Lent Begins March 2 - With Lent just 11 days away, now is a good time to begin to prepare ourselves for the holy season. Pope Francis at the end of his 2016 Lenten Message said: "Let us not waste this season of Lent, so favorable a time for conversion!" In order to do that I think most of us need to plan ahead a bit in order to make best use of this time that the Lord gives us. Listed below you will find the Mass schedule for Ash Wednesday. Next weekend each parishioner will receive a personal copy of a booklet entitled the *Little Black Book*. The reflections actually start next Sunday and go through Easter. I hope that you will find it to be a helpful aid for your spiritual reflection during those 50 days.

The Church always places before us three tried and true ways (prayer, fasting, and almsgiving) to help us grow in holiness. The most difficult part of this sometimes is what should I "give up" for Lent. Continuing the notion proposed above that a little planning might help us make better use of this season of Lent I offer a few thoughts about what to "give up."

When thinking of giving something up, sometimes we go right to candy or desserts or alcohol or some other favorite food or treat. While that can be fine, there are many ways that we can **fast** besides "giving something up". A few Sundays ago our 2nd reading was from 1 Corinthians 13 in which Saint Paul expounded on what love is as a source of action for renewal and conversion. To be more patient and kind, do not be rude, or jealous, or self-seeking, or pompous, or quick-tempered, not to brood over injury or to rejoice over wrongdoing. Doing so would hopefully have an impact well beyond the 40 days of Lent. Then again, maybe there is a need to fast from eating or drinking too much, or too much time on the internet and with our devices that takes time from family and friends or leads us into temptation. The plan for each can be different and should be different, but what is common is that we have our own plan. These next 11 days then can be a time to put together the first draft of that plan of how not to waste the time that we will be given this Lent.

Ash Wednesday (March 2nd) Mass Schedule - Masses on Ash Wednesday will be celebrated at 7am, 8:45am (School Mass - ALL are welcome), 12 Noon, 5pm and 7pm. Ashes will be distributed at all of the Masses.

What to do with Old Palms? - You may bring your old palms to church next weekend so that they can be burnt and used for ashes on Ash Wednesday. Just leave them in the vestibules before coming into the church itself. You may also burn them on your own and put them in your garden or a flower bed, but since the palms are blessed, they should **not** be discarded in the trash.

Annual End of the Year Donations - Included in this week's bulletin is a listing of all who have made a gift to the parish's Annual (End of the Year) Appeal. As of February 11th this honor roll includes 448 parishioners who have made donations totaling \$80,072!! The average gift thus far is \$178. It is not too late to make a gift so if you still have the intention of doing so know that all gifts are important and can be made at any time including online. The generosity of so many is so very helpful to the parish so that we can continue our wide array of ministries to so many people in the parish. Please note in the next item and in the Finance Council report from John Roman on page 6 that without these Annual End of Year gifts, the parish would not have been in the black this year. So once again thanks for all that you do to support our parish!

Finance Council - The parish Finance Council along with the Parish Trustees (Edward Janik and Dan Sabia) met on Wednesday, February 9th to review the parish's financial statements for FY 21 which ended on December 31 and to review the proposed budget for the current year. This was in advance of submitting these same documents to the Archdiocese which were due by February 15th. I am grateful for the work of John Thorpe, our new Parish Manager, in helping prepare the budget as well as the work of the Finance Council. Please see John Roman's summary report on the meeting on page 6. Thanks to your support during a very challenging year because of COVID-19, the parish continues to enjoy a positive financial bottom line while also tending to the spiritual and temporal needs of the parish. The other members of the parish Finance Council are Rick Dighello, Colleen Lynch, Jim Newman, and Corey Whiteside.

Facilities Committee - This past Saturday the parish's newly formed Parish Facilities Committee began its work of doing a comprehensive evaluation of all of the buildings and properties that the parish owns. This includes both worship sites and all of the associated buildings and property. Eventually it will even include the two buildings at the Berlin Fairgrounds that belong to the parish.

