

PASTOR'S COLUMN

All Saints Day is Tuesday - Holy Day of Obligation – This Tuesday, November 1st, is the Feast of All Saints and a Holy Day of Obligation which obliges all of the faithful to attend Mass on that day. The Mass schedule will include a Vigil Mass on Monday, October 31st at 4pm (note the earlier time). On Tuesday Masses will be at 7am, 8:45am (School Mass -ALL are welcome to attend), 12 Noon and 7pm.

The Month of November and the Communion of Saints -The church designates each November as a month dedicated to praying for the dead. Yet the month begins with the Solemnity of All Saints on November 1st, the day we as Catholics celebrate all the saints, known and unknown. The feast arose out of the Christian tradition of celebrating the martyrdom of saints on the anniversary of their martyrdom. When martyrdoms increased during the persecutions of the late Roman Empire, local dioceses instituted a common feast day in order to ensure that all martyrs, known and unknown, were properly honored. This feast also reminds us that the call to holiness begins with our Baptism and continues until the day of our death and is within everyone's reach.

In the last sentence of the Apostles' Creed, we profess: "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting." What is this communion of Saints? The communion of saints is a spiritual solidarity which exists between the members of the Church on earth, with the suffering souls in purgatory, and with the saints in heaven. Together we all make up the church, the Body of Christ. We begin November being inspired by ALL the Saints, including some of our own family and friends 'who have competed well, finished the race, and have kept the faith.' (See 2 Tim 4:7) On this day, "we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith. (Hebrews 12: 1-2a)

Therefore it is in solidarity with the deceased that we celebrate on November 2nd All Souls Day, the feast of the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. Our annual Parish Memorial Mass for all those who died over the last year will be held on Wednesday at 7pm. (There will NOT be a 5pm Mass on November 2). The next of kin for all who died since October 2021 through October 2022 should have received a letter inviting all family and friends of the deceased to attend this Mass. If you did not receive a letter, contact the parish office. ALL parishioners are invited to attend this Mass to pray for our beloved deceased and for those who mourn their passing. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (no. 1032) teaches us that prayer for the dead is one of the spiritual works of mercy. **Forward With Faith Update -** Your response to the FWF capital campaign continues to be very generous and very strong! Last weekend we received additional pledges and donations totaling \$47,093 which brings the total to \$945,748!!!! As of Monday, October 24th we are at 97% of our goal of \$975,000 and 78% of our need of \$1.2 million. If you have not already made a pledge or donation to our efforts, then please pray about how you might help us reach our goal. Pledge forms can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed in, or placed in the collection basket. If you are including a payment, please make all checks payable to *Forward with Faith*. Once again, thank you to all of the donors and may the Lord bless you abundantly for your goodness!

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick - We will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick after all of the weekend Masses on November 19 & 20. I will have some reminders next week about the Sacrament, but recall that the Sacrament is not just for those who are imminently dying. If you are suffering with a chronic condition, serious medical problem, pending serious surgery, and/or the effects of aging, I invite you to plan to stay after Mass that weekend to be anointed. The service (about 15 minutes) will be done for all at once with each person being anointed individually.

Appreciation Reception Recap - Last Sunday the parish hosted about 100 parishioners to share some food, drink and fellowship while acknowledging all of the good works that they had done throughout the year. God indeed blesses us with so many parishioners who are willing to share that very precious commodity, their time, as well as a wide variety of gifts. It is indeed in those moments that we best represent the one Body of Christ. Different gifts, different talents, but all in service of the one Body of Christ. My thanks goes out to the entire Pastoral Council for sponsoring and organizing this event. Special thanks to Mary Corrigan and Nancy Timbrell who chaired the event. I also want to recognize Michael's Catering of New Britain who handled the food and provided a generous and delicious array of food.

Fall Back! - Daylight Savings Time ends next Sunday at 2:00 a.m. Remember to FALL BACK by setting your clocks BACK one hour before going to sleep Saturday night.

Traffic Patterns and Safety - This is a reminder that on Sunday until 2pm, Peck Street is one-way southbound, that is from Farmington Avenue past Alling Street to Main Street. This is posted by the town at both ends of Peck Street. Given the local custom of parking on both sides of Alling Street in the same direction facing Peck Street on Sunday mornings it is probably a good idea for everyone to also treat it as oneway on Sundays eastbound from Grove Hill to Peck Street. *Continued on page 4*


