

WHAT ARE MASS INTENTIONS?

One part of our Catholic culture that is sometimes hard to understand and very often misunderstood is the custom of offering Mass intentions.

When a priest celebrates Mass each day, he offers each celebration of the Eucharist for a particular person, or intention. By doing so he applies special graces from God upon that person or intention. A Mass intention can be for the living or deceased.

At the Brainerd Lakes Catholic Churches, the cost of a Mass intention is \$10. The important part is to remember that you are not paying for the graces from God (which are of infinite value and cannot be paid for), but for the material things that are involved with celebrating that particular Mass.

Pope Paul VI said, "The Mass is the most perfect form of prayer!" It has immense power and countless miracles and conversions have occurred throughout the centuries by offering Masses for a specific intention or person. Mass intentions are a great treasure of the Church and have a spiritual weight that is incalculable.

Dignity of Human Life

The Lord God after creating the world he created man in his own image and he said, "it is very good". We are created by God for out of his love and infinity majesty. "Of all visible creatures only man is 'able to know and love his creator' He is 'the only creature on earth that God has chosen for its own sake' and he alone is called to share, by knowledge and love in God's own life. It was for this end that he was created, and this is the fundamental reason for his dignity" (CCC356). The dignity of the human person is a direct gift from God. To say that life is a gift is to acknowledge that life has been received from someone other than the individual who lives. Respect for one's life and the life of the other stems from this fact. Life is given to us by God.

49 years ago, abortion was legalized in the United States. Millions of children have been killed through abortion across the country. The dignity of these children has been violated and the God-given gift of life has been dishonored. The reasons for abortion continue to change and grow now and then. The lie abortion is an act of freedom that has led many women to abort their child only to regret the enslavement of the guilt that follows. God's love for life is everlasting and he offers us every means to keep this life sacred and to care for it. Legal protection of human life is needed in our society today.

The love of God that reaches the hearts of those who once believed abortion is good is making many seek ways of saving lives and protecting life. It is by God's power that life comes to be and when it is taken through abortion, this sin cries to heaven for vengeance. Through prayer and penance, hearts will be healed and transformed and we will live once more as a nation that respects human life from conception to natural death.

If you or someone you know has ever had an abortion and needs healing, please know of God's mercy for you. Trust in his love and embrace his mercy. God's mercy is found in prayer and penance. Going to confession is a starting point. Also, experienced women have come forward to help others in their healing journey. Consider *Rachel's Vineyard*, a resource that provides a safe place for support, renewal, and rebuilding of your life.

Beyond abortion, another threat to human life and dignity is the call for assisted suicide. This extreme action of violating human life is being promoted and given legislative support. Most Rev. Jose H. Gomez, Archbishop of Los Angeles said, "Legalized euthanasia would involve doctors and nurses ... in helping to kill people. It would lead to a society in which the government ... would essentially decide which lives are worthy of living, and which people would be better off dead. Already in America, legalized abortion has made it "routine" to kill unborn children. About a million babies are killed this way each year. That is scandal enough. We cannot now allow the killing of the elderly, terminally ill, and disabled people to be become "routine" also".

Please sometime to pray for the respect of human life and especially human dignity which God has given to each living person both in the womb or at their death bed. Thank you for your support for human life over the years. Do not be discouraged but continue to remain faithful. Again, for those who have had an abortion or made the compromising end-of-life decisions for the dying, let God's mercy help you. Know of the Church's prayers and readiness to help you in your healing.