The end goal is to put in place a Master Facilities Plan that will address the condition of all of the buildings and develop a long range plan for each building especially as it relates to all of the major systems and components. This past Saturday morning from 9 to 11am, the committee took advantage of a beautiful February day to examine the exterior of all of the St. Paul buildings and property. The observations ranged from some minor rust in the gazebo structure and some damage to conduit leading to lighting for the sign outside the school to the condition of the roof over the "new" section of the church and the need to scope all of the drains to understand the integrity of the drainage system pipes and a lot more in between. Don Lombardo has agreed to Chair this committee and he is joined by Bart Bovee, Dave Cyr, Bob Fischer, Paul Prior, Brian Pskowski, and Rich Smith as well as John Thorpe and myself. They will be meeting one Saturday morning a month to continue the evaluation process. I am so thankful to have such a diverse and capable committee to help the parish with these very important temporal matters.

Final Thoughts - Most football games are won and lost at the line of scrimmage and that proved true on Sunday as in the end the Bengals O line could not stop the pressure on Joe Burrow. Some of our students interviewed Fr. Raymond as part of our Catholic Schools Week events! The article below was written by Middle School students Ciara Colon, Liam Gaffney, Katherine Parulski and Conrad Yakimishan

Father Raymond Borkowski was born in Scranton, Pennsylvania. He grew up around the church and, like the students of Saint Paul's, he went to Catholic school. He recently celebrated his 60th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood. Well, how did he become a priest? He grew up with his mother and sister who fully supported his journey and path of being ordained as a priest. Along with his immediate family, Fr. Raymond's distant cousin had also influenced where he is today. After great motivation from him, Father Raymond wrote a letter to the Provincial, and after joining the Novitiate in which he went to further his education in spirituality and history on the Franciscan order, his mission from God was clear to him. Father Raymond had "totally immersed himself" into priesthood after being declared a friar. Later in his life he went to the missions in Ghana and he recalls that the students he taught there had an inspiring attitude about learning.

FINANCE COUNCIL MEETING

February 2022

The St Paul Parish Finance Council met on February 9, 2022 for its regularly scheduled quarterly meeting. At the meeting the Council reviewed the Parish Year End 2021 Balance Sheet and Income Statement as well as the Parish 2022 Budget.

The Council is pleased to report that the financial condition of the Parish remains strong primarily as the result of continued Parishioner support. Offertory income for 2021 totaled \$904,000 which was a 4% increase over 2020. Program revenues which were negatively affected by pandemic restrictions in 2020 have started to bounce back rising from \$30,000 in 2020 to over \$72,000 in 2021 as a result of strong Berlin Fair Booth and Parish Raffle results. Total Parish income of \$1.2 Million in 2021 represented a 2% increase over 2020.

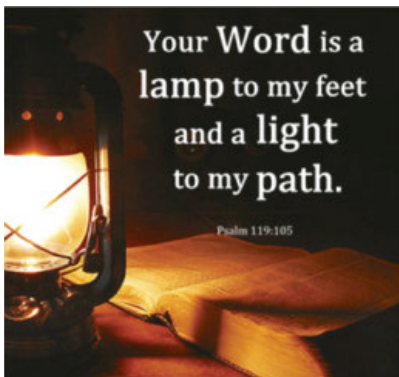
The Friars and Parish staff successfully managed expenses in 2021 resulting in Net ordinary income of \$52,000.

The Finance Council continues to monitor Parish Investment balances and investment risk guided by the Investment Policy Statement which was adopted in 2020. Investment balances have benefited from recent increases in stock market returns.

At the meeting the Finance Council also reviewed and approved the Parish 2022 Budget which calls for revenue and expense increases of approximately 5% over 2021.

The Finance Council thanks Diane Funk for her many years of service to the Parish and for her assistance to the Finance Council in handling and reporting on the day to day financial affairs of the Parish. The Council also looks forward to the assistance of John Thorpe, the new Parish Manager.

