

A family of parishes

In a few weeks, five young men from our diocese will be ordained priests by Bishop Scharfenberger, including Matt Duclos who assisted us here as a seminarian. What a great joy for them, their families, for us and for the entire diocese. Two of them will be going back to Rome for further studies after their ordinations including Matt. The remaining three will be assigned to larger parishes as assistant pastors called “parochial vicars” subsequent to ordination. They will be a welcomed sight in this time of fewer vocations and younger leaders.

Our diocese has always been on top of making sure that each of the 110 parishes in 14 counties of the Albany Diocese have good shepherds to lead and serve. As you are well aware, times have changed and so have demographics throughout our 14 counties and also the number of priests available for service has changed dramatically. The latest plan to adequately cover and serve our parishes has been nicknamed “the family of parishes plan”. This means that, in some areas, up to three or four communities in a given area will be served by one pastor, one parochial vicar, a retired priest and a lay team to oversee the temporal and financial administration of the parishes in the family. This re-structuring will certainly be different but it makes great sense at this time. Implementing this “team approach”, each of the parishes in the network will be assured of good pastoral leadership and responsible stewardship.

I mention this to you at this time because there might well be plans afoot for some changes in our Glens Falls area in the future. Of course, I will keep you posted about them as they may develop. There are definitely no plans to close St. Mary's parish since we are a vital, sustaining and growing Catholic community. Moreover, most of the parishes in our area are the same. So I hope this missive does not stir insecurity among you or groundless speculation and worry about our future. The “bells of St. Mary's” will continue to ring for decades to come! Our faith is strong. Our parish is strong. Our future is bright.

Like you, I grew up at a time when we had three priests in the rectory and vocations were booming. People lived in ethnic neighborhoods and walked to church. Catholics lived in small, neighborhood communities of support and protection. You and I know that things have changed in our cities and society, our culture, the way we live and how we affiliate with our faith communities. We simply can't waste time and hope that things will return to the way they were. Like you, I'm grateful for the past and its securities but we have to be realistic and brave about how to move ahead with the current realities. I think our Diocese is being responsible, professional and enthusiastic about planning for our future as Catholics in the Diocese of Albany. Let's be open, prayerful and grateful for their visionary courage. Let's not let one glimmer of worry enter into the certainty we should have about the future of our parish and our parishes and our Catholic faith in general.

Can we use gluten-free hosts for Holy Communion?

From a recent article in Our Sunday Visitor by Msgr. Charles Pope (May 9-15, 2021):

It is not accurate to say that the Church permits gluten-free hosts at Mass. It is more proper to say that the use of low-gluten hosts is permitted for those who have celiac disease. Celiac disease is a disease in which people can't eat gluten (a protein found in wheat) because their immune system responds by damaging the small intestine. Low-gluten hosts have trace amounts of gluten but not usually enough to trigger response in those with celiac disease. In rare cases where even trace amounts are harmful, the Church permits that communicants can receive the Precious Blood only. This is permissible because it contains the full and Real Presence of Christ, as does the Precious Blood.

May 6, 2021

My Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The weekend of May 22/23, the diocese of Albany will participate in the annual special collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe. This collection will be taken up at all Masses throughout the Diocese of Albany. Each year the United States Bishops take up this collection as a way for Catholics in the United States to stand in solidarity with those who experience the ongoing effects of over 70 years of religious oppression under Communist rule.

The theme for the 2021 Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe is “Restore the Church - Build the Future”. Our role is to help the people of these poorest countries of Eastern and Central Europe to build on their strong Catholic faith and develop Catholic charitable organizations to bring the hope and light of Christ to the people of this part of the world. The worldwide coronavirus outbreak restricted nonessential travel across the globe. Stay-at-home orders, physical distancing, and quarantine practices implemented to mitigate the spread of the disease revealed great and urgent needs, especially in those countries of Eastern Europe. Weak economies were made more vulnerable, and those affected include the elderly as well as doctors, nurses and medical chaplains.

Your participation in the collection expresses your care and support for the people throughout the region, especially in times of crisis and disruption. Please prayerfully consider how you can support the collection this year or if you can increase your contribution.

I thank you for your continued support in this effort to assist our Catholic brothers and sisters in Central and Eastern Europe. May our gracious God bless you abundantly for your generosity.

Helping out victims of Covid in India

As you know, the COVID virus is rampant in India. While reading through the New York Times a few days ago, I saw that the paper listed the names of charitable organizations that are currently helping victims in the pandemic there. Below are the names of the organizations they list. (I can't vouch for any of them but the New York Times is pretty good at vetting the legitimacy of charitable organizations. I also cannot vouch for any of these group following Catholic principles in their other activities, with the exception of Catholic Relief Services.)

