> Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

PASTOR'S COLUMN

National Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children - Fifty years ago on January 22, 1973 the Supreme Court legalized abortion throughout the United States in its companion decisions *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton*. Since that time, millions of children have lost their lives, and millions of women and families have been wounded by abortion.

On June 24, 2022, the *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* decision overturned *Roe v. Wade*, returning the matter to state legislatures. While the Dobbs decision ended the nearly fifty-year nationwide regime of abortion on demand, in many instances state and federal laws are still hostile to pre-born children. That is very much the situation in Connecticut and so great prayer and advocacy is still very much needed.

In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday like it does this year) is to be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. Much like Ash Wednesday and Good Friday we are called to observe this day with penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms. So treat this Monday like you would Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by fasting and having only one full meal and two smaller ones, or donate to a place that supports women who bring their unborn children to birth and offer up those sacrifices for the defense of all human life from womb to tomb.

The Connecticut March for Life will be held on Wednesday, March 22, 2023 in Hartford. With the Dobbs decision, efforts for the protection of pre-born life are being focused locally. "Our message of love for unborn children and their mothers will be heard by every member of the legislature as they come to Hartford that day during the legislative session." There will be a rally at the Capitol at Noon followed by the March for Life around Bushnell Park. More information on the CT March for Life can be found at

The Word of God Sunday - "When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself speaks to his people, and Christ, present in his word, proclaims the Gospel" (GIRM, no. 29).

In 2019 Pope Francis instituted the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time (today) as "Word of God Sunday" to highlight and bring to the forefront of our minds the importance to know, study and reflect on Sacred Scripture, the Old and New Testaments, the Word of God. St. Jerome, the great biblical scholar said, "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ." We can encounter or engage Sacred Scripture in different ways. The most obvious is at each Mass. The structure of the Mass is divided into the Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist. It is in the first part that we hear the Word of God proclaimed. Pope John Paul II suggested in his Instruction Dies Domini (The Lord's Day) concerning the Sunday readings: those who take part in the Eucharist should reflect beforehand upon the word of God which will be proclaimed. He adds that if we do not, "it is difficult for the liturgical proclamation of the word of God alone to produce the fruit we might expect" (no. 40). You can do that by making an effort to read that week's scripture readings BEFORE coming to Mass. Some parishioners have personal subscriptions to Magnificat. or The Word Among Us, or other similar publications, but the readings are also available online for free. I think the most convenient site is www.usccb.org/readings/ which brings you to each day's readings. (A link to this site is also posted on the home page of our parish website.) By doing this, it is a bit like tilling the soil in your garden before you plant some seeds. In this case, you prepare your soul to receive the Word of God. Beginning with today's bulletin, the readings for the FOLLOWING Sunday will be listed.

Another great way to engage The Word of God is to join our parish Scripture Study Group. Their next series of meetings will begin the week of March 12 and will meet for five (5) sessions concluding in mid-May. There will not be any sessions Holy Week or Easter Week. In these sessions they will delve into the second half of the Book of Genesis. You need not have participated in the sessions that covered the first half of the Book of Genesis to join these sessions. More information will follow in the coming weeks, but you and always contact Mark Chasse, who gives leadership to the Scripture Study Group, for more information at mchasse1@comcast.net.

Stronger Together - The 2022 Archbishop's Annual Appeal (AAA), *Stronger Together*, concluded on December 31. The total pledges and donations from 571 St. Paul parishioners in 2022 was \$122,750.61!! This was 113% of our parish goal of \$108,000! The average gift was \$215. I offer a special nod to the 30 parishioners who made a gift to the AAA for the first time and to the 57 who renewed their giving last year after not making a gift in 2021. At the same time, 103 parishioners who made a gift in 2021 did not last year. Situations in life are always changing so this type of fluctuation is to be expected. The bottom line is that you, the parishioners of St. Paul Parish, were very generous once again last year!! Overall the 2022 AAA raised over \$9,141,000 toward its goal of \$10 million. Thank you to everyone who made a donation and may the Lord bless you for your generosity!



Readers (Lectors) are lay persons commissioned to proclaim the readings from Sacred Scripture at Mass, not including the Gospel. Readers should possess the skills necessary for effective oral proclamation which is essential for this ministry.

Qualifications for EMHC and Readers: The Archbishop of Hartford regulates the ministry of EMHC and Readers in collaboration with the pastors of the parishes of the Archdiocese. EMHC and Readers are to meet the following qualifications:

- 1. Be at least 17 years of age
- 2. Have received the Sacrament of Confirmation
- 3. Have a continuing relationship with the parish and regularly participate in the Eucharist, that is attend Mass each weekend.
- 4. Strives to live a life consistent with the teachings of the **Catholic Church**
- 5. If married, are in a valid Catholic marriage
- 6. Have the Pastor's permission
- 7. Complete an online Virtus Training session
- 8. Readers must possess the skills needed for effective oral proclamation


