





Holy Week is Next Week - Included in this bulletin on page 7 is our complete schedule for Holy Week beginning with Palm Sunday. We will follow our regular Sunday schedule next weekend and palms will be distributed at all Masses.

Life is often filled with routine and busyness. If we allow that busyness to dictate our lives we can often miss out on important moments. I encourage you to look over the Holy Week schedule carefully and plan now to enter into this very special time of prayer and reflection. May it be an opportunity to receive God's grace and be drawn deeper into the Paschal Mystery of the Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

Mercy Mondays - We have two Mercy Mondays left this Lent. The Friars will be available this Monday and next to hear confessions from 7pm to 8pm. *I remind you that we also hear confessions every Saturday from 8:30 to 9:30am and then again from 3:00 to 4:00pm.* On the Mercy Mondays we also have Eucharistic Adoration. Come and spend some time in prayer.

St. Joseph Archdiocesan Medal of Appreciation - Last Sunday, March 19th at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford Archbishop Blair presided over the Archdiocese's annual conferral of the St. Joseph Medal of Appreciation. Each parish in the Archdiocese is invited to nominate an individual or a married couple over the age of 50 from among the laity who have given particular devotion and service to the parish over a number of years. Among the 118 recipients from 88 different parishes this year was our own Rosalind "Roz" Durante. A parish like ours is blessed with dedicated volun-



teers who help in so many ways. Some are willing to take on leadership positions and are thus very visible to the parish. On the other hand, we are blessed too with those who do not see themselves having those kind of gifts, but are very willing to work quietly behind the scenes. Roz falls into this latter category. Never wanting to be noticed Roz, who has been a parishioner for over 50 years, serves very gently and kindly. Prior

to Roz's husband's death in 2009, she had already been involved in some parish activities and organizations like the Ladies' Guild and Rosary Makers. It was after Vince's death that she became a more active volunteer. Up until the onset of COVID she was a volunteer in the school for over ten years reading to children twice a week. She did so undeterred by

their generous sharing of their germs! At the same time, she also volunteered in the Parish Center as she continues to do to this day. She is always willing to switch her schedule to meet the needs of the parish and others also working and volunteering in the office. Roz is always so very kind and understanding on the phone and with those who come to the office. She is a sweetheart! When I came in the office the day after she received the letter from the Archbishop informing her of the recognition I got this look from her that said "Why did you go and do that?" which is all the more reason why Roz is so deserving! She felt a bit better when I said she was representing the many others who also very humbly and behind the scenes give service to the parish and I meant that sincerely. Proposed Amendment to the CT State Constitution -If proposed legislation passes out of the State Legislature this session would you vote for the following Amendment to the Connecticut State Constitution? "Shall the Constitution of the State be amended to recognize a right to individual privacy and to prohibit the state from infringing such right without showing a compelling state interest?" You might say sure, but ask do I not already have the right to individual privacy in the State Constitution? Surely we do, so we have to go to the actual wording in Joint Resolution 42 to find out what this amendment is really about. "The right of individual privacy is essential to the well-being of a free society and shall not be infringed without the showing of a compelling state interest. Such right shall include, but not be limited to, the fundamental right to reproductive freedom, including, but not limited to, the ability to make and effectuate decisions to prevent, continue or end one's own pregnancy. The state may not, directly or indirectly, deny, burden or abridge such right unless justified by a compelling state interest achieved by the least restrictive means." So now we know that the proposed amendment is really about unfettered and total access to an abortion at anytime during the pregnancy. So in a state that has some of the most wide ranging pro abortion laws already, this proposed Amendment to the Constitution wants there to be no limits.



TECH UPDATE

A few weeks ago, the Technology Advisory Committee provided insight into a \$67,000 investment to advance our technology capabilities throughout the Parish. We are

pleased to report this project has been completed with our expected results! Outdated computer equipment has been upgraded in the School, Parish Center, Friary, and Church with current technology. As a result of this investment our teachers, students, parish staff, Friars, and various ministries now have access to faster internet access and expanded WiFi capabilities. Although most of this new technology is not visible, you may notice a few round, white pieces of equipment with a blue light on the wall in each section of the church and on the light pole near the Gazebo. Over 50 "devices" of this type were installed throughout the campus to provide secure wireless access as needed. These devices are connected to the equipment you cannot see to provide the improved capabilities.

Now that this project is complete, we will be looking at the age of personal computers in place throughout the Parish and the software programs these computers access daily. The goal of this next step is to further improve the technology capabilities for our teachers, students, parish staff, Friars, and various ministries as well as increasing the security of the Parish computer network.

PASTOR'S COLUMN (continued)

Should not the state have a greater compelling interest in the protection of human life? I think it should. I also think a compelling state interest should be honesty when proposing legislation and especially when proposing an amendment to the State Constitution.

In addition to this attempt to amend the State Constitution, there are two other pieces of legislation that do not uphold the value and dignity of every human life. More aggressively than ever, legislation is proposed (SB 1076) that would allow for physician assisted suicide in the state. Our Culture of Life Ministry will host a guest speaker, Peter Wolfgang, on the topic of Physician Assisted Suicide on Monday, May 1 at 6:30 pm. In another piece of legislation (HB 6618), the state would set aside \$2,000,000 dollars for funding the procurement of abortions by women from outside of the state. His Sacrifice, and ours! - As of March 20th, 178 of our parishioners have made donations and pledges totaling \$38,317 towards this year's Archbishop's Annual Appeal which is 35% of our \$108,000 goal. Please remember all gifts, no matter the amount, are important and helpful!

St. Paul Church Sound System and Live Streaming - More substantial work for the implementation of the new sound system was scheduled to begin this past Wednesday with wiring being pulled for the new speakers. In the meantime, the aches and pains of the old system continue to be heard or not heard. Recall that patience is a virtue! Those who regularly make use of the live streaming are also noticing issues. Recall too that this system is in the process of being updated as well and will be addressed when the sound system is completed.

Technology Update - I am happy to report that our technology upgrades are moving along very well. Please read the summary of progress prepared by Chuck Tencza, the chair of our Technology Advisory Committee on this page.

Final Thoughts - As we prepare for Holy Week next week, let us all the more set some extra time aside for the Lord and plan for how we will truly make the week Holy for ourselves. The NCAA Tournament once again is providing good games and some notable upsets. As I write this my brackets are not completely busted with my projected champions, Alabama and UCLA, still alive. Huskie fans can be very proud with both the men and women in the Sweet 16. Tennessee, UCLA and Miami also have both their men and women in the Sweet 16. Opening Day is Thursday. Lots of changes this year with a

pitch clock, no shifts, larger bases, so we will see how this all plays out. In the end it will be pitching and defense. Have a blessed week everyone!