UNITED NATIONS AGENCIES, including UNICEF and the World Health Organization, are delivering personal protective equipment kits, oxygen concentrators, diagnostic testing systems and other supplies to India's frontline health care workers.

PATH, a global health nonprofit based in Seattle, says it has a team of more than 200 people working in India to procure oxygen supplies and accelerate Covid-19 testing and surveillance.

The INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL CORE, which works in conflict areas around the world, is raising money for a campaign to help provide medical equipment, PPE, isolations facilities and other essential supplies in India. CARE INDIA says it has supplied hospitals and frontline workers in India with more that 39K PPE kits, along with masks and other supplies.

THE ASSOCIATION FOR INDIAN DEVELOPMENT, a Maryland-based charity that partners with non-profits in India, says it has volunteers distributing food and protective equipment in most of India's 29 states.

PROJECT HOPE, also in Maryland, is a nonprofit providing medical training, health education and humanitarian assistance around the world. The group says it has given Covid-related assistance in 150 countries during the pandemic, including India.

GIVE.asia, a fund-raising platform in Singapore for causes across the Asia Pacific region, says it is working with the Singapore Red Cross to send ventilators, oxygen concentrators and oxygen generators to India.

AMERICARES, a nongovernmental organization based in Connecticut that specializes in emergency medical response work, says it is working in several Indian states to deliver PPE, ventilators and other medical equipment, as well as to educate people on how to prevent the spread of the virus.

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES, provides emergency health and medical help in countries throughout the world.

The INDIAN RED CROSS, working in India, has staff and volunteers running blood drives, delivering aid and medical supplies, along with providing other essential services across the country.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

God remains where love remains. When a believer realizes without doubt that God is love, it is a powerful moment. Being able to place our resurrection trust in this fundamental truth allows us to experience God's presence in all of our experiences: the good and the bad, positive and negative, life enriching and destructive events we encounter. It is no wonder that St. Paul so accurately tells us that it is love that endures all things and lasts. How can God not endure or ever fade away? Because he is God, Jesus also guarded and protected his disciples as the endearing shepherd who always had their best interest at heart.

If we become too immersed in the world, we lose touch with these deeper realities. We can become so preoccupied with preserving what we have created or think that we need, forgetting that it is not building our city that really matters, but God's. Jesus clearly did not belong to the world and, by virtue of his resurrection, he tries to get us to understand that we do not



either. The truth brings us to other worldly, more divine places and takes our eyes off of the concerns that often captivate our fears and storm our senses.

Life can easily erode our faith. Think of your life over the last couple of weeks. What challenged your faith and distracted your divine glance? Even being overly stimulated with technology and social media can erode our sense of confidence and cause us to forget who we really are. We need to distance ourselves from

the world in order to experience the joy that Christ offers. The world will never like the word of God. It is too challenging and too perplexing. The world mistakenly believes that it can survive on its own. It is a mistaken judgment that may cost people a lot in the end. It is all so very simple: God remains when we love one another. If in all the business of our lives and all that each day brings, the good and the bad, we follow the call and path of love, we will walk with God. There is nothing to fear and anxiety finds no home.

Scripture Readings for the Seventh Sunday of Easter

First Reading: Acts 1:15-17, 20a, 20c-26

Peter stood up in the midst of the brothers —there was a group of about one hundred and twenty persons in the one place —. He said, “My brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand through the mouth of David, concerning Judas, who was the guide for those who arrested Jesus. He was numbered among us and was allotted a share in this ministry. “For it is written in the Book of Psalms: *May another take his office.* “Therefore, it is necessary that one of the men who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day on which he was taken up from us, become with us a witness to his resurrection.” So they proposed two, Judas called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed, “You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this apostolic ministry from which Judas turned away to go to his own place.” Then they gave lots to them, and the lot fell upon Matthias, and he was counted with the eleven apostles.

Second Reading: 1 Jn 4:11-16

Beloved, if God so loved us, we also must love one another. No one has ever seen God. Yet, if we love one another, God remains in us, and his love is brought to perfection in us. This is how we know that we remain in him and he in us, that he has given us of his Spirit. Moreover, we have seen and testify that the Father sent his Son as savior of the world. Whoever acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God remains in him and he in God. We have come to know and to believe in the love God has for us. God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him.

Gospel: Jn 17:11b-19

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed saying: “Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are one. When I was with them I protected them in your name that you gave me, and I guarded them, and none of them was lost except the son of destruction, in order that the Scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you. I speak this in the world so that they may share my joy completely. I gave them your word, and the world hated them, because they do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. I do not ask that you take them out of the world but that you keep them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. Consecrate them in the truth. Your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, so I sent them into the world. And I consecrate myself for them, so that they also may be consecrated in truth.”
