



Anointing of the Sick Next Weekend - As previously announced, we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick after all weekend Masses next weekend, November 19 & 20. Mass will take place as usual and then after the closing hymn is finished those wishing to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will move to the front of the new wing (at Sacred Heart just come to the front of church) and be seated in EVERY OTHER row so that the priests can easily come to you for the laying on of hands and the actual anointing with the Oil of the Sick which will take place on your foreheads and the palms of your hands. If you are not sure if you should receive the Sacrament I refer you to last weekend's bulletin where that was discussed. If still unsure just ask one of the Friars.

Children's Mass - Beginning next Sunday, November 20th at the 10:30am Mass, we will begin having a Sunday liturgy geared more towards the children who are at that Mass. Some of our younger parishioners will take on some of the liturgical roles at the Mass, our burgeoning Children's Choir will provide some of the music, and the homily will be geared more to the youth in attendance. Initially this will be at one Sunday Mass a month and the Mass will rotate among the Sunday morning Masses at St. Paul except the 7:30am Mass.

1, 2, 3, Thank You! - We have a dedicated group of volunteers who count the weekly in pew collections every week. A



member of this crew, Elva Stregowski, has opened her last envelope and counted her last dollar after doing this for at least a dozen years, maybe even a baker's dozen! Elva, thank you for your loyal and dedicated service to this ministry and for upholding the trust and responsibility that each counter

carries in fulfilling their duties. Over the years Elva has also been involved in the Ladies' Guild and New Britain Council of Catholic Women. She has also been one of our famed bakers having been chairwoman of the Ladies' Guild bake sale for a few years. She has also helped out at other parish events including the Parish Picnic. Thank you Elva!

Charity Starts at Home - If you know of a family in the parish or in the neighborhood who is in need of help please let us know. You can put their name and address on a piece of paper and drop it off at the office or put it in the collection basket or mail it in to the parish office.

Angel Giving Tree - The Angel Giving Tree will be set up before Masses next weekend (Nov. 19/20/). You are invited to take an angel(s) from the tree and buy the item(s) listed so that the recipient(s) will be able to share a bit of joy in receiving a gift at Christmas that they would not otherwise receive. This outreach to the less fortunate is part of the good work

that our Social Action Ministry undertakes. A small tree will also be set up at Sacred Heart. Sacred Heart Church is open for private prayer on Sundays from 10am to 3pm, Wednesdays from 5:30 to 8:30pm and on Saturdays from 9 to 11am. There will also be some angels on line as of November 19th as well. All gifts will need to be received by December 11th.

Forward With Faith Update - Due to the generosity of our parishioners we are now over \$1 million dollars in pledges and donations! A reminder, that since we have exceeded our goal of \$975,000 the parish now receives back 80% of all donations to help us with projects that have been outlined for the parish. As of Monday, November 7th pledges and donations now total \$1,029,468 which is 86% of our need of \$1.2 million. Pledge forms can be dropped off at the parish office, mailed in or you may place them in the collection basket. If you are including a payment please make all checks payable to Forward with Faith. Once again thank you to all of the donors and may the Lord bless you abundantly for your goodness!

Berlin Fair Wrap Up - As with the Raffle Report last week, this one has been waiting in the wings for space too. The Berlin Fair had an exceptional four day run this year aided considerably by perfect weather. Once again dozens of parishioners put in lots of time and effort over the four days. The number of volunteers and the total number of hours that the volunteers put into this effort is such a wonderful thing to behold. Thank you to each of you, the long time veterans as well as the new volunteers this year!

For those who give leadership to this endeavor, it is not just the weekend, but all of the work that goes into it before and after the Fair opens and closes. The complexity of the Fair and its administration continues to increase and thus so does the work for the leadership team. Please join me in offering a personal word of gratitude to those who gave leadership to this year's Berlin Fair: Amy Audette, Andrea Cofrancesco, Helen deRito, Linda Stickel, Eileen Thurston, Nancy Timbrell, and Ewa Whiteside. Their extensive planning and prudent decision making help the parish benefit greatly. Thanks to all who supported them in these efforts as well.

The gross income from the two booths was \$45,486 while the expenses to operate both booths totaled \$22,881. So the net profit from the two booths during the Fair itself was \$22,605 which is a \$1,170 increase over 2021. During the course of the year we had repair and maintenance expenses for the two booths of \$798 so the overall net for the year is \$21,807. Let us give thanks to the Lord for the blessings he has shared with us from the success of the Berlin Fair for the community and our parish.


