PASTOR'S COLUMN

Forward With Faith - This is my third installment concerning the *Forward With Faith* (FWF) Capital Campaign that is being conducted by the Hartford Bishops' Foundation (HBF) for the Archdiocese and its parishes. During the course of the campaign, which was begun in 2018, all parishes in the Archdiocese are required to participate. Every parish also directly benefits because at least 50% of all funds donated come back to the parish. If we exceed our goal of \$975,000 then we will receive 80% of all funds raised above the goal.

Back in the spring, I approached a number of parishioners to serve on our campaign committee. I am very grateful for their willingness to serve. Serving on the committee are: Mark & Maura Chasse, Tom & Marlene Drzata, Nancy DePalma, Diane Funk, Ed & Gloria Janik, Don Lombardo, Lynn Misteri, Ryan & Letty Morrisey, John & Janet Roman, and Ewa & Corey Whiteside. The first thing they were asked to do was to review the plans that had been developed internally for how the parish would use its portion of the funds. After presenting the list of potential projects, they narrowed the scope, but also thought that given our local needs we should aim for a higher local goal. As a result, the committee recommended that we set the parish goal at \$1,200,000.

Our local FWF committee have all been very generous in many ways. They have been attending bi-weekly meetings since May, contacting parishioners, and they have hosted five receptions. Their generosity also includes their financial support as well. Their efforts have resulted in over \$450,000 in pledges already. All pledges can be paid over a five (5) year period. In the next week or so every parishioner will receive a mailing asking for your participation in this campaign. Then on the weekend of October 8/9, members of the Campaign Committee will speak at the Masses and invite you to participate by making a pledge payable over five years. The following weekend (October 15/16) will be Commitment Weekend when you will be asked to return the pledge card that you received in the mail.

In the bulletin insert two weeks ago was an outline of how the parish would make use of the funds here in the parish. Some additional flyers are available in the church near the weekly bulletins. Allow me to speak to one of these areas this week. As a parish we have a number of programs and services that are directed to different constituencies of the parish including our more senior members and our youth. This campaign would like to direct more attention and resources to our young adults and young families. This age group is under represented in our weekly congregation. We envision developing programs that more specifically reach out and serve this element of our parish and will seek to engage them more in the life of the parish. The future vitality of our parish is dependent on our success in this area. Next week I will touch upon some of the other needs of the parish that your support of the campaign would help us address. On page 8 read why committee members decided to support the campaign.

Nominations for the Pastoral Council Due September 26 -Nomination forms and detailed information was included in last weekend's bulletin. Additional forms are available at the usher stations, online, and from the Parish Center. All nominations are due by Monday, September 26th.

Adult Confirmation Program - The Adult Confirmation Program will begin this Thursday, September 22nd and is for adult Catholics, 18 years of age and older, who have been baptized and received 1st Holy Communion, but have not been confirmed. If you missed the September 15th deadline, you have until this Tuesday, September 20th to sign up. Recall that those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation <u>must</u> have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. For more information visit our website.

Is the RCIA Program for You or Someone You Know? - It is if you are interested in becoming Catholic or you know someone who has mentioned it to you. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is for adults from all faith traditions or no religious background who are interested in becoming Catholic. This program is also for those who were baptized Catholic, but then received little or no other meaningful instruction in the faith. The sessions will be held on Thursdays beginning on October 6 and will culminate at the Easter Vigil on April 8th. Thus far we have four participants for this year's RCIA program. PASTOR'S COLUMN (continued)

2023 Mass Book Opens Tuesday for Tier A Intentions -Included as an insert in this bulletin is information outlining a tiered approach to the opening of the 2023 Mass Book. This tiered approach has been used successfully the last two years and gives priority to parishioners celebrating special anniversaries and an opportunity for all parishioners to remember their loved ones. In addition to an outline of the dates for this three tiered approach there is also other information on this pious practice of offering Mass for someone living or deceased. The suggested, but not obligatory, offering at St. Paul's for weekday Masses is \$10 and \$15 for Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. The regular weekday and weekend Mass schedule will remain the same in 2023.

Franciscan Transitus Service - The Feast of St. Francis of Assisi is October 4th. On the evening before the Feast, Franciscans join together to remember the Poor Man from Assisi's passing or transiting from this life to life eternal in what is called a Transitus Service. This year we will hold the Transitus Service at 7:00 pm on Monday, October 3rd. This is NOT a Mass. This reflective prayer service will include some music, scripture readings, and readings from the life of St. Francis including those that recall his death. The service will be about 45 minutes. All parishioners are invited to join the Friars as we remember our Founders passing onto eternity. There will not be a 5:00 pm Mass on October 3rd.

Blessing of Animals - Because of St. Francis' special appreciation for all of God's creation, including the animal population, it is traditional for a Blessing of Animals be held near the Feast of St. Francis. The Blessing of Animals will take place in the rear parking lot on Saturday, October 1st at 1:30 pm. The pets, nor their owners, have to be Catholic to come for the blessing! ALL are welcome!!

HOPES Collection - Next weekend (Sept. 24/25) there is a 2nd collection to support the Parish Elementary Schools of the Archdiocese, aptly named Help **O**ur **P**arish Elementary **S**chools. Your envelope says Catholic Elementary Schools. In that we have our own school we directly benefit from this collection as 25% of what you donate stays here with the remainder helping other schools in the Archdiocese. During the year, schools are able to apply for grants from these funds. Last year St. Paul's received \$1,500 for a Smart TV.
