



Holy Week - The Church's Liturgies of the last three days of Holy Week, known as the Sacred Triduum, are the touch stone of our faith. They reveal fully God's love for us through the Paschal Mystery that is the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. These are also days for us to show how deeply committed we are to Christ. Through our active participation in the beauty and uniqueness of the Church's Liturgies of these three days we embark on a spiritual pilgrimage. I invite you to join together for these most beautiful and solemn liturgies.

Chrism Mass - In addition to the Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil Liturgies, another Holy Week Liturgy that you may be less familiar with is the Chrism Mass. In Rome and in every (arch)diocese throughout the world, the local bishop, will celebrate the Chrism Mass. Traditionally the Chrism Mass was held in the morning on Holy Thursday. While that is still the case in some places, more often it is held earlier during Holy Week for practical reasons. In the Archdiocese of Hartford, Archbishop Leonard Blair will celebrate the Chrism Mass on Tuesday, April 4th at 11:00 a.m. at the Cathedral of St. Joseph. All are welcome to attend. Our St. Paul middle school students will be in attendance.

The Chrism Mass gathers the faithful of the diocese at their mother church with their shepherd at which time the three oils used during the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Anointing of the Sick and Holy Orders are blessed or consecrated, in the case of the Chrism, and then distributed to all of the parishes in the diocese. Since the bishop is the only minister in the diocese who may consecrate chrism, this Mass highlights his ministry and our union with him. While he will not be able to baptize and confirm every person in the diocese, nonetheless he will be symbolically present in the Chrism which the priests and deacons will use. When the oils are brought back to the parish they are placed in dignified containers and stored near the baptismal font in an ambry. At St. Paul the ambry is on the pillar near the statue of Mary.

In recent years, the Chrism Mass has also acknowledged the ministry of priests since it was at the Last Supper that Jesus instituted the Sacrament of Holy Orders. The priests renew their commitment of service at the Chrism Mass. Please pray for your priests currently assigned here and all those who have served at Sacred Heart and St. Paul in the past.

Holy Thursday - At this evening Mass, which begins at 7pm, we celebrate the Lord's Last Supper and Jesus' institution of two Sacraments, Eucharist and Holy Orders. Intertwined deeply in the meaning of both of these Sacraments is Jesus' great mandate, that as He had washed the feet of the Apostles, so too were they to do. We are all called to serve rather than be served. This liturgy includes a re-enactment of the washing of feet of the Apostles. The oils that were blessed

and consecrated at the Chrism Mass will be brought up in procession. Following the meal, Jesus went off to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray and took three apostles with himself. At the end of our Holy Thursday Liturgy, we will process with the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose. You are invited to remain and pray in adoration and thanksgiving before the Blessed Sacrament so as to meditate on this extraordinary and incomparable mystery of love. At St. Paul we shall keep company with the Lord until 10pm when we will pray Night Prayer together which will take about 5 minutes.

On **Good Friday**, the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion will begin at 3:00pm. The Liturgy this day is so very different. The altar was stripped bare after the Mass of the Last Supper, and the tabernacle is empty. The Good Friday Liturgy has three parts beginning with the Liturgy of the Word which includes the account of the Passion from St. John's Gospel and concludes with petitions for all believers and non-believers. Then in the 2nd part all are invited to venerate the Cross, the extraordinary symbol of divine mercy. The Cross of Christ is lifted up before the world as a banner of hope for all who in faith welcome its mystery into their lives. In the last part Holy Communion is distributed from hosts consecrated the night before since no Masses are celebrated on Good Friday. At 7:00pm **Stations of the Cross** will be celebrated at St. Paul Church.

On **Holy Saturday**, the Church vigilantly watches silently at the tomb and reflects on the death of the Lord and the pain, loneliness and discouragement that so often accompany death. We think of Mary who saw her son crucified and buried.

On Holy Saturday night during the solemn Easter Vigil, "the mother of all vigils", which begins at 8pm, the silence will be broken and the mood changes with the joyful song, "Exsultet, "Rejoice!" The Easter Vigil begins in darkness; a fire is lit and blessed; the Paschal Candle is marked and lit; tapers are lit and passed and we will pass from darkness into light. Once again the victory of Light over darkness, of Life over death, will be proclaimed and the Church will rejoice in meeting her Risen Lord. Christ's triumph over death will be proclaimed and the promise of everlasting life springs eternal. During the Easter Vigil Myreon Colon, Jeffrey Kemper and Angelica Rodriquez, who have been in our RCIA program since October, will receive all three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion) while Alexander Dionne, who has also been in the RCIA program. will receive the Sacraments Confirmation and Holy Communion. In addition, the following students will receive one or more of the Sacraments of Initiation: Anaiya Colon (4) years old) Gavin Douglas (Grade 2) and Lylianna McBriarty (Grade 3) will be baptized; Tyler Ciaffaglione (Grade 7) will be baptized and receive his 1st Communion...



