PASTOR'S COLUMN - SUNDAY, MAY 29, 2022 - SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Confirmation at the Cathedral - Our 10th grade Confirmation students, whose names appear on the cover of this bulletin, received the Sacrament of Confirmation at St. Joseph's Cathedral on May 21st. All of this year's Confirmations in the Archdiocese have been or will be at the Cathedral, the mother Church of the Archdiocese. We were one of seven parishes there that day. The logistics, including parking, were all well planned and executed. Our 56 candidates were among about 200 who received the Sacrament that day. Archbishop Blair presided at the Confirmation and delivered the homily. Auxiliary Bishop Juan Miguel Betancourt, SEVM assisted him in administering the sacrament including to all of our candidates.

It takes many people to help prepare our Confirmation students, and so I offer special thanks to the following who served as catechists for our Confirmation students this year: Kris Bresch, Marco Caracoglia, Jen Chant, Micaela Fitzsimmons, Melissa Gentile, Suzy Gujda, Liz Kelly, Milena Miele, John Norton, Christina Norton and Rachel Rice as well as Amy Barile, Angela Lomaglio, Dee May, Deb Sanders who were substitute catechists. May the Lord bless each of you for sharing the gift of faith with our young people.

I am once again most grateful to our Director of Religious Education, Mrs. Robin Veronesi, who does such an exemplary job in leading our entire Religious Education program with nearly 600 students and dozens of catechists along with other volunteers. No small part of that job are all of the logistics that go into making sure that the Confirmation and 1st Communions are prayerful and at the same time run smoothly and efficiently. The weeks leading up to the Easter Vigil and to 1st Communions and Confirmations is a time filled with so many details and questions and answers. As a parish we are very blessed to have such faithful, dedicated, and hardworking people ministering to our youth. As Pastor I am so grateful for such faithful, dedicated and hard-working associates leading our Religious Ed Program. Whisper, on second thought shout, an extra prayer for them in gratitude for all that they do!!

Congratulations to all of the newly Confirmed and we look forward to you, now fully initiated in the Catholic faith, to share the unique gifts that God bestows upon you to help make us better as a parish. May the Lord bless your parents, godparents and sponsors for sharing the gift of faith with you. Each of the newly Confirmed received a bible as the parish's gift, your gift, to them. Pray for them that the Word of God, with the aid of the Holy Spirit, will guide them through this life to life eternal with God.

Next Weekend is Pentecost & our Parish Ministry Fair -"As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews

or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit." (1 Cor. 12: 12 - 13) As you can see from the insert in this week's bulletin all is set for our Ministry Fair next weekend after all of the Masses in the school gym as we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. The Pastoral Council, led by Nancy Timbrell and her committee, has been working hard on this event to make known the many different ministries, programs, and organizations of the parish. On Saturday come over to the gym for some free pizza and then make your own Sundae while also perusing the displays for all of the parish ministries and organizations. On Sunday, there will be a FREE Continental Breakfast after all of the Masses.

Come and explore how you can share the gifts that the Holy Spirit has given to you with your fellow parishioners and the larger community. You and I are parts of that One Body of Christ and each of us is important to building up that same Body of Christ. Jesus tells us that we are to be the Light of the World. Do not hide your light under a bushel basket. Rather, allow the Holy Spirit to show you how you can be that light right here in our parish! So I invite you to wear some red as a way of trying to unite an inward openness to the workings and gifts of the Holy Spirit in your life with an external expression of faith. Red or no red, I look forward to seeing you at the Ministry Fair! There are a number of prayers to the Holy Spirit, but a simple one, sometimes they are the best, is *Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.* Try using this prayer this week by personalizing it (Come Holy Spirit, and fill my heart with the fire of your love) while asking for an openness to do the will of God in your life. Thanks in advance to the Pastoral Council for the work they have already done!!




