

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Solemnity of Christ the King - On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. We close the liturgical year with Christ the King because in Him everything converges. In today's gospel, as Jesus is dying on the cross, he is mocked, "If you are the King of Jews save yourself." Jesus' coming of course was never about saving Himself, but us. He dies on the cross so that we might be saved. As we conclude this Year of St. Luke and our readings from the Gospel of Mercy, we have the dialogue between Jesus and the two criminals being crucified with him. While the one mocks him, the other says "Jesus remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus promises him that he will be in paradise with him that day. Jesus takes his place at the right hand of the Father because he accomplished the mission entrusted to him by the Father to redeem us. This is a humble and servant King who leads us to the Father by always offering us his mercy if we but ask. Today let us recognize Christ as King of the universe and the Lord of all aspects of our lives. Let us also be sure that no earthly loyalties are ever more important than our loyalty to Christ.

Anointing of the Sick This Weekend - The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated after all Masses this weekend. Mass will take place as usual and then after the closing hymn is finished (the Altar Servers will process out without the celebrant) those wishing to stay and receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will move to the front of the **new wing** (at Sacred Heart just come to the front of church) and be seated in EVERY OTHER row so that the priests can easily come to you for the laying on of hands and the actual anointing with the Oil of the Sick which will take place on your foreheads and the palm of your hands.

Happy Thanksgiving!! - President Theodore Roosevelt wrote, "Let us remember that, as much has been given us, much will be expected from us, and that true homage comes from the heart as well as from the lips, and shows itself in deeds." Let us not forget from whom all blessings flow. So before we immerse ourselves in some turkey and football, let us be sure to bow our heads and raise our hearts in thanksgiving to God from whom all blessings flow. Let us especially thank God for the gift of our faith and continue to share with each other what God has given to us. Please join our Eucharistic celebration on Thursday morning at 9am. The word Eucharist means thanksgiving, and so it is very appropriate for us to gather for Mass to give our thanks to God and to remember the Lord's call to share what we have been given.

Allow me to offer my own words of Thanksgiving to God for each of you. Your presence and participation in the life of the parish is a true blessing for St. Paul Parish. To all who go the extra mile or two or three a very special thanks on behalf of all who benefit from your generosity of your time, gifts and

talents shared, and your resources. Your legacy of generosity has been cemented ever more deeply the last few months. I am truly overwhelmed by your support of ALL of the drives the last few weeks, your faithful support of the parish and school, and of course your commitment to *Forward With Faith*. Thank you Lord for all the blessings you pour upon this parish through the good people of St. Paul Parish! On behalf of all of the Friars, Deacon Don, and the entire parish staff, I wish everyone a very Happy Thanksgiving!

Thanks also to Mark and Mary Jane Duplin for helping Ashley transition into the leadership post.

There is much that is politicized these days following the reversal of *Roe vs. Wade*. We hear much about freedom and choice when comments are made about the Dobbs decision. The moral issue though is the protection of a life. The Church teaches, and science confirms, that a new life begins at conception. What many debate is when that life deserves protection. It is when life is most vulnerable that it especially needs a voice so that it can be protected. The Church teaches that it is God, and God alone, who ought to determine the beginning of life, and he determines when to call that life home to Himself. I suspect, if the last few years are the barometer, members of the CT State Legislature will once again attempt to move forward assisted suicide legislation. All human life is sacred and belongs in the hands of God alone.



- † Offer some prayers this month for not only the souls you knew here on earth, but for those who are in most need of our prayers. Those souls who have been forgotten or whose family and friends have neglected to pray for them.

Venerable Fulton Sheen once said, "As we enter heaven, we will see them, so many of them coming towards us and thanking us. We will ask who they are, and they will say a poor soul you prayed for in purgatory."
