the idolatry and false prophets of that day and he heard the "still small voice" of God on Mt. Horeb (See 1 Kings 18-19). It was on July 16, 1251 that the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to St. Simon Stock and gave him the brown scapular with this promise, "This must be a sign and privilege for you and for all Carmelites: whoever dies wearing the scapular will not suffer eternal fire." Pope Benedict XVI

said, "The Carmelites have spread among the Christian people devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel, holding her up as a model of prayer, contemplation and dedication to God. Indeed, Mary was the first, in a way

which can never be equaled, to believe and experience that Jesus, the Incarnate Word, is the summit, the peak of man's encounter with God. By fully accepting the Word, she "was blessedly brought to the holy Mountain" (cf. Opening Prayer of the Memorial), and lives for ever with the Lord in body and soul."

"Although the scapular was given to the Carmelites, with time many lay people began to feel called to live a life more committed with the Carmelite Spirituality and that is how the association of the scapular began, and many laity were added through their devotion to the Virgin and the use of the scapular. The church has extended the privilege of the scapular to all laity." "The scapular, being a sacramental, does not communicate grace to us as do the sacraments, but does aid in making us more receptive to God's love and a sincere contrition of our sins if we receive it with devotion." It is a sign of devotion and a helpful reminder of our Lady's protection, of belonging to Christ through her, and accepting the yoke of Christ. In wearing the scapular, one strives to live the meaning, "The scapular is a symbol of our identity as Catholics, bound intimately to Mary with the purpose of fully living our baptism. It represents our decision to follow Jesus through Mary in the spirit of a religious but adapted properly to our vocation. This requires that we must be poor (a simple lifestyle without material attachments), chaste, and obedient for love of God." You give us hope, O Mother of Mercy, that through your Scapular promise we might quickly pass through the fires of purgatory to the Kingdom of your Son. Be our comfort and our hope. Grant that our hope may not be in vain but that, ever faithful to your Son and to you, we may speedily enjoy after death the blessed company of Jesus and the saints. (pause and mention petitions)

Recite: Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be Our Lady of Mount Carmel, pray for us.

(16 July) Nuestra Señora de Carmen

En nuestra diócesis tenemos la bendición de contar con el Carmelo de Jesús, María y José. Ubicado a unas 20 millas al noroeste de Lincoln, es el hogar de más de 30 monjas religiosas contemplativas. Siguen la gran tradición carmelita siguiendo los pasos de Santa Teresa de Ávila, San Juan de la Cruz, Santa Teresita del Niño Jesús, Santa Isabel de la Trinidad, Santa Teresa Benedicta de la Cruz (Edith Stein) y muchas otras. La Orden Carmelita remonta sus orígenes al profeta Elias, quien en el Monte Carmelo dio testimonio del verdadero Dios de Israel contra la idolatría y los falsos profetas de esa época y escuchó la "voz apacible y delicada" de Dios en el Monte Horeb (ver 1 Reyes 18-19). El 16 de julio de 1251 la Santísima Virgen María se apareció a San Simón Stock y le entregó el escapulario marrón con esta promesa: «Esto debe ser un signo y un privilegio para ti y para todos los carmelitas: quien muera llevando el escapulario no sufrirá el fuego eterno». El Papa Benedicto XVI dijo: «Los carmelitas han difundido entre el pueblo cristiano la devoción a Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo, teniéndola como modelo de oración, contemplación y entrega a Dios. De hecho, María fue la primera, de una manera nunca igualada, en creer y experimentar que Jesús, el Verbo encarnado, es la cumbre, la cima del encuentro del hombre con Dios. Al acoger plenamente la Palabra, «fue felizmente llevada al Monte santo» (cf. Oración inicial del Memorial), y vive para siempre con el Señor en cuerpo y alma». "Aunque el escapulario fue dado a los carmelitas, con el tiempo muchos laicos comenzaron a sentirse llamados a vivir una vida más comprometida con la espiritualidad carmelitana y así comenzó la asociación del escapulario, a la que se sumaron muchos laicos por su devoción a la Virgen y el uso del escapulario. La Iglesia ha extendido el privilegio del escapulario a todos los laicos". "El escapulario, al ser un sacramental, no nos comunica la gracia como lo hacen los sacramentos, pero sí nos ayuda a hacernos más receptivos al amor de Dios y a una sincera contrición de nuestros pecados si lo recibimos con devoción". Es un signo de devoción y un recordatorio útil de la protección de Nuestra Señora, de pertenecer a Cristo a través de Ella y aceptar el yugo de Cristo. Al usar el escapulario, uno se esfuerza por vivir el significado: "El escapulario es un símbolo de nuestra identidad como católicos, unidos intimamente a María con el propósito de vivir plenamente nuestro bautismo. Representa nuestra decisión de seguir a Jesús a través de María en el espíritu de un religioso pero adaptado adecuadamente a nuestra vocación. Esto requiere que seamos pobres (un estilo de vida sencillo sin apegos materiales), castos y obedientes por amor a Dios". Obtenga más información en