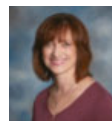

Explore these essential stories in the unique accounts of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John with your small group, and embrace the cross and resurrection in your own life.

WHAT'S THE PURPOSE? The foundation of our Catholic faith is in the scriptures. The Bible is the book of the Church. The more we know the Bible, the better we are able to understand the readings at Mass, explain our faith to others, teach it to our children and use it to form our lives.

HOW DOES IT WORK? We use Little Rock Scripture Study Program—an improved way to study the Bible with fellow Catholics which consists of:

- Personal reading and reflection of scripture.
- Small group meetings for discussion, sharing and prayer.
- You can choose between a Mon., Tues. or Wed. evening meeting which will be either in the Parish Center or church hall from 7:00pm to 8:30pm.
- Instructional lectures.
- A wrap-up lecture by Fr. Michael.

WHAT IF I DON'T KNOW MUCH ABOUT THE BIBLE? The manner in which this program is designed will appeal to those who have never studied the Bible before, as well as those who have been reading the Bible for quite a while. You do not need to worry if you lack understanding or experience. We will all be learning together and supporting one another in this rewarding adventure.

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the [Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults](#). This document is also available online at www.archdioceseofhartford.org. The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulnerable adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report such incidents to the proper authorities as well. We support your right to do so.

Once a written report of an incident of sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult has been received, an investigation will be undertaken by, or on behalf of, the Archdiocese of Hartford.

All parishes in the Archdiocese of Hartford are required to post the document shown above in the bulletin at least once per year.

Adult Confirmation Program

Six Session Program Begins March 3, 2022

Are you an adult who never received the Sacrament of Confirmation? – If so, St. Paul's Adult Confirmation Program (ACP) will prepare you to be Confirmed in the Spring of 2022. The reception of all of the Sacraments is about helping us journey through this life to life eternal. The Sacrament of Confirmation is a confirming and strengthening of our Baptisms. Through the Sacrament you are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and Confirmation provides additional graces to help us live out our adult lives as faithful followers of Jesus and strengthens our bond with the Church. *Those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. Likewise, those to be married in the Catholic Church should be Confirmed.* St. Paul Parish is implementing this six (6) session ACP so that those adult Catholics who were never Confirmed can be fully initiated in the Catholic faith.

Who is eligible? Catholics who are at least 18 years old and have already been baptized and received their 1st Holy Communion may participate in the ACP. If married, you must be in a valid Catholic marriage. If you were married outside the Catholic Church (meaning in a civil ceremony or in a non-Catholic Church without the appropriate permission) and would like to discuss how you can have your marriage recognized in the Church contact one of the Friar-priests and they will be happy to discuss with you your situation. Your preparation for Confirmation can be done simultaneously with the preparation to have your marriage convalidated in the Church, but the convalidation must be concluded before the actual Confirmation ceremony. Generally speaking, this can often be accomplished.

When will the program be held? Thursdays March 3, 10, 17, 24, 31 and April 7 from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. at a location at St. Paul Parish to be determined.

What do the sessions entail? Each session will offer instruction on a particular topic through a variety of means, as well as time for reflection, prayer and a time for questions.

When Would I be Confirmed? The exact date has not yet been determined. You will be confirmed by one of the bishops at a date and location to be determined.

Who will lead the program? Dan Tome, our Director of Youth Ministry, will lead the sessions.

What is the cost? Just your time and participation. There is no monetary cost.

How do I register? Complete our simple online form or send an email to Dan Tome at d.tome@stpaulkensington.org or call the parish office at 860-828-0331 and ask for Dan or leave him a voice mail by **February 24th**. Once we know how many may be interested, we will work out the details of the program. If you have any questions do not hesitate to contact Dan or one of the Friars. **If you know of a family member or friend who has not been Confirmed please share this information with them.**

Decisions, Decisions

“Are you there, God? It’s me, Kristy. I need some help with this decision and would really appreciate it if you could just tell me what to do. I want to do the right thing, and I don’t know what that is. So, can you please show me?”

