

PASTOR'S COLUMN

"Guest in the house, God in the house" - Next weekend we as a Parish will have the opportunity to welcome many people into God's House. Some will be family and friends of parishioners visiting for Christmas. Others may be those who tend to come to church for the major holidays. I hope some will be someone you have personally invited this week to come to Mass with you; see the next item. And of course last, but not least important, there will be all of you who are here every week. It will be so very good to have each and every person with us. Here are a few simple things that you can do to make all who join us feel a little more at home and welcomed and maybe join us more frequently. 1) Engage people with a friendly smile and a few warm words. 2) When you enter the church, sit in the middle of the pew so people do not have to climb over you to find a place to sit. 3) Greet people at the beginning of Mass. Even offer a nod or smile as people enter your pew. 4) At the sign of peace, say your name and ask them theirs, and use it at the end of Mass to say good-bye.

Invite Someone to Join You for Christmas Mass - The Christmas schedule of Masses is on page 4. You should have received a letter in the mail with the schedule as well. This letter went out to everyone for whom we have a valid address. If you have a family member or friend who has been away from the Church, consider inviting them to attend Mass with you. If they take you up on your offer invite them to join you again.

Christmas Concert/Live Nativity (Greccio) on Dec. 18th – Step back for an hour or so from the hectic pace of this season and join us for our Christmas Concert and a re-enactment of the first Christmas on Sunday evening at 5:00pm in St. Paul Church. Help set the tone for the most important part of this week as we meditate on the Birth of Jesus and lift up our hearts in songs that are filled with the joy and hope that the Christmas season brings us. You will also be supporting our youth and adult choirs who have been working hard to prepare for this night.

Confessions Prior to Christmas - "Mercy will always be greater than any sin, and no one can place limits on the love of God who is ever ready to forgive." - Misericordiae Vultus Our final Mercy Monday before Christmas will be held on December 19. Four confessors will be available from 7pm to 8pm (or until all have confessed). It is for this that Jesus humbled himself to come to earth to be our Savior. Confessions will be heard on Saturday morning, Dec. 24 from 8:30 to 9:30am. Confessions will NOT be heard on the afternoon of Christmas Eve.

Blessing for Your Home Nativity Scene - I hope all families have a manger scene in their home. It was St. Francis who started this custom in Greccio, Italy in 1223 and which I refer to above. I encourage you to gather as a family, or as an individual, and pray the following blessing before your manger scene.

God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have made known your love: when our need for a Savior was great you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary. To our lives he brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love.

Lord, bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise up our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Savior of all. We pray that Jesus, Mary, and Joseph will guide, love, and protect our family. We make this prayer in Jesus' name. Amen.

Parish Center Holiday Schedule - The Parish Center will be open as usual this week but will be closed on Monday, December 26 and Monday, January 2.

Christmas Memorials - The Christmas Memorials will be included in the bulletin next week. If you missed the Dec. 9 deadline, a supplemental list will be printed in January.

Audits - Every three years, by Archdiocesan policy, parishes and schools undergo an outside audit. Our last audit was in 2019. The auditors were here for parts of two weeks and finished their work on December 9. There is a lot of prep work that has to be done to make reports and materials available to them before they arrive and while they are here. It is good that we have such a qualified Parish Manager in Deacon Julio. When they send their reports they will be shared with the Trustees and Financial Councils of the School and Parish.


