



bringing the relic to our parish. There will be a brief prayer service after the 4:00 pm Mass on Saturday followed by the opportunity to venerate the relic at the end of the service. On Sunday, their will also be an opportunity to venerate the relic after each Mass. Bud Volz has spearheaded this effort and will speak briefly after Communion about Blessed McGivney, a priest of the Archdiocese of Hartford, who was beatified on October 31, 2020. Blessed Fr. 



PASTOR'S COLUMN (continued)

Raffle Tickets - You should have received in the mail this year's Parish Raffle tickets. The Raffle is organized and run by St. Roch's Parish in Greenwich, CT. You will recall that we are a supporting partner parish and that they take care of everything related to the raffle including the mailing of the tickets. I was most surprised to learn that you received five tickets in this year's mailing instead of the usual four. If you read my letter you will note that there should have only been four tickets in the mailing. St. Roch's had decided to send out five tickets this year and on two occasions in written communications I made it clear that I did NOT want five tickets sent to our parishioners. The issue seems to have been with the company who did the mailing for St. Roch's. I have spoken to the chairperson and he is most apologetic about this mistake. So in no way do I want anyone to feel that they need to purchase five tickets. The current issues you are facing with inflation and the cost of gasoline only make this mistake more serious as far as I am concerned. However many tickets you decide to purchase will be greatly appreciated. All of this said, the raffle has been enhanced with a total of 23 prizes totaling \$68,000 in AE Cards with the Grand Prize being \$30,000. Thank you for whatever support you can provide through this lone fund raiser of the parish.