Looks expectantly toward the sky for a lightning bolt with a sign.

Gosh, if only it was that easy, right? I can’t tell you how many times that’s exactly how it goes in my prayer life, and I walk away frustrated (or laughing at myself in my naivete). But hey, the lightning bolt thing could happen one day - you never know.

Making decisions has always been something I struggle with. From little things like which movie to watch (I could give you three totally valid reasons for and against each choice) to bigger things like if I should start writing that book that I feel called to write (or perhaps I should wait a few years until my kids are older). Can you even imagine how the really big decisions go for me? Praise God that He gifted my husband with heroic patience!

How about you? Do you struggle with making decisions? More specifically, do you struggle with hearing God’s voice and discerning His will for your life?

If this is you, welcome—and pull up a chair. I have come to learn a few things about hearing God’s voice and making decisions, and friend to friend, I want to share them with you.

For starters, I’ve realized that life isn’t a relay race of decisions that we have to make, with each choice shaping and determining the next lap. I used to think of God providing the coaching at each lap when I asked for it, inviting Him in only when I needed His direction. It was more about the outcome and less about the journey. I’ve since learned that life is less like a frantic relay race and more of a slow walk with the Lord, who is with us each and every step of the way—in the big and small things.

In John 10:27, Jesus tells us, “My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me.” What does His voice sound like? It’s not a lightning bolt or crack of thunder (at least not in my experience). His voice often speaks through Scripture, which is literally the Word of God.[1] The more time we spend in Scripture, the more we know His voice and can recognize it when He does call us. This requires a conscious decision to slow down and spend time in prayer and reading Scripture. It sounds so simple, yet it’s true. You will be able to better discern God’s will for your life if you spend more time in Scripture—there is no shortcut here.

The next thing I’ve realized about making decisions and dis-



cerning God’s will is summed up perfectly by both Robert Frost and Joan of Arc. (I couldn’t decide which quote I liked better, so I’m giving you both.)

“*The best way out is always through.*”—Robert Frost

“*Act, and God will act. Work, and He will work.*”—St. Joan of Arc

They are both on to something. Something that, quite frankly, sounds terrifying to me. We just have to take a step, even if it turns out that it was the wrong step.

How can the wrong decision be good? A priest friend once gave me some wise advice when I asked how he makes big decisions that impact an entire parish community on a daily basis. He said, “Once I’ve come to a decision through prayer, I ask the Lord to bless it and pray it’s the right one. If it’s the wrong decision, I ask Him to stop my plans. And if He doesn’t...then I ask Him to help me learn from it.”

What a humble, yet confident way of approaching decision-making! Humble in the way he admits God is in charge of the outcome either way—he knows he’s not big enough to thwart God’s plan. And confident in the way he knows his role and responsibility to the people he was sent to serve, and God will use whatever his decision is for good. Following this model has truly enabled me to feel peace about decisions that I make.

When we make our decisions with this type of humble confidence, we allow the Holy Spirit room to work in our lives. Choices that used to bring stress and worry become opportunities for joy as we cooperate with the Lord and allow Him an active role in our lives. It enables us to grow in trust and experience the depth of love that God has for us.

I still really don’t want to make the wrong decisions in my life. And you know what, God knows that about me. And He knows your doubts and fears about discerning things in your life, too. So, if He allows me (or you) to make the wrong decision, you can bet it’s because He wants to teach me (or you) something because He loves us.

My spiritual director was advising me in this area lately, and she said, “Kristy, we almost never get certainty from the Lord. But we can often have clarity. And most of the time, that’s all we need.”

Praying the Holy Spirit will give you clarity in your decision-making, and that you may step out in humble confidence, trusting that the Lord is with you—no matter the outcome.
