

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Second and Third Scrutiny - Our three Elect, Myreon Colon, Jeffrey Kemper and Angelica Rodriquez will participate in the Rite for the Second Scrutiny this week at the 9 am Mass and the Third Scrutiny next week at the 10:30 am Mass. In the bulletin last week was an explanation of the Scrutinies and the Rite that accompanies them. Please continue to pray for them as they prepare to receive all of the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil as well as our Candidate Alex Dionne who will be Confirmed and receive his 1st Holy Communion at the same time. There will also be four youth baptisms and a number of Profession of Faiths and 1st Communions.

10th Anniversary of the Installation of Pope Francis - Ten years ago today, on March 19, 2013 Cardinal Jorge Bergoglio, Archbishop of Buenos Aires, Argentina at the age of 76 was Installed as Pope following his election on March 13, 2013. He was the first Jesuit to ever be elected Pope, the first American, and the first to take the name Francis doing so in recognition of St. Francis of Assisi and his love and care for the poor. On the day he was elected he bowed humbly to the people below in St. Peter's Square from the balcony he stood on and asked them to pray for him. He is in no less need of those prayers today and so we pray for him. O God, shepherd and ruler of all the faithful, look favorably on your servant Francis, whom you have set at the head of your Church as her shepherd: Grant that by word and example he may be of service to those over whom he presides so that, together with the flock entrusted to his care, he may come to everlasting life. Amen.

Laetare Sunday - This fourth Sunday of Lent is known as *Laetare*, Rejoice, Sunday. At this half way point of Lent we recall that on Ash Wednesday we were reminded of our mortality, "Remember that you are dust, and unto dust you shall return" and to prepare ourselves one day to meet our maker we were called to "Repent and believe in the Gospel." All of our prayers, fasting and almsgiving are meant to turn our hearts and souls more fully to God. An integral part of that turning is admitting, repenting and confessing our sins so as to receive an abundance of God's mercy. This thought leads me into the next item.

Lent & Forgiveness - There is nothing more central to our journey through Lent then to remember why the Lord Jesus suffered and died on the Cross, the forgiveness of our sins. Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the forgiveness of our sins and to draw us into a deeper relationship with Himself. Over the last 34 years, and counting, when hearing confessions, there is always a special joy I feel when someone comes in and says it has been 5, 12, 26, 40+ years since their last confession. My first response always begins with, "Welcome Back." While the reasons vary why someone has been away from the Sacrament, all that is important at that point is that the person is there now. Some times it might be someone who goes to church regularly, but got out of the practice of going to confession. Others thought they could just take care of their sins between them and God, for others the weightiness of what they are confessing has held them back, for others when they were going to confession it was the same sins all the time and they felt like a hypocrite, still others because they had lost a sense of sin in their lives, for others there had been a bad experience in confession, and the variety goes on. The experience will be different for each, but with the words of absolution from the priest they know their God loves them and has forgiven them. They have been drawn closer to God. *Be merciful, O Lord, for I have sinned.* See page 8 for our regular confession times as well as Mercy Mondays during Lent. Come and be welcomed back!

Happy St. Joseph's Day - Normally the Feast of St. Joseph is celebrated on March 19th, but it is a Sunday in Lent this year so the Church moves the Feast to Monday, March 20th. St. Joseph is symbolized by carpenters' tools and the lily, and is usually represented in art holding the Baby Jesus. He is the patron of the Universal Church, fathers, a holy (happy) death, carpenters, and workers. In that St. Joseph's Day is a Solemnity you can have a free day from your Lenten practices!

Prayer to St. Joseph

"Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen."

I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will never die.

Gospel: Jn 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45

The sisters of Lazarus sent word to Jesus, saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." He became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?" So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him. "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice. "Lazarus. come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go." Now many of the Jews who had come to Marv and seen what he had done began to believe in him.


