





Advent - A Time of Waiting - It is rare when Advent is a full four weeks long, but that is the case this year since Christmas falls on a Sunday. The secular society that we live in tells us that it is Christmas time. Some elements of that society began telling us that months ago. We even have "Black Friday" a month in advance. However, our faith and Church tells us that before we celebrate the Nativity of the Lord on Christmas Day, and the <u>beginning</u> of the Christmas season, we celebrate Advent first. While we most often think of Advent as preparation for Christ's coming at Christmas, the first three weeks are very much about preparing for Christ's second coming at the end of time or our own end of time. So how might we best use this time of Advent to be watchful and ready to prepare ourselves for when Jesus comes again in addition to joyfully and prayerfully remembering His birthday?

During Advent we will hear John the Baptist proclaim, "Prepare the way of the Lord." What might be hindering me on the way to Jesus? What might I be putting in God's way to me? With this time of year being so very busy, if you and I do not carve out some time for a little more prayer and reflection we will be sitting amidst a bunch of unwrapped presents trying to figure out where the season of Advent went. So might I suggest before we become overtaken with our secular customs and responsibilities that we take some time this day to consider how we can make our path to the Lord a little smoother and with less obstacles. Likewise, are we putting up any roadblocks for the Lord to us? Maybe we are just not taking enough time to listen to him in some silence. What concretely can I do to get my spiritual house better prepared to welcome Him? See the next item about the Magnificat Advent Companion booklets that are being passed out today. Avail yourself to His love and mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. See the item below about the Mercy Mondays that begin December 5th. Hopefully each of these two ways will help us prepare the way of the Lord when we celebrate the day of his birth in Bethlehem on December 25th.

Advent Reflection Booklets - To give you a bit of assistance to have a more reflective Advent this year the ushers will be passing out a coy of the *Magnificat Advent Companion* booklet to each parishioner as you leave Mass this weekend. I hope you will find it useful.

Mercy Mondays - "Let the Church always be a place of MERCY and HOPE, where EVERYONE IS WELCOMED, LOVED and FORGIVEN." (Pope Francis) Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord is an opportune moment to clean up our spiritual lives by availing ourselves of the Jesus' mercy and forgiveness. With this in mind, we will offer extra times for the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation on the last three Mondays of Advent on Dec. 5, 12 and 19. These Mercy Mondays will have all four priests avail-

able for confession from 7 to 8pm as well as exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. I remind you that we also hear confessions twice every Saturday; first in the morning from 8:30 to 9:30am and then again from 3:00 to 4:00pm in the afternoon. On the Mercy Mondays we will also have Eucharistic Adoration during that time as well. These Holy Hours are in addition to the Tuesday Holy Hours from 4 to 5pm leading up to Mass at 5pm. Come and experience the forgiveness that God offers you and the joy of getting a fresh start.

Happy 25th Anniversary Deacon Don - On November 29,



1997 Deacon Don Philip was ordained a permanent deacon by Bishop Kenneth Steiner who was the Auxiliary Bishop of Portland in Oregon. Deacon Don along with his wife Lynn and his family had moved to Oregon from western Massachusetts. While in Portland, Deacon Don served in parish ministry and as a hospital chaplain. He and Lynn

were active in the diaconate formation program in Portland and he served on the first Archdiocesan Pastoral Council for Portland. He returned to Western Massachusetts in 2007 where he continued his ministry as a deacon in the Diocese of Springfield. He was a nursing home chaplain, served in parish ministry, and was also entrusted with the administration of two different parishes. He also served on various diocesan committees. In 2019 Deacon Don moved to Meriden, CT. Deacon Don began his ministry here at St. Paul's during the early months of the pandemic in 2020. The first Mass that he assisted at here was on Palm Sunday via live-stream.

We have been blessed to have him serve as a deacon here in our parish. He is here each weekend for Masses and regularly helps with funeral services and baptisms. He has also been giving leadership to our Ushers and Greeters. The timing of his anniversary did not make it feasible to celebrate his 25th anniversary at this time. In the spring, probably late April or early May, we will join with Deacon Don and his family to celebrate his years of ministry in the Church in three different (arch)dioceses and most especially here with us. At this time kindly remember him in prayer especially on Tuesday. Happy Anniversary, Deacon Don!




