

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Are You Someone or Do You Know Someone Who . . .

- has expressed an interest in becoming Catholic?
- was baptized Catholic as a child, but
- has not celebrated Sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation?

If so, the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is a wonderful opportunity to come together in a small group to learn more about the Catholic faith. The RCIA sessions focus on the teachings and experience of the Church and prepares individuals to celebrate the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, that they have not yet received, at the Easter Vigil on April 8, 2023 so as to grow in their faith and become closer to God.

Maybe you were baptized, but never received 1st Holy Communion and Confirmation. Maybe you know someone who was baptized in another faith tradition, but has expressed interest in becoming Catholic. Maybe it is someone who has only just begun to think about a life of faith. I encourage all parishioners to think about and pray about someone who you think might be interested in the RCIA program. If you are not sure how to approach the person feel free to speak to one of the Friars.

Adults from all faith traditions, or no religious background at all, are welcome to participate. We have three people for the program already. The sessions will be held on Thursdays beginning on October 6 and will culminate at the Easter Vigil on April 8th. For information about the details of the RCIA program please contact Fr. Adult Confirmation Program - If for whatever reason you are 18 years of age or more and have never received the Sacrament of Confirmation please refer to page 9 for information about our six (6) session Adult Confirmation Program that will begin on September 22nd and culminate with your Confirmation on November 8th. This program is for adult Catholics who have been baptized and received 1st Holy Communion, but have not been confirmed. To be a Godparent at Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation you must be Confirmed. More importantly the Sacrament provides grace that helps us live faithful adult lives and helps us along our individual journeys to God in heaven. The deadline to register is Sept. 15.

Gearing Up - With September knocking on the door many programs and ministries will be going full throttle very soon. That is certainly the case for the youth of the parish as St. Paul School opened for the 65th time last Thursday and the Opening School Year Mass will be Tuesday. It is also the case for our Religious Education Program as well. Parents with children in Religious Ed should note in particular the upcoming Parent Meetings on page 5. Of course, if you have not yet registered your child please do so ASAP.

Programs are also getting under way for adults of the parish. I draw your attention to three of them: The Little Rock Scripture Study, That Man is You and Women of Faith can help you grow in your faith and deepen your spiritual life.

Little Rock Scripture Study - For the past several years up



to 50 to 60 parishioners have met in small groups of eight or so here at the parish to read, learn, reflect, and pray with the scrip-

tures. In the fall of 2018, they studied the Infancy Narratives, the Gospel of St. Luke by the Acts of the Apostles which was also written by St. Luke, the Eucharist in Scripture, and the Passion Narratives. This year they are going to the beginning of the Bible and the Book of Genesis. I encourage all parishioners to consider joining this group to strengthen your faith and knowledge of the Word of God. There is an Information Night this Wednesday, August 31st at 7:00pm. Coming to the information night is NOT a commitment to the program, just an opportunity to learn more about this opportunity to enrich your faith. In addition to the evening sessions if there is enough interest an afternoon group is also being considered. See page 4 for more info.

That Man is You - Is an interactive men's program that com-



bines a video series which contains the best research from science with the teachings of the Catholic faith and the wisdom of the saints to develop the vision

of man fully alive and to address the pressures and temptations that men face in our modern culture. The short thoughtprovoking videos stir up discussions on important matters for the men attending. All men are welcome to participate in this extraordinary program. The group meets on Saturday mornings at 7:00 am wrapping up around 8:15 am. Two 13-week sessions are held each year with the fall session beginning September 10th. 

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully. He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. Rather, when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then he said to the host who invited him, "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Pastoral Council Nomination and Selection Process As you are aware, the St. Paul Pastoral Council is seeking nominees for new members on the Council. In the previous announcements, we have discussed who is eligible and the purpose of the Council. This week we will highlight milestone dates and the selection process.

September 10 & 11 – The Pastoral Council Nominating Committee will be soliciting nominees at all Masses. In conjunction with this, we will also have a nominating form available. The nominating form will allow you to nominate yourself or someone you feel would be a worthy candidate.

September 26 – Solicitation for nominees will be complete and the nominating Committee will assemble the list of qualified nominees.

October 6 & 10 – Information sessions will be hosted by the Nominating Committee. All qualified nominees will be contacted for their preference of dates. The purpose of these sessions is to provide information regarding Council operations and provide an opportunity for questions. This will also be an opportunity for further discernment for the Nominees.

October 24 – Final list of Nominees will be presented to the Pastoral Council for its approval of new members.

November TBD - New members will be presented to the Parish at Mass.

November 28 – New Council is seated and officers are selected.

We look forward to meeting with all the nominees and thank them in advance for answering the Lord's call to share their talents with our Parish family. The Pastoral Council is open to all registered and practicing members of the Parish, age sixteen and older. You must have a desire to serve the Parish Family, a willingness to work with the Pastor, and the ability to work in a group process through prayer, planning, and consensus. You must also desire to foster the teachings of the Church and have a commitment to attend meetings.

ADULT CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

Six Session Program Begins September 22, 2022 Are you an adult Catholic who never received the Sacrament of Confirmation? If so, St. Paul's Adult Confirmation Program (ACP) will prepare you to be Confirmed in the Fall of 2022. The reception of all of the Sacraments is about helping us journey through this life to life eternal. The Sacrament of Confirmation is a confirming and strengthening of our Baptism. Through the Sacrament you are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and Confirmation provides additional graces to help us live out our adult lives as faithful followers of Jesus and strengthens our bond with the Church. Those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. Likewise, those to be married in the Catholic Church should be Confirmed.

Who is eligible? Catholics who are at least 18 years old and have already been baptized and received their 1st Holy Communion may participate. If married, you must be in a valid Catholic marriage. If you were married outside the Catholic Church (meaning in a civil ceremony or in a non-Catholic Church without the appropriate permission) and would like to discuss how you can have your marriage recognized in the Church, contact one of the Friar-priests and they will be happy to discuss with you your situation. Your preparation for Confirmation can be done simultaneously with the preparation to have your marriage convalidated in the Church, but the convalidation must be concluded before the Confirmation ceremony. Generally speaking, this can often be accomplished.

When will the program be held? Tuesdays, Sept. 22 & 29 and Oct. 6, 13, 20 & 27 from 6:30pm to 8:00pm at a location at St. Paul Parish to be determined.

What do the sessions entail? Each session will offer instruction on a particular topic through a variety of means, as well as time for reflection, prayer and a time for questions.

What Information must I supply? You must complete a registration form and provide proof of your Baptism and 1st Holy Communion if you received those sacraments at a parish other than St. Paul's. If you are married you also need to provide proof of the marriage.

When and Where Would I be Confirmed? The Archdiocese of Hartford will schedule an Adult Confirmation Ceremony for a date in November at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford.

Who will lead the program? Dan Tome, our Director of Youth Ministry and Adult Catechesis, will lead the sessions.

What is the cost? Just your time and participation. There is no monetary cost.