PASTOR'S COLUMN (continued)

Cody Douglas (Grade 6) will receive his 1st Communion, Troy Johnson (Grade 3) will make his Profession of Faith and become a member of the Catholic Church. Please remember all of them in your prayers this week as they prepare to receive these sacraments.

Confessions - In these last days before Easter, confessions will be heard on Monday, April 3 (our final Mercy Monday) and Tuesday, April 4 from 7pm to 8pm. The last scheduled confessions before Easter will be on Good Friday from 12:30pm until 2:00pm. *Confessions will not be heard on Holy Saturday*.

Parish Center Easter Schedule - The Parish Center will be closed on Good Friday and Easter Monday and will re-open on Tuesday, April 11th at 9am.

Living Stations of the Cross - Our school children will enact "The Living Stations of the Cross" on Holy Thursday at 1:30pm in the Parish Green parking lot. Parishioners are welcome to attend. Seating is not provided. If the weather is inclement, the Stations will be held in the school gym.

Holy Land Collection - This is a world wide collection whose purpose is to help protect and preserve the sacred places and shrines in the Holy Land. Since 1333, Franciscan Friars have been staffing and maintaining these sacred sites and serving the pastoral needs of the minority Christian community who live there as well as the thousands who visit to deepen their spiritual lives. This collection will be taken up on Good Friday.

Święconka - The Blessing of the Easter Baskets - With roots dating back to the early history of Poland swieconka is one of the most enduring and beloved Polish traditions on Holy Saturday. As Lent ends, along with its various disciplines including fasting, baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods are brought to be blessed on Holy Saturday. Easter baskets will be blessed in St. Paul Church at 1:00, 1:30 & 2:00 pm. The main foods blessed are an egg which is broken and shared by all on Easter Sunday morning, and a lamb molded of butter or pastry. This butter-lamb and blessed Easter egg have a place of honor on the Easter table. The foods in the baskets have a symbolic meaning: eggs - symbolize life and Christ's resurrection; bread - symbolic of Jesus, The Bread of Life; lamb - represents Christ, the Lamb of God; salt - represents purification; horseradish - symbolic of the bitter sacrifice of Christ; ham - symbolic of great joy and abundance. Of course you do not need to be Polish or Slavic to participate in this custom. This is a wonderful tradition to keep, or start, and to teach our children about these Faster baskets as well

PASTORAL COUNCIL—FEBRUARY MEETING

The Pastoral Council met on Monday, February 20, 2023. All current members of the council were present as well as guests Ashley Cuomo, head of the Culture of Life Ministry, Dan Tome, youth minister of the parish and Deacon Julio. The opening prayer was offered by Father Martin. Father Joe introduced and welcomed the newest member of the council and new trustee of the parish, Maura Chasse. Maura is a retired attorney with a vast knowledge of diocesan protocols and corporate law. She and her husband, Mark, are active participants in the parish. She will bring a wealth of knowledge and expertise to her new positions.

Ashley Cuomo gave a detailed description of the activities completed and planned for the future for the Culture of Life Ministry. Dan Tome offered a summary of the activities in which he is responsible as well as up and coming events. Jill Conaway, principal of the school, offered a written report citing a stable enrollment as well as the current initiatives with which the school is involved. Our school continues to be a vibrant, economically stable environment in which to educate our children. Robin Veronesi also offered a written report detailing the religious education program and the many activities in which she is involved.

The annual Ministry Fair will be held June 3 and 4th. This is a wonderful opportunity for parishioners to learn more about the varied and numerous ministries offered at St. Paul's. Father Joe reviewed the Lenten schedule and cited the numerous opportunities for parishioners to celebrate the season.

Deacon Julio presented a detailed summary of the finances, assets, and liabilities, of the parish including the church and the school. An approved balanced budget was reviewed and passed by the Finance Committee at their February 8th meeting. This budget included the following capital repair projects: the network upgrade throughout the campus, removing and resetting the roof tiles on the bell tower, resurfacing the parish green parking lot and power washing and pointing as needed on the church. Due to the generosity of our parishioners, both the church and school continue to be on sound financial ground.

Ed Schmitt updated the council on the work of the Technology Advisory Committee including the evaluation of our present technology and the steps that are being taken to address the deficiencies identified. This investment will result in improved technological experiences for our students, the parish office staff and the various ministries throughout the parish.

President Nancy Timbrell reported on the activities of the Social Action Ministry including The Underground, Homefront and St. Clare's Food Pantry. Father Michael updated the group on the various Evangelization and Adult Faith Formation groups within the parish. Father Michael offered the closing prayer. The next council meeting is scheduled for April 17th at 7 pm in the St. Paul Church hall. Parishioners are invited to attend.


