

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Guadete Sunday - Rejoice! - Already we have come to the 3rd Sunday of Advent which is known as *Gaudete* Sunday (which is Latin for rejoice) from the Entrance antiphon for the Mass which says "Rejoice in the Lord, always: again, I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." This joyful spirit is marked by the third candle in our advent wreath which is rose colored. In the first reading the prophet Zephaniah says "The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a mighty savior; he will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in his love, he will sing joyfully because of you, as one sings at festivals." In the 2nd reading St. Paul wrote to the Philippians "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!" "Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Do we live our lives rejoicing? Can we help others rejoice by treating them as God treats us? Can we remove the anxiety in our lives by trusting a little more in God's love and care for us? You might say 'I have nothing to rejoice about.' Sometimes the events and circumstances of life make us feel less joyful. But we need to recall Jesus is Emmanuel, "God with us", and especially in the moments when life is toughest God is ever the more with us. So as Advent quickly moves on take a moment to rejoice in the love that Jesus has for you. Rejoice in the good things he does for you. Do not let the challenges of life Hinder Him Coming to You again nor let those things hinder you from going to Him with all that might weigh you down. "Rejoice in the Lord, always: again, I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near!"

Christmas Concert/Live Nativity (Greccio) on Dec. 18th -I hope you are planning on joining us next Sunday for our Christmas Concert and Live Nativity. As you might remember, it was St. Francis who first re-enacted the Nativity with the people of the little town of Greccio in Italy in 1223. Join us for this Franciscan Christmas tradition next Sunday, Dec. 18th at 5:00 p.m. This will be done by some of our youth and will be interwoven with our Christmas concert led by the Parish choir and our Youth choir *Exaltations*. So help set the tone for the week before Christmas by joining us next Sunday in St. Paul Church.

Mercy Mondays - Confessions Prior to Christmas -*"Mercy will always be greater than any sin, and no one can place limits on the love of God who is ever ready to forgive." -Misericordiae Vultus* This Monday, December 12 and next, December 19, four confessors will be available from 7pm to 8pm. Our regular confession schedule is every Saturday morning from 8:30am to 9:30am and every Saturday afternoon from 3pm to 4pm. On Christmas Eve confessions will only be heard in the morning. On the Mercy Mondays we will have Eucharistic Adoration during that time as well. Come and experience the forgiveness that God offers you and the joy of getting a fresh start.

Thanks to the school parents led by Sarah Santone for their work and once again this year to the Kacperski family for providing the refreshments. The Confirmation candidates were a big help serving the hot chocolate and handing out cookies and placing all of the luminaries in their proper order. Thanks to everyone who donated a luminary, there were more than 300! The parish folk group led by Maura Liegeot with Jeff Batter led us in a few Christmas carols. When the switch was flipped and all of the lights came on, the work of Bill DiCicco and Patrick Walsh certainly shone round about and still does each night.

Our four year old Christmas Tree that is a permanent addition and the manger scene that was added



last year round out the display very nicely. We hope to build off the tradition of this event and enhance it for next year.

Anointing of the Sick - Two weekends ago about 286 people received the Sacrament of the Sick after all of the Masses. While we were happy to share the grace of this Sacrament with so many at that time, know that the priests are always available to anoint when needed. If you know you are going in for major surgery either call the parish office or see a priest after Mass if you need to be anointed. If a loved one has become weaker or advanced in illness or has been newly diagnosed do not wait to call for a priest to come and anoint you or a loved one. Recall too that if someone is admitted to the hospital the family has to inform us of that since the hospitals do not share that information because of HIPAA regulations.

PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The November meeting of the Pastoral Council was held on Monday, November 28, 2022 with an opening prayer offered by Father Martin that included a remembrance of Paul Miano who had died on November 21 and had served as a Council member. In attendance were our friars, current council members as well as the newly welcomed members: Dwight Davis, Ronald Levandowsky, Fayne Molloy, Ed Schmitt and Bud Volz. Each of these members will serve on the Pastoral Council for a three-year term. Current council members will begin to leave the council, two at a time over the next three years, creating opportunities for other parishioners to serve.

Guests at the meeting included Jill Conaway, principal of the school, Robin Veronesi, DRE, and Deacon Julio, the Parish Manager. These individuals gave the council an update on the school, religious education program, the financial state of the parish, and newly signed contracts for an electric supplier (63% increase) and snow removal (12% increase). Our school currently educates 254 students while 550 students are enrolled in our religious education program. The parish and school were beginning the process of undergoing the every three-year financial audit that is mandated by the Archdiocese of Hartford. The parish and school continue to maintain fiscal stability.

The future work of the council will include reviewing the recommendations from the Archdiocesan Synod and forming committees to address those initiatives and specific ones as determined by the parish. Our new parishioner orientation program, which is held monthly, continues to welcome new parishioners, and in some cases, students to our school. Father Joe updated the council on the Forward with Faith Campaign as well as the end of the year appeal. Father Joe and Father Michael reviewed the Christmas activity schedule and the status of our Evangelization groups including RCIA, Scripture Studies, Adult Confirmation, Men's Group and the Women of Faith. The closing prayer was offered by Father Michael. The council's next meeting will be held on January 16, 2023.

December 12th - Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

The feast in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe goes back to the 16th century... A poor Indian named Cuauhtlatohuac was baptized and given the name Juan Diego. He was a 57-year-old widower, and lived in a small village near Mexico City. On Saturday morning December 9, 1531, he was on his way to a nearby barrio to attend Mass in



honor of Our Lady. Juan was walking by a hill called Tepeyac when he heard beautiful music like the warbling of birds. A radiant cloud appeared, and within it stood an Indian maiden dressed like an Aztec princess. The lady spoke to him in his own language and sent him to the bishop of Mexico, a Franciscan named Juan de Zumarraga. The bishop was to build a chapel in the place where the lady appeared. Eventually the bishop told Juan to have the lady give him a sign. About this same time Juan's uncle became seriously ill. This led poor Juan to try to avoid the lady. Nevertheless the lady found Juan, assured him that his uncle would recover, and provided roses for Juan to carry to the bishop in his cape or tilma. On December 12, when Juan Diego opened his tilma in the bishop's presence, the roses fell to the ground, and the bishop sank to his knees. On the tilma where the roses had been appeared an image of Mary exactly as she had appeared at the hill of Tepeyac.
