

## January 8, 2023 The Epiphany of the Lord

### **PASTOR'S COLUMN**

**Pope Benedict XVI** - On New Year's Eve, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI was called home to the Lord in the 95<sup>th</sup> year of his life after having served His Lord and Savior as a priest for 71 years, a bishop for 45 years, a cardinal for 27 years, pope for nearly 8 years and pope emeritus for nearly 10 years. I invite you to pray the prayer that follows for the repose of the soul of Pope Benedict XVI.

Father, eternal shepherd, hear the prayers of your people for your servant Benedict, who governed your Church with love. In your mercy, bring him with the flock once entrusted to his care to the reward you have promised your faithful servants.

May he who faithfully administered the mysteries of your forgiveness and love on earth, rejoice with you for ever in heaven. In your wise and loving care, you made your servant teacher of all your Church. He did the work of Christ on earth. May your Son welcome him into eternal glory. May your servant whom you appointed high priest of your flock be counted now among the priests in the life of your kingdom. Give your servant the reward of eternal happiness and let your mercy win for us the gift of your life and love. We entrust your servant to your mercy with faith and confidence. In the human family he was an instrument of your peace and love. May he rejoice in those gifts for ever with your saints. Through Christ our Lord, Amen.

Epiphany and the Christmas Season - Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The word epiphany comes from the Greek and means "to reveal" or make manifest or show. God makes known to us that Jesus is His son. Our Feast today celebrates the manifestation of Jesus to the three Magi as related in St. Matthew's Gospel. However, Epiphany originally celebrated four different events: the Baptism of the Lord; Christ's first miracle, the changing of water into wine at the wedding in Cana; the Nativity of Christ; and the visitation of the Magi. Each of these is a revelation of God to us: At Jesus' Baptism (which we will celebrate this year on Monday), the Holy Spirit descends and the voice of God the Father is heard declaring, 'This is my beloved Son, listen to him'; at the wedding in Cana, the miracle reveals Jesus' divinity; at the Nativity, the angels bear witness to Christ, and the shepherds, representing the people of Israel, bow down before Him; and at the visitation of the Magi, Jesus' divinity is revealed to the Gentiles-the other nations of the earth.

**Baptism of the Lord -** As I mentioned last week because Christmas fell on a Sunday, the Feast of the Holy Family got bumped to a weekday, December 30<sup>th</sup>, and the other feast affected is the Baptism of the Lord. Normally, the Sunday after the Feast of the Epiphany is the Baptism of the Lord, but this year it will be celebrated tomorrow. When you come to church next weekend we will be back to ordinary time and the Christmas season will be finished. The Feast of the Baptism

of the Lord is a good moment for all of us to consider anew the meaning of our baptisms and our call to be disciples and followers of the Lord. For those who can be more active it is a good moment to consider how God might be calling you to use your gifts and talents for the benefit of His people both in the context of parish ministries as well as in the broader community. Maybe it is something for you to pray over this week.

Veteran and New Lectors (Readers) and Eucharistic Ministers We will hold an afternoon of reflection and training for all current Readers (Lectors) and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) and those who would like to join these ministries on Sunday, February 19 from 1:15 to 5:00 p.m. Because of COVID it has been three years since we had an updating for our current ministers. I hope that more parishioners will answer the Lord's call to serve Him and the parish through these ministries. See page 7 for the qualifications and more information about the schedule for the day.

Thank You for Helping!! - The Christmas Masses were very well attended with over 2,000 people present. While it was bitterly cold and windy, that is all it was, especially compared to other parts of the country. These special celebrations always require extra hands to make it all work and parishioners willing to modify their schedules to help us out. Thanks to all who served as Ushers and Greeters, Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC), and as altar servers. Special thanks to all of our ministers of music, including the choir, led by Jeff Batter and all of our regular cantors. Jeff did so while flying back and forth from California as his stepfather was in the last days of his earthly life. Cheryl Kramer-Tierney led our fledgling youth choir. Deacon Don helped to coordinate our Ushers and Greeters. Thanks to Jeff Batter who does the same with Lectors and Gloria Janik who does so for the EMHC for assuring that everyone is in place for all of the Masses. The good work was done with the help of all of these leaders, but none of it happens if there are not fellow parishioners who are willing to serve. Thank you to each and every person who helped in any way to help us give glory and honor to God and celebrate the new born Savior's birth!!

Thank you from the Friars - In the name of all of the Friars, thank you very much for the kind remembrances of food, libations, gift certificates, and most especially your prayers and well wishes for Christmas. We are all blessed to minister here and thank you for all of your many kindnesses!

**Christmas Collection-** I would like to highlight, acknowledge and give thanks to everyone who made a special monetary gift to the parish through your Christmas offering! The in-pew collection was (\$21,695.25). When the online donations (\$1,890) and the donations dropped off at the office or sent through the mail (\$9,753) are included, the total for the Christmas collection, as of Jan. 2, is \$33,338.25. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. ### LECTORS AND EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS St. Paul Parish is currently inviting parishioners to consider serving as a Reader or Extraordinary Minister

of Holy Communion (EMHC) at Mass. There will be a day of reflection and training session for new members of these ministries on Sunday, February 19 from 1:15 to 5:15 pm in the St. Paul Church Hall. Those currently serving in these ministries will participate in this program as well. Candidates for these ministries must meet the qualifications noted below. If you are interested in being an EMHC or Reader, please contact Fr. Joe or the parish office so that you can secure the permission needed to attend the program on February 19th.

