



PASTOR'S COLUMN



Lent Begins Wednesday - "In Jesus crucified, God shows his desire to draw near to sinners, however far they may have strayed from him." (Pope Francis) As we begin this holy season, this season of renewal and conversion, let us consider how we will make best use of these 40 days. On page 6 of this bulletin is our Lenten Schedule including the Mass schedule for Ash Wednesday, March 2nd. Ashes will be distributed in the traditional manner by a sign of the cross on the forehead. The Church's requirements as regards fasting and abstinence can also be found there. These practices are reminders to us of our need for self-sacrifice even if they are really not difficult for us to do. More importantly we should develop our own plan as to how we will strive to be renewed and converted to live and love more like how Jesus lived and loved.

The Church's tried and true template of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving is worthy, I believe, of your consideration once again this year. In this week's column I am highlighting prayer. Enhance your prayer life by attending one or more of our daily Masses during Lent or one of the other devotions including the Stations of the Cross. This year we will hold the Stations of the Cross at St. Paul's. I discuss that reasoning below. See the next item about the Little Black Book that will be available as you leave Mass today. I hope you will find it useful and helpful as a starting point for some prayer and reflection this Lent. A few weeks ago in my final comments about the Gospel of Luke, from which most of our Sunday Gospels are taken this year, I suggested reading the entire Gospel of Luke. Lent could be a good time to do that and if you read about a ½ a chapter a day, you could finish it before Easter. Hopefully in reading it you will also take a bit of time to sit with it and see how God can still speak to you today through this Gospel.

We will once again have Mercy Mondays this year. Every parish in the Archdiocese is encouraged to host these Mercy Mondays. Their primary focus is to offer you the opportunity to go to confession, but here at St. Paul's this hour on Monday is also an opportunity to spend some quiet time in the presence of our Eucharistic Lord. Some parishioners will bring a good spiritual book to read and then pray a bit. I remind you that we also have a weekly Holy Hour year round on Tuesdays at 4:00pm. This time begins with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and then we pray Evening Prayer

together for that day which takes about 10 minutes. The balance of the time until Benediction at 4:50pm is spent in quiet prayer. The usual 5:00pm Mass follows, which of course, all are welcome to attend as well. Whether it is any of these opportunities or others of your own I offer a word of encouragement to spend some extra time in prayer with the Lord.

Little Black Book - So as to offer you an aid the practice of prayer we are distributing a booklet entitled Little Black Book after all Masses this weekend. Sometimes we can be at a loss for how to pray or what to pray for outside of our physical needs or those of others. The brief daily meditations in the Little Black Book can be a starting point for some daily prayer and reflection this Lent and a deepening of your faith and growth as a Catholic and Christian. Feel free to take an extra copy for someone who you think could make good use of it.

Stations of the Cross - Are you familiar with the Stations of the Cross? When was the last time that you took notice of them on the walls of our churches? From the earliest of days, followers of Jesus told the story of his passion, death and resurrection. When pilgrims came to Jerusalem, they were anxious to see the sites where Jesus had been including the way he took up to Calvary. Following in the footsteps of the Lord along the *Via Crucis* (Way of the Cross) or *Via Dolorosa* (Sorrowful Way), became an important part of the pilgrimage visit. The stations as we know them today, came about when it was no longer easy or even possible to visit the holy sites.

Lent is a very appropriate time to pray the Stations of the Cross though it can be prayed any time during the year. By praying the Stations we make a little pilgrimage along the Via Dolorosa being reminded of just how much Jesus went through on his way to Calvary and just how much he loves us. I invite you to join us in praying the Stations during Lent. This year we will pray the Stations each Friday of Lent at 7pm at St. Paul Church. Since the merger of the parishes, the Stations have been held at Sacred Heart Church, but the attendance has not been strong. So we will hold them this year at St. Paul and see if that helps increase attendance. The school children come over on Friday afternoons at 2:00pm to pray the stations except March 18th since they do not have classes that day. Everyone is most welcome to join the children just know that they are geared to their age group. I encourage you not to pass up these opportunities to contemplate, and enter into, the mystery of Jesus' love for you.

Holy Family Passionist Retreat Center - The Passionist Retreat Center in West Hartford offers many opportunities for retreats during the year. They have given me a \$325 voucher for any <u>man</u> who has never made a retreat there. Call or send me an email and I will pass it on to you.

PASTOR'S COLUMN (continued)

2022 Archbishop's Annual Appeal - Stronger Together -Like prayer and fasting, almsgiving is one of the staples of our observance of Lent. In recognizing what our God has done for us and the blessings shared with us we reach out especially to those in need. As a parish and parishioners in the Archdiocese of Hartford one of the ways we are asked to do that is to support the Archbishop's Annual Appeal (AAA) whose theme this year is "Stronger Together." In Archbishop Blair's letter he wrote: "Stronger Together is not just a description of our charitable outreach, but also our unity in Christ whenever we hear His Word and receive Him in Holy Communion at Mass. Mass sends us forth Stronger Together to put our faith into practice by loving God above all things and our neighbor as ourselves. Living our faith means helping others spiritually and materially, caring for our elderly and sick, sheltering the homeless and feeding our hungry. And it means providing spiritual care in a wounded world." As part of the kickoff for this year's AAA Archbishop Blair has prepared a homily that we will watch and listen to at Mass this weekend.

While it is true that we as a parish have many outreaches to the less fortunate, some under way right now, we also know that there is much more that our poorer brothers and sisters need than we can provide as an individual parish. By combining our generosity with over 34,000 other donors across the Archdiocese great things can be accomplished in the name of Christ and the Church of Hartford.

Last year 597 parishioners made gifts and pledges totaling \$128,124 thereby surpassing our goal of \$108,000 by over 18% and a 15.7% increase over our 2020 donations of \$110,722. The average gift was \$214. *Thank you to all who donated!* I am hopeful that, while our goal for 2022 has remained at \$108,000, we as a parish will be as generous as we were last year and even a bit more.


Final Thoughts - Spring Training is still on hold, but this

Abstinence and Fasting During Lent

Catholics age 14+ are obliged to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday.

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means only one full meal is to be eaten.

Other food eaten on a Fast Day should not equal a full meal.

The 2022 Lenten Collection, sponsored by the Social Action Committee, will benefit families and clients of the Prudence Crandall Center and Family Promise in New Britain. Also, we will be collecting for The Underground Of New England*, which mentors survivors of HUMAN TRAFFICKING. These organizations need your support to help needy families in crisis and to bring lasting freedom, employment and hope to survivors of human trafficking. *See page 10 for more information about this organization.


