

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Lenten Reflection on Eucharistic Presence with Joseph Deacon Frank Tremblay

On Holy Thursday last year, Cardinal O'Malley declared a Year of the Eucharist for the Archdiocese of Boston. The year began on Holy Thursday 2020 and will end on the Feast of Corpus Christi 2021. To recognize this at Saint Catherine's, we have shared a reflection on the real presence whenever our liturgical season has changed. We started in Ordinary Time, then again in Advent, again in Christmas, and lastly back again to Ordinary Time. Now we begin the season of Lent and a new twist has been added.

On December 8, 2020, Pope Francis declared a Year of Saint Joseph, from December 8, 2020 until December 8, 2021 on the occasion of the 150th Anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church, as well as the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady.

Consequently, here in Boston we have both a Year of the Eucharist and a Year of Saint Joseph. How appropriate for Saint Joseph's recognition to begin and end on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, in concert with a Year of the Eucharist. Joseph enters into the work of redemption through Mary, as a result of what God has already done in her, and he lives his life with the actual real presence of God in his home.

Consider the life of Joseph in relationship to the real presence. Joseph lives with Jesus; he is both provider and protector of the physical real presence of God on earth. The Word of God, in the fullness of time, takes on flesh and becomes a human being and is put in Joseph's hands to protect and care for. Imagine, in Joseph we have a man who is critical to salvation history, yet is never once quoted in the bible. A man who never speaks a word in scripture is protector of the Word made flesh. Nevertheless, it is Joseph who is held up as an example of faith, above all others, for Christian fathers, husbands, and workers to emulate.

Joseph, living with the physical real presence of God in his home, is tasked with supporting Him, caring for Him, nurturing Him and supporting Him. Joseph, the 'bread winner' of the Holy Family, literally provides for the 'bread of life come down from heaven.'

The concurrent celebration of the Year of the Eucharist and the Year of Saint Joseph is indeed appropriate. As we pass through the holy season of Lent, there is yet one more dimension of Saint Joseph's life worthy of consideration, especially during Lent. Joseph's life was sacrificial. From accepting the angelic dream that he should take Mary into his home, knowing her child was not his own, to accepting yet another angelic dream and, with only the clothes on their backs, takes Mary and the newborn Jesus to flee into Egypt as refugees, and then return once again to Nazareth. Imagine Joseph experiencing all this and then to lose the child, only to find him in the Temple. Even though Joseph is considered the boy's father, he steps aside and it is Mary that disciplines the child Jesus so that he "returned with them to Nazareth, and was obedient to them." Joseph repeatedly gave of himself, sacrificing for his family. That sacrificial life, given freely, because of his faith, because of his experience of the 'real presence' with him daily, is a source of reflection we should all take to heart as we embrace our Lenten sacrifices and journey closer and closer towards Easter.

Please honor all safety protocols while in church:

- Masks are required.*
- Please do not remove safety rope marking off pews.
- Maintain social distance of at least six feet between members of different households.
- Approach the Holy Communion stations in a **SINGLE FILE** line using the arrows on the floor as guides.
- If you are feeling ill or are experiencing any flu-like symptoms, please do not come to church. (See below)

* Children two and under are exempt. For children ages 3-5, masks are at the discretion of the parents.

If you have any of the following symptoms, *no matter how mild*, please do not come to church:

- **Fever**
- **Sore throat**
- **Cough**
- **Difficulty breathing**
- **Muscle aches**
- **Nausea/diarrhea**
- **Loss of taste or smell**
- **Congestion not related to allergies**

Please also stay home if any of the following apply:

- **You have been in close contact with someone with COVID-19.**
- **You have been told by a doctor you need a COVID-19 test.**
- **You have been tested for COVID-19, but you have not received your results.**
- **You have travelled outside of Massachusetts within the past 14 days and are subject to the state's travel order (see Mass.gov for details).**

Stations can also be heard remotely through livestream and those who tune in are invited to pray while meditating on the cross in the sanctuary or following along with the photos of our stations that are available on our website.

Food Drive: There will be a van in the schoolyard (Railroad Ave entrance) collecting donations for the Norwood Food Pantry on Sunday, March 21st, from 9 a.m. until 12 p.m. Parishioners are also welcome to drop off donations at the Norwood Ecumenical Food Pantry, rear of 150 Chapel St., on Thursday, March 25th, from 9-11 a.m. Items needed include: hash, beef stew, tea bags, small jars of decaf coffee, canned fruit, Ensure, Boost, size 6 diapers, Ritz crackers and Raisin Bran cereal. Cardinal Seán's dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation will continue for the foreseeable future. 


An Illustrated Lent for Families: Reflections on the Heart


