The world may choose what it pleases. We choose that which pleases God.





Come Home to Mass

Bishop Caggiano invites all Catholics in the Diocese to **Come Home to Mass**, and in accordance with the State of Connecticut change in COVID guidelines, he has lifted the restrictions on numbers of parishioners in Church, and the registration requirement for Mass. As a result of these changes in protocol, the Bishop has lifted the special dispensation regarding Mass attendance that was in effect during the Pandemic. This means that all Catholics who are able to do so, should again be attending mass in person each week.

Those who are prevented from attending mass in person due to physical or health concerns, or those who are in quarantine, should not attend mass in person.

PLEASE NOTE: For those who are fully vaccinated, they are no longer required to wear a mask to attend Mass, however, they are free and welcome to continue to wear masks if they choose to do so

REFLECT

FIRST READING