EMHC are properly formed, instructed and commissioned lay persons who are appointed for a given parish community to aid in the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass and to the sick and homebound when ordinary ministers of Holy Communion are unavailable.

Readers (Lectors) are lay persons commissioned to proclaim the readings from Sacred Scripture at Mass, not including the Gospel. Readers should possess the skills necessary for effective oral proclamation which is essential for this ministry.

Qualifications for EMHC and Readers: The Archbishop of Hartford regulates the ministry of EMHC and Readers in collaboration with the pastors of the parishes of the Archdiocese. EMHC and Readers are to meet the following qualifications:

- 1. Be at least 17 years of age
- 2. Have received the Sacrament of Confirmation
- 3. Have a continuing relationship with the parish and regularly participate in the Eucharist, that is attend Mass each weekend.
- 4. Strives to live a life consistent with the teachings of the **Catholic Church**
- 5. If married, are in a valid Catholic marriage
- 6. Have the Pastor's permission
- 7. Complete an online Virtus Training session
- 8. Readers must possess the skills needed for effective oral proclamation

What follows is a ceremony and blessing that you can use in your own homes.

- 1. Start with a Christmas Carol
- 2. Read from the Bible about the visit of the Magi in Matthew 2: 1 12.
- 3. Then the leader prays: The three Wise Men Casper, Melchior, and Balthazar journeyed to Bethlehem to find the Christ Child, and followed the star of God's Son, who became man. May the peace of Christ rest in our home. May our home be a dwelling of the Lord's mercy, love, joy, peace, and forgiveness. May all who enter our home experience Jesus Christ in all that we say and do throughout this New Year. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
- 4. A member of the family marks the doorpost of the primary entry points of the house with chalk 20+C+M+B+23.
- 5. Close the ceremony with another Christmas Carol.

## The meaning of the doorpost markings 20+C+M+B+23

The letters are the initials of the traditional names of the three Magi: Casper, Melchior, and Balthazar. These letters also abbreviate the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless the house." And of course, the beginning and ending numbers are the year. If you would like one of the Friars to come to bless your house, call the parish office to set that up or contact one of us directly.

## BAPTISM OF THE LORD—JANUARY 9TH

Excerpt from The Baptism of the Lord: From The Jordan To Life In The Spirit from CatholicLink <u>https://catholic-link.org/feast-baptism-our-lord</u>

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains how there are five fruits of Baptism in paragraphs 1262-1274. As the Baptized, we can look at these "fruits" and "graces" to recommit ourselves to the core of our lives, that is, becoming, being, and living as authentic disciples of Jesus Christ.

### The 5 Fruits Of Baptism

1. In Baptism, all sin (both original and personal) is forgiven. After Baptism, committed mortal, serious sins must be confessed. Through Baptism, we "put on Christ" (Gal 3:27) and choose His way. Does our "white garment" remain clean? Do we wrestle with temptation and seek to persevere in holiness? Do our lives reflect the sanctity and purity of Jesus Christ? 2. Baptism makes us a new creature, that is, a Child of God, member of Christ (and co-heir with Him), and a temple of the Holy Spirit. If our Baptism has made us new, are we choosing to live and walk as temples of the Holy Spirit in the light of Christ? As a "new creature," we're given the gift of grace, participation in the life of God (CCC 1997). We are given the virtues of faith, hope, and love, the ability to live in the Holy Spirit, and the ability to grow in goodness. Do we choose to live as an "old creature," or as a Child of God, who is created, redeemed, and sanctified by Jesus?

3. Baptism makes us members of the Body of Christ, the Church. No longer are we alone, but we are united to Jesus and His People, a Body that transcends time, place, and nation. Through Baptism, we become "priests" to offer our sufferings, vocations, work, families, and friendships to God. We become "prophets" to proclaim the Word of God by our lives, words, and deeds. We become "kings" to lead others to Jesus, to truly love (be charitable), and provide for those in need. How can we recommit our-

#### selves to living as Jesus' priests, prophets, and kings? 4. *Baptism brings us into communion with Christians*. Through Baptism, we share a bond of unity with all those who bear the name Christian, including those who are not yet in full communion with Jesus' Catholic Church. Mindful of this, we can pray for greater Christian unity; that all of Jesus' disciples might be fully united in His true Church as one flock with one shepherd. How do we recognize our common bonds with fellow Christians? Do we sincerely live the Catholic life to witness the Gospel and foster greater communion in Jesus' Church?

5. Baptism configures us to Christ, claims us as Christ's own,

and indelibly marks us. Once we are Baptized, we receive an indelible spiritual mark, a "character" on our soul. This seal of the Christian life can never be erased, even if or when falling into sin. Do we strive to proclaim Jesus Christ as our God, our Lord, and our Savior? We have been marked as His forever. Do we believe in Him, all He has revealed, and all that the Church poses for our belief? Do we long for Heaven as our ultimate happiness and trust in Christ's promises to attain it? Do we love God above all things and love our neighbor as ourself for love of God?

Jesus' public ministry didn't stop at the waters of the Jordan. Rather, he moved from the waters into His public ministry.... He preached the Gospel of the Kingdom, cured disease among all people, cast out demons, taught the truth, and brought unity (in the truth) to a divided people in a very specific time. Like Jesus, on the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord, we are reminded that we too truly are called to recommit ourselves to our Christian identity. We are called to move from the water to life in the Spirit each and every day of our lives.
