

## Baptism: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased"

"Beloved one of God!" In the sacrament of Baptism, we acquire a new identity. We become sons and daughters of God, members of Christ's Body, born into a larger family and destined for an everlasting home in heaven. Consider these few components in the rite of Baptism.



**Baptismal Font:** Generally, Baptisms should take place on Sunday, the day of the resurrection the 8<sup>th</sup> day. Most Baptismal fonts will have eight corners to mark the new creation that we become after baptism. The Lord revealed this with his own resurrection on the first day of the week, the 8<sup>th</sup> day. (See our parish baptismal font, 8 corners).

**The Name:** The first inquiry to the Parents is for the child's name. God calls each one of us by name giving us a distinct character and identity in his own heart.



**Parent's intention:** The parents are then asked what they seek from the Church for their child. The traditional response was "faith". The priest would then ask, "What does faith give?" And the response was "Eternal life". Today when we respond to the question with one answer, "Baptism" we mean faith and eternal life. From Baptism the children receive the life of faith which leads to salvation. Right at the beginning of the celebration of Baptism, we learn the goal of our new life. We are first transformed into new creatures on the day of 're-creation' then given a new identity which is that of being a beloved child of God

and then directed towards heaven, our everlasting dwelling home with God. To live this new way of life parents and godparents pledge to help us.

While celebrating the Baptism of our Lord Jesus, recall the reality of your own baptism. Offer a prayer or send a message of gratitude to the priest or deacon who baptized you. Offer a Pray for Godparents who helped our parents to guide us in the way of faith. Pray for our parents for the gift of baptism and thank them too for giving us this gift that has made you a beloved child of God. The ultimate gift of baptism is everlasting life with God for all who keep the faith to the end.

Pray for young families that they will appreciate the gift of baptism for their children. Pray for the conversion of parents who do not desire baptism for their little children. Encourage relatives and friends to have their children baptized. Next time you touch the Holy Water as you come into Church, pause to thank Jesus for the gift of Baptism. Every time you make the sign of the cross with Holy Water in Church, remember you are a beloved child of God and you have been claimed for Christ for all eternity because of his gift of Baptism and the Lord is well pleased to have you as his own.
