

PASTOR'S COLUMN

World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life - Since its institution in 1997 by St. Pope John Paul II, the first Sunday in February celebrates and prays for those women and men who have dedicated themselves to God in a particular way through the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience while living as members of a religious community. By virtue of our Baptisms, all people are called to a live a life of holiness. Those who answer God's call to consecrated life as a priest, sister or brother do so in a particular way following in the footsteps of Jesus, but also the founder of their religious community. The Franciscan Friars who serve here at St. Paul's are one example of such a religious community of men. There are also many communities of religious sisters like the Sisters of Mercy, Felician Sisters, Little Sisters of the Poor, Sisters of Mercy, Srs. of St. Joseph, etc. There are literally hundreds of different men and women religious communities. While the spirituality of the founder of the religious community will be different for each group what is common are the three vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. (By the way, that is why there are three knots on the cords that the Friars wear around their waste.) What do the vows mean?

- 1. *Poverty* is a call to share all goods in common, live a simple life, and depend totally on God.
- 2. *Chastity* is a call to love and serve God and all God's people, rather than to love one person exclusively in marriage. A life of chastity is a witness and testimony to God's love.
- 3. Obedience is a call to live in community and to surrender one's own will to the will of God. In community, religious are called to listen to their superiors and the voice within to discern God's call for their life.

Inserted in this bulletin is information about the Friars who serve at St. Paul's. Those who might feel the Lord calling them to a vocation as a priest, brother or sister are also encouraged to speak with one of the Friars.

The World Day of Prayer is also a good reminder for all of us to pray that those young men and women who God is calling today to live a life dedicated to him as a sister, brother or priest might respond generously to the Lord's call. It is also a good time to remember the important role that families have in nurturing religious vocations. Overwhelmingly those who respond to the Lord's call speak of the support or affirmation they received from friends, relatives and fellow parishioners. If you sincerely think someone would be a good member of a religious community do not be afraid to share that with them. If they have made their intention known a simple word of encouragement can go a long way. If they have not, but you think that they possess the qualities that are needed just share with them why you think that to be the case. I invite you to pray the following prayer as well.

Prayer for Consecrated Persons and for Vocations to Religious Life

God our Father, we thank you for calling men and women to serve you as sisters, brothers and priests. Renew their knowledge and love of you, and send your Holy Spirit to help them respond generously and courageously to your call. Continue to call more young women and men to serve you. Fill them with your Spirit so that they will hear and answer your call to service in your Church as a Consecrated Religious. We make our prayer through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Seeking New Lectors (Readers) and Eucharistic Ministers

Those who are interested in becoming a Reader or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC) the next training session will be Sunday afternoon, February 19th beginning with a light lunch at 1:15 p.m. and ending by 5:30 p.m. Those wishing to be an EMHC or Reader should be at least 17 years old, be Confirmed, and of sufficient Christian maturity with a definite continuing relationship to the parish including regular (weekly) participation in the Eucharist. Those who would like to be a Reader (Lector) should possess the skills necessary for effective oral proclamation which is essential for this ministry. If you are interested in being a EMHC or Reader please contact Fr. Joe or the parish office so that you can fill out a registration form and secure the permission needed to attend the program on February 19th. The deadline to register is Monday, February 11th so that we can plan for food and materials for the day. All current EMHC and Readers should attend as this will also serve as your renewal of your commissioning in these ministries that the Archdiocese requires every three years.

Blessing of Throats after Masses This Weekend - February 3rd was the Feast of St. Blaise and as noted last week in this space we will bless throats after all of the Masses this weekend. See last week's bulletin if you need more information about St. Blaise and why we bless throats in association with his feast day.

World Marriage Day - Next Sunday, in that it is the 2nd Sunday in February, is World Marriage Day. The 9:00 a.m. Mass intention will be for all married couples in the parish. We will impart a special blessing for all married couples at all of the Masses next weekend.

What to do with Old Palms? - You may bring your old palms to church the next two weekends so that they can be burnt and used for ashes on Ash Wednesday. Just leave them in the vestibules before coming into the church itself. You may also burn them on your own and put them in your garden or a flower bed, but since the palms are blessed, they should **not** be discarded in the trash.

Adult Confirmation-Six Session Program begins March 16th

Are you an adult who never received the Sacrament of Confirmation? – If so, St. Paul's Adult Confirmation Program (ACP) will prepare you to be Confirmed in the Spring of 2023. The reception of all of the Sacraments is about helping us journey through this life to life eternal. The Sacrament of Confirmation is a confirming and strengthening of our Baptisms. Through the Sacrament you are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and Confirmation provides additional graces to help us live out our adult lives as faithful followers of Jesus and strengthens our bond with the Church. Those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. Likewise, those to be married in the Catholic Church should be Confirmed. St. Paul Parish is implementing this six (6) session ACP so that those adult Catholics who were never Confirmed can be fully initiated in the Catholic faith.

Catholics who are at least 18 years old and have already been baptized and received their 1st Holy Communion may participate in the ACP. If married, you must be in a valid Catholic marriage. If you were married outside the Catholic Church (meaning in a civil ceremony or in a non-Catholic Church without the appropriate permission) and would like to discuss how you can have your marriage recognized in the Church contact one of the Friarpriests and they will be happy to discuss with you your situation. Your preparation for Confirmation can be done simultaneously with the preparation to have your marriage convalidated in the Church, but the convalidation must be concluded before the actual Confirmation ceremony. Generally speaking, this can often be accomplished.

There is no monetary cost for the program. To register, email Dan Tome at d.tome@stpaulkensington.org or call the parish office at 860-828-0331 and ask for Dan or complete our simple online form at https://stpaulkensington.org/adult-confirmation-rcia Registration deadline is March 6. Once we know how many are interested, we will work out the details of the program. If you have any questions do not hesitate to contact Dan or one of the Friars. If you know of a family member or friend who has not been Confirmed, please share this information with them.

PRESENTATION OF THE GIFTS We have resumed the practice of having parishioners present the bread and wine during the Offertory. Those who have made the offering for the intention for each Mass are invited to present the gifts for that Mass. If they would like to do so, they should arrive at least ten minutes before the scheduled start time of the Mass and go to the sacristy to let the sacristan know that you would like to bring up the gifts. If no one comes forward by that time, other parishioners will be invited to bring up the gifts for that Mass. The exception will be the Children's Masses where students will always bring up the gifts.

The bread and wine are placed on the shelf attached to the front pew of each wing. The gifts are placed on whichever side of the church that the priest and servers enter from each weekend.


