

Mission Appeals - During the course of the year as a parish we are asked to support three Mission Appeals a year. The first one this year (July to June since most organizations work on that fiscal year) will be for the Mission Co-op Collection. Normally for this one there is a mission speaker that comes, but when they were planning these collections months ago they decided that missionaries would not come this year. The second one will be in September and that one will be for our world wide Franciscan Missions. The last one is always the 3rd Sunday in October on World Mission Sunday. With that context, I draw your attention to the Mission Co-Operative collection that will be taken up next weekend. This collection supports various missionary groups hence the reason it is the Mission Co-op collection. As it turns out this year the missionary coming here would have been one of our Franciscan missionaries since we are on a rotation with the other missionary groups in the Archdiocese. Please be as generous as your means allow. See page 3 for more information.

Parish Raffle - We are already in the final month of sales for our parish raffle. As of July 6th 1,153 tickets have been bought which is 63% of last year's total of 1,830. St. Clare Food Pantry - The bi-weekly food distributions continue throughout the summer every other Friday at Sacred Heart Church in East Berlin. Thank you to all who support the pantry throughout the year. It is during the summer months that the shelves start thinning out a bit so thank you very much to all who support the pantry year round. You can drop off food at any of the church entrances when coming for Mass, but the best and easiest place to drop off food when not coming for Mass is the elevator entrance. Thanks to all who continue to volunteer and all who donate food and cash that enable us to help so many in need.



CONCLUDING MASS FOR THE SYNOD



The Archdiocesan Synod that was begun in 2018 and was initially scheduled to conclude on Pentecost Sunday, May 31, 2020, will now come to a conclusion with an Archdiocesan wide Mass on Friday, August 13th, at 6:30pm.

The Mass will be at the Oakdale Theatre in Wallingford. Archbishop Blair will preside and the priests of the Archdiocese will con-celebrate. The Archbishop will issue a document that will be the fruit of the Synod and will set a path for the Archdiocese going forward. Each parish is asked to send a delegation of 30 people. We have arranged a coach bus to take parishioners to the Oakdale. Exact times are not yet worked out, but the bus will leave from St. Paul's around 5:15pm and return shortly after the end of Mass. There is no cost to you for the bus. Mangia! is an occasional feature in our bulletin from one of our parishioners, Ginny Mangiafico. The recipes Ginnyshares will correspond with the season

or with an upcoming feast day or special holy day.

Fish is beautiful right now. In honor of Saint Ignatius of Loyola (feast day July 31), born in the Basque region of Spain, I am suggesting this delicious recipe. Of course, it's great anytime of year with many species of Fish.

BASQUE COD

Ingredients

- (2) Fillets Fresh Cod
- (2) Roasted Red Bell Peppers
- (1) Medium Onion
- (1/4) Cup Tomato Puree (you can add a little more)
- 2 oz. white wine (optional)
- (1/4) Cup Extra Virgin Spanish Olive Oil (I use Italian, this a Spanish recipe)
- (3) Cloves Garlic
- Fresh Parsley
- Sea Salt

Instructions

- 1. Grab a non-stick frying pan and heat it with a medium heat
- 2. Add 1/4 cup of extra virgin Spanish olive oil to the pan
- 3. Once the oil gets hot, season it with sea salt and add the cod fillets to the oil, skin side up
- 4. While your cod is cooking, finely mince 3 cloves of garlic and finely dice 1 onion
- 5. After about 4 minutes flip the cod to cook uncooked side
- 6. After cooking your cod for a total of 7 to 8 minutes, remove it from the pan, put on a plate and set aside
- 7. Using the same pan with the same oil add the 3 minced garlic cloves and the diced onion to the pan and stir
- 8. After cooking the onions and garlic for about 4 to 5 minutes add 2 roasted red bell peppers to pan and stir
- 9. About 3 minutes after adding the roasted red bell pepper add 1/4 cup of tomato puree or your favorite or your own tomato sauce to the pan, season with sea salt and stir
- 10.3 minutes after adding the tomato puree, transfer everything in the pan into a bowl
- 11. Using a handheld mixer, or immersion blender, puree everything until you get a smooth puree
- 12.Add the puree and the cooked cod back to pan and heat for about 3 minutes
- 13. Transfer the cod fillets to a dish and top with the sauce
- 14. Garnish with fresh parsley and a piece of roasted red pepper
- 15.Enjoy!

The founder of the Jesuits was on his way to military fame and fortune when a cannon ball shattered his leg. Because there were no



books of romance on hand during his convalescence, Ignatius whiled away the time reading a life of Christ and lives of the saints.
