

Welcome to Our New Parish Manager - There is a bit of irony here that on the day of Diane Funk's retirement party I am announcing for the 2nd time the hiring of someone for her previous position. You will recall that this past October, Deacon John Thorpe was hired to replace Diane. As things would turn out, John would discern that it was time to move south and his last full time day here at St. Paul's was June 3. In the meantime, we have solicited applicants for the position of Parish Manager. This task was undertaken once again by Deacon Don Philip who has extensive previous experience in the Diocese of Springfield as a Parish Administrator and John Roman who is the chair of the Parish Finance Council. They conducted a number of interviews and sent the finalists to me. As a result of that process I am very pleased to announce that we have hired Julio Maturana to fill the Parish Manager's position. His official start date will be July 12, but will be meeting with John and Diane to effect a smooth transition in the days ahead.

I asked Julio to write a brief introduction of himself which you will see below. In it you will notice that, like John Thorpe, he is an ordained permanent deacon of the Archdiocese. His assignment as a deacon is at St. Augustine's in Hartford and he will continue his ministry there while handling the Parish Manager's position here. You may see him occasionally at the altar here, but he will not be assigned as a deacon to our parish. Deacon Don Philip will continue in his ministry as a deacon in our parish. Deacon Julio has been employed by other parishes in the Archdiocese for about 20 years doing much of the same work that he will do here, but more given the size of our operation. Most recently he was the Business Manager for Annunciation Parish in Newington and comes with the highest of recommendations. The appeal of a full-time position was what stirred the initial interest. We are very blessed

to have such an experienced professional and man of faith join our staff. Please read his words of greeting that follow.

Through God's mercy and goodness, I was called to join the Diaconate and was ordained in 2004. This has brought great joy to me and my family. In my diaconal ministry for the past 18 years, I have served in 3 parishes in East Hartford and my current assignment is at St. Augustine Parish in Hartford. I am originally from Cartagena, Colombia in South America. I earned a bachelor's degree in Chemical Engineering from Pontifical Bolivarian University and an associate degree in Accounting from Goodwin University. I have also studied courses in finance and management. I have an extensive background in accounting, including much experience with Archdiocesan procedures. I have worked in many businesses management positions for over 17 years in parishes of the Archdiocese of Hartford. Some include chief engineer. international trade, chemical sales, marketing, purchasing and administration. I have served as a Trustee at Goodwin College since 2008, where I serve on the financial committee.

I am very happy to start sharing what talents I have through working at St. Paul's and the school community. I know that through this experience I will find my personal development enriched and enhanced. With my financial, engineering and management background, I can contribute to the growth and expansion of this lively and blessed Parish and School community.

Parish Raffle - Everyone should have received the parish raffle tickets in the mail by now. If you have not received them, you can call the office and we can send them to you or you can go online to our parish web site and purchase the tickets. 
