UNDERSTANDING TEMPTATIONS

Temptations come our way every day. The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines temptation as "an attraction either from outside oneself or from within, to act contrary to right reason and the commandments of God". Jesus demonstrated in his own temptation the distinction between God and the devil. He also resolutely manifested the way to triumph over the works of Satan.

The whiles of the devil and the struggle with the powers of evil are part of the human experience. Everybody faces temptations and the taunting of the devil. St. Paul Says, "For I do not do the good I want, but I do the evil I do not want" Romans 7:19. This struggle is real and I know it is real for you too. To understand the battle better let us look at the sources of temptation. Understanding temptations will equip us with a better response to our baptismal vocation.

In general, the classic catholic doctrine has demonstrated that temptations come from three areas. The **world**, the **flesh**, and the **devil**. The **world**, and in particular the fallen world, denies or rejects God. We are often lured towards the things around us, given false pleasures and aspirations for the transitory things as if they are the fulfillment of our lives. With the landscape saturated with these attractions, we become deadened in our sensitivity because temptations are so much in the environment in which we live. Regarding the **flesh**, we know of our fallen nature. As a result of original sin, "all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God" Rom 3:23. The word for this source of temptation is *concupiscence*. This can refer to any intense form of human desire. Christian theology has given it a particle meaning; the movement of the sensitive appetite contrary to the operation of the human reason. St. Paul calls it "the rebellion of the flesh may attract us to sin by the appetites of the body or the curiosity of the eye that leads to vanity. Regarding the **devil**, this source makes us experience temptation as a voice within us. Seductively the voice suggests the ways we can satisfy our basic cravings. Some people are tempted frequently and intensely, while others are tempted less and without being deeply agitated.

St. Augustine proposes three phases of temptation. Suggestion, pleasure, and consent. Suggestion consists in the proposal to some evil. Our imagination or our mind represents to us in a more or less vivid manner the attraction of the forbidden fruit. Pleasure then follows. Instinctively our lower tendencies are drawn towards the suggested evil and a certain pleasure is experienced. This pleasure does not, as long as the will refuses to consent to it, constitute sin. If, on the contrary, the will delights in the pleasure willingly enjoys it and consents to it, the sin is committed.

There is a gap between temptation and sin. St. Anthony of the desert (1645) is depicted by the artist, David Teniers the Younger (1610-1690) surrounded by temptations of all kinds. Included in the image, where worldly anxieties, greed, lust, demons attacking him, monsters offering Anthony a drink, etc. Anthony remained focused on scripture and prayer. No suggestion or pleasure would make him consent. Like Job, the more he was tormented the more he submitted himself to God. From Anthony's example, we can understand temptation as constant but the desire that leads to holiness is the constant longing and effort to renew our eagerness to find Jesus Christ every day. Temptations deceive the Christian to think "unless I give in, the temptation will not stop". St. James gives us good counsel "Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you" James 4:7-8.
