

"Let the Church always be a place of MERCY and HOPE, where EVERYONE is WELCOMED, LOVED and FORGIVEN." World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life - Since its institution in 1997 by St. Pope John Paul II, the first Sunday in February celebrates and prays for those women and men who have dedicated themselves to God in a particular way through the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience while living as members of a religious community. By virtue of our Baptisms, all people are called to live a life of holiness. Those who answer God's call to consecrated life as a priest, sister or brother do so in a particular way following in the footsteps of Jesus, but also the founder of the religious community. The Franciscan Friars who serve here at St. Paul's are one example of such a religious community of men. There are also many communities of religious sisters like the Sisters of Mercy, Felician Sisters, Little Sisters of the Poor, Sisters of St. Francis, etc. There are literally hundreds of different men and women's religious communities. While the spirituality of the founder of the religious community will be different for each group, what is common are the three vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. (By the way, that is why there are three knots on the cords that the Friars wear around their waste.) What do the vows mean?

- 1. *Poverty* is a call to share all goods in common, live a simple life, and depend totally on God.
- Chastity is a call to love and serve God and all God's people, rather than to love one person exclusively in marriage.A life of chastity is a witness and testimony to God's love.
- 3. Obedience is a call to live in community and to surrender one's own will to the will of God. In community, religious are called to listen to their superiors and the voice within to discern God's call for their life.

Inserted in this bulletin is information about the Friars who serve at St. Paul Parish. Those who might feel the Lord calling them to a vocation as a priest, brother or sister are also encouraged to speak with one of the Friars. Bro. Nicholas Romeo, Vocation Director for the Friars, will be visiting the parish from February 17-20. Should someone like to talk with him while he is here, you can send him an email at vocations@olaprovince.org.

The World Day of Prayer is also a good reminder for us to pray that those young men and women who God is calling today to live a life dedicated to him as a sister, brother or priest might respond generously to the Lord's call. It is also a good time to remember the important role that families have in nurturing religious vocations. Likewise, overwhelmingly those who respond to the Lord's call speak of the support or affirmation they received from friends, relatives and fellow parishioners. If you sincerely think someone would be a good member of a religious community do not be afraid to share that with them. If they have made their intention known, a simple word of encouragement can go a long way. If they

have not, but you think that they possess the qualities that are needed just share with them why you think that to be the case. I invite you to pray the prayer below as well.

Prayer for Consecrated Persons and for Vocations to Religious Life

God our Father, we thank you for calling men and women to serve you as sisters, brothers and priests. Renew their knowledge and love of you, and send your Holy Spirit to help them respond generously and courageously to your call. Continue to call more young women and men to serve you. Fill them with your Spirit so that they will hear and answer your call to service in your Church as a Consecrated Religious. We make our prayer through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Gospel of Luke (continued) - This is the third and final installment on the Gospel of Luke. In the previous two articles I shared with you some information about Luke the man as well as some of the themes in his Gospel. In this final section, I share with you more specifically why St. Luke's Gospel is often referred to as the Gospel of Mercy and the Gospel of the Poor.

Forgiveness and God's mercy to sinners is of first importance to Luke. Only in Luke do we hear the story of the Prodigal Son welcomed back by the overjoyed father. Only in Luke do we hear the story of the forgiven woman disrupting the feast by washing Jesus' feet with her tears. Throughout Luke's gospel, Jesus takes the side of the sinner who wants to return to God's mercy. Recall that I previously mentioned that it is only St. Luke that records Jesus calling Zacchaeus down from the tree and having dinner at his house.

Throughout the gospel, Luke calls upon the Christian disciple, that is each of us, to identify with the master Jesus, who is caring and tender toward the poor and lowly, the outcast, the sinner, and the afflicted, toward all those who recognize their dependence on God. No gospel writer is more concerned than Luke with the mercy and compassion of Jesus (Lk 7:41–43; 10:29–37; 13:6–9; 15:11–32). No gospel writer records more about Jesus' concern for women (Lk 7:11–17, 36–50; 8:2–3; 10:38–42). Jesus calls all humanity to repent (Lk 5:32; 10:13; 11:32; 13:1–5; 15:7–10; 16:30; 17:3–4; 24:47) and to all who respond in faith and repentance to the word Jesus preaches, he brings salvation (Lk 2:30–32; 3:6; 7:50; 8:48, 50; 17:19; 19:9). (NAB Introduction)

Towards the end of the gospel when Jesus is dying on the cross, only in Luke do we find his prayer for mercy to his executioners: 'Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing.' Luke also shows Jesus himself extending mercy to the penitent thief crucified with him. (Lk. 23: 39-43).

When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Adult Confirmation Program

Six Session Program Begins March 3, 2022

Are you an adult who never received the Sacrament of Confirmation? – If so, St. Paul's Adult Confirmation Program (ACP) will prepare you to be Confirmed in the Spring of 2022. The reception of all of the Sacraments is about helping us journey through this life to life eternal. The Sacrament of Confirmation is a confirming and strengthening of our Baptisms. Through the Sacrament you are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and Confirmation provides additional graces to help us live out our adult lives as faithful followers of Jesus and strengthens our bond with the Church. Those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. Likewise, those to be married in the Catholic Church should be Confirmed. St. Paul Parish is implementing this six (6) session ACP so that those adult Catholics who were never Confirmed can be fully initiated in the Catholic faith.

Who is eligible? Catholics who are at least 18 years old and have already been baptized and received their 1st Holy Communion may participate in the ACP. If married, you must be in a valid Catholic marriage. If you were married outside the Catholic Church (meaning in a civil ceremony or in a non-Catholic Church without the appropriate permission) and would like to discuss how you can have your marriage recognized in the Church contact one of the Friar-priests and they will be happy to discuss with you your situation. Your preparation for Confirmation can be done simultaneously with the preparation to have your marriage convalidated in the Church, but the convalidation must be concluded before the actual Confirmation ceremony. Generally speaking, this can often be accomplished.

When will the program be held? Thursdays March 3, 10, 17, 24, 31 and April 7 from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. at a location at St. Paul Parish to be determined.

What do the sessions entail? Each session will offer instruction on a particular topic through a variety of means, as well as time for reflection, prayer and a time for questions.

When Would I be Confirmed? The exact date has not yet been determined. You will be confirmed by one of the bishops at a date and location to be determined.

Who will lead the program? Dan Tome, our Director of Youth Ministry, will lead the sessions.

What is the cost? Just your time and participation. There is no monetary cost.

How do I register? Complete our simple online form or send an email to Dan Tome at d.tome@stpaulkensington.org or call the parish office at 860-828-0331 and ask for Dan or leave him a voice mail by February 24th. Once we know how many may be interested, we will work out the details of the program. If you have any questions do not hesitate to contact Dan or one of the Friars. If you know of a family member or friend who has not been Confirmed please share this information with them.


