





PASTOR'S COLUMN

Happy Independence Day - On Monday we will celebrate our 246th anniversary as a nation, just four years short of our semiguincentennial. Hopefully there will be plenty of time to enjoy some family time with a good old fashioned cookout, a baseball game on the radio or better yet played, time at your favorite summertime retreat, a parade maybe too and fireworks to round out the day. But let us not forget to remember from whom all blessings come, and surely the birth of this nation is a blessing! At his first inauguration on April 30, 1789 President George Washington offered the following prayer personally. "Almighty God, we make our earnest prayer that Thou wilt keep the United States in Thy Holy protection, that Thou wilt incline the hearts of the citizens to cultivate a spirit of obedience, and to entertain a Brotherly affection and love for one another as fellow citizens. May we be pleased to do justice, to love mercy, and to conduct ourselves in charity, humility and gentle temper of mind, which were the characteristics of the Divine Author of our blessed religion, and without whose humble example we can never hope to be a happy nation. God grant us our supplication through Jesus Christ our Lord." Let us not acquiesce to the call of some to eliminate God from our culture and nation. Without God, who has blessed our country with such abundance, we will be no nation at all.

Prayer for the USA

God our Father, Giver of life, we entrust the United States of America to your loving care.

You are the rock on which this nation was founded. You alone are the true source of our cherished rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

Send your Spirit to touch the hearts of our nation's leaders.

Open their minds to the great worth of human life and the responsibilities that accompany human freedom.

Remind your people that true happiness is rooted in seeking and doing your will.

Reclaim this land for your glory and dwell among your people.

Give us the grace and humility to know

what is not right with America.

Give us the gift of your Holy Spirit for the moral and spiritual renewal we need to meet the problems that we face.

Through the intercession of Mary Immaculate, Patroness of our land, bless us and guide us always and increase our respect for all life.

We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

Dobbs vs. Jackson - Since January 22, 1973 efforts have been at work by many to reverse the *Roe vs. Wade* and *Doe vs. Bolton* cases. It is the later that allowed an abortion at any time relative to the mother's health "in the light of all factors - physical, emotional, psychological, familial, and the woman's age" and not just before the viability of the pre-born child. *Planned Parenthood vs. Casey* in 1992 partially overturned *Roe*, and in *Dobbs* the Supreme Court overturned it completely saying that "The Constitution does not confer a right to abortion; . . . and the authority to regulate abortion is returned to the people and their elected representatives."

Yet the heart of the pro-life vs. pro-abortion issue remains the same. The Supreme Court concluded that there is nothing in the Constitution that confers a right to an abortion. Rather, it sends it back to the States where it was in 1973. What has not changed is that what some refer to as a freedom or a choice has a consequence and that consequence is the ending of a human life. Clearly there are religious and moral reasons for opposing it, but in a pluralistic society Cardinal O'Malley of Boston rightly notes that it is a human rights issue and it is just one aspect of advocating for the rights and dignity of every human life. He said: "Our continued efforts in advocating our position on the protection of unborn children is consistent with our advocacy for issues affecting the dignity of all persons at all stages and in all circumstances of life. The Church employs this principle of consistency in addressing issues of race, poverty, and human rights generally. It is a position that presents a moral argument as a foundation for law and policy to protect human life."

With the Dobbs decision there is such a possibility, but so much more has to be done. Archbishop Blair in a statement (which is included as an insert in this bulletin) said the following: "Now that *Roe v. Wade* has finally been set aside, it is for the people of the United States, . . . to decide the protections that can and should be afforded to the unborn. We need to make every effort to ensure that this happens, and that life is respected from conception until natural death. This is all the more urgent, living as we do in a "culture of death" fueled by abortion and euthanasia, where suicide among young people, lethal violence by guns or other means, and disrespect and intolerance are increasing."

The CT Catholic Conference added the following in recognition that so much more must be done to help women bring their child to birth. "We will provide assistance for women so they may make life-affirming decisions. Christ calls us to love our neighbor, practice charity and not pass judgment on others - to "accompany them" as Pope Francis says, and not turn them away. In that spirit, our parishes and our social programs must be prepared to meet the increasing needs for...



pro-life pregnancy resource centers and supports for women raising children." As a parish we must be ready to be part of the solution and continue to build on the programs that we already support and promote each year that assist women and their children. One of those ways is enliven our Culture of Life Ministry with new blood and leadership.

Culture of Life Ministry - The parish is still in need of leadership for our Culture of Life Ministry. The Culture of Life Ministry helps to promote the constant teaching of the Catholic Church that all human life, from the moment of conception, is sacred and must be protected. 

Saint Maria Goretti is the Patron Saint of: youth, girls, young women, purity, and victims of rape. Feast day: July 6.

"St. Maria Goretti is unique in that she is the youngest canonized saint in the Church. She died tragically on July 6, 1902, at the age of eleven.

..when Maria was nine, her father died tragically. It fell to her at that time to raise her five siblings while her mother

worked the fields to produce the crops with which they would both pay the rent and feed themselves. This was a terrible time of trial and suffering for the whole family. For Maria it was especially difficult. Aside from having the responsibility of caring for her family, she had to also cook and clean for her two next door neighbors-Giovanni Serenelli and his son, Alessandro-who assisted her mother with the farm tasks."

Maria died from multiple stab wounds inflicted by the neighbor, Alessandro, after she rejected him because of love of Jesus and her loyalty to the Ten Commandments. She mercifully forgave her attacker before she died.

The attendance at her canonization in 1950 was said to have been the largest of any canonization up to that time. It was a crowd so large that for the first time in its history, St. Peter's Basilica—the largest church in the world—could not be used for a canonization Mass, because it was too small to hold the faithful who desired to witness the event. Among those in attendance was her attacker, Alessandro, who had sought and received forgiveness from Maria's mother. Saint Maria Goretti, pray for us.


