

Divine Mercy Sunday

During the pontificate of the late St. Pope John Paul II, this saintly shepherd designated the Sunday after Easter Sunday as “Divine Mercy Sunday”. Since then, devotion to the image of “the Divine Mercy” has spread throughout the world and it is popular in our parish. We have a beautiful image of Divine Mercy here in our parish church.

The late Pope established a special plenary indulgence that Catholics could receive on the feast of Divine Mercy, this Sunday. Certain observances must be undertaken by Catholics to receive the indulgence. These include reverencing an image of Divine Mercy, going to Confession near the day of the feast, going to Mass and receiving Holy Communion on that day, making a resolution to detach from all sin, performing one of the Spiritual or Corporal works of mercy, and reciting the Creed and some prayers for the intention of the Holy Father. At the National Shrine of the Divine Mercy in nearby Stockbridge, Massachusetts, a popular outdoor public Mass was always scheduled on this day and, in the past, was attended by hundreds of pilgrims each year. This year, of course, the events at the Shrine are cancelled. In several parishes in our diocese, large gatherings were usually scheduled on this day so that Albany Catholics could observe it with due honor and have access to priests for Confession. Because of the pandemic, these are very limited this year.

At our weekend Masses here in St. Mary's, we'll be displaying the image of Divine Mercy in a prominent place in the sanctuary. Hopefully, many of you will honor the image this weekend and choose to receive the indulgence. These last few weeks – Holy Week and Easter week – are all about the mercy of God the Father who sent his Son into our world for our salvation. Such incredible love and mercy is at the heart of our faith and the reason for our hope. This great love of God is what the image is, basically, all about.

Having completed the RCIA program in our parish, they were well-prepared to receive the Sacraments of Initiation and take up the mantle of Christian life. A DAY TO RECEIVE A PLENARY INDULGENCE ON DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

In 2002, Pope John Paul II decreed that a plenary indulgence may be gained by Catholics on Divine Mercy Sunday when the following conditions are observed:

- (1) The person must participate in the celebration of the day and make the decision to receive the indulgence on the Second Sunday after Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday).**
- (2) The person must partake of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) on, or near, the time of the feast. A few days before or after suffices.**
- (3) The person must receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast.**
- (4) The person's intention should be filled with repentance for sin and to be detached from all sin, even venial sins.**
- (5) The person should say a prayer for the Holy Father -- one Our Father, one Hail Mary and the recitation of the Creed.**

- (6) They should venerate an image of Divine Mercy. Veneration simply means to make some act or gesture of deep respect before the image, keeping in mind the Person whom it represents.
- (7) They should say some devout prayer on the theme of Divine Mercy. “Merciful Jesus, I trust in You” suffices or “The Chaplet of Mercy”.

The indulgence also presupposes that the person will desire to be merciful to others, in thought, words and actions. The practice of one of the Corporal or Spiritual Works of Mercy is recommended.

What is an indulgence? The “Catechism of the Catholic Church” defines an indulgence in this way: “The doctrine and practice of indulgences in the Church are closely linked to the effects of the sacrament of Penance...an indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as minister of redemption, disperses and applies with authority the treasure of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints...An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. The faithful can gain indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead.” (paragraph 1471)

Christ reveals the mercy of God but, at the same time, he places before his people the demand that they conduct their lives with love and mercy for each other...’blessed are the merciful for they shall obtain mercy.’”

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

What a wonderful joy fills us today as we ponder the inexhaustible mercy of God. "Mercy is the heart of God," Pope Francis tells us. The image of a heart has been used to point to the very life source of a person as it is the organ that allows life to flow through our veins and sustain us. Mercy is the heart of God. Imagine this dynamic, powerful, compassionate, piercing, embracing, loving, propelling, penetrating, absorbing, and enveloping, transforming presence of God flowing into the very depth of our souls. It is God's mercy that allows blood to flow through our veins. It is God's mercy that forms every atom of our being and leads us to what is true. God's mercy reveals all superficiality and falsehood, and lays bare all distortions, empty promises, weakness, and sin.

"Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope," Pope Francis continues. God's all-forgiving, compassionate love is with us. When we finally believe and accept that Christ's resurrected transfigured presence resides with us, we then find within us a strong confidence to accept life's imperfections and



disappointments and move on. Every day is a new adventure in new life. God leaves the past behind and opens doors to the future. It doesn't matter how many mistakes we made yesterday. All that matters is what we do tomorrow and what we learn along the way. It is so easy to remain tethered and mired in the past, but there is no need to do so. God is all about tomorrow and the work God has yet to do in our lives.

Mercy gives birth to hope. Hope for the greatest of sinners and hope for the worst of disasters. There is nothing God cannot do and nothing God cannot fashion.

After all, everything we know and treasure was once nothing, and look what God did with the nothing God had! The resurrected Christ stands before us with nail marks in his wrists and wounds on his body as a testament that not even injustice, suffering and death can trample over and destroy God's mercy. What have we to fear? Why do we keep ourselves from peace? Our lack of faith prevents us from going forward and fully receiving the holiness God desires to breathe upon us. Breathe in God's mercy, allow the wind of God's presence to kiss all of your sins and caress all of your fears. Exhale peace.



Scripture Readings for the Second Sunday of Easter Sunday of Divine Mercy

First Reading: Acts 4:32-35

The community of believers was of one heart and mind, and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they had everything in common. With great power the apostles bore witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great favor was accorded them all. There was no needy person among them, for those who owned property or houses would sell them, bring the proceeds of the sale, and put them at the feet of the apostles, and they were distributed to each according to need.

Second Reading: 1 Jn 5:1-6

Beloved: Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God, and everyone who loves the Father loves also the one begotten by him. In this way we know that we love the children of God when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood. The Spirit is the one that testifies, and the Spirit is truth.

Gospel: Jn 20:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.
