PASTOR'S COLUMN

Happy Easter! - There is nothing that has so transformed the world as the Resurrection of Jesus. *Death and sin have been overcome! The Lord is Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!* But let us take a step back and remember how we got to that point. Pope Francis in one of his Holy Week homilies a couple years ago



highlighted that Jesus came as a servant. "God saved us by taking upon himself all the punishment of our sins. Without complaining, but with the humility, patience and obedience of a servant, and purely out of love." But why did Jesus do this? Pope Francis explained saying: "So that when we

have our back to the wall, when we find ourselves at a dead end, with no light and no way of escape, when it seems that God himself is not responding, we should remember that we are not alone. 'Do not be afraid, you are not alone. I experienced all your desolation in order to be ever close to you'".

Today we recall God's plan for our salvation. What God created, he created good most especially we who are created in his image and likeness. Jesus' suffering and death reminds us most definitively how much God loves us. His suffering and death should also challenge us to live our lives in such a way that others will see the image and likeness of God through us. Today we renew our Baptismal promises. A new Paschal (Christ) Candle stands tall in the sanctuary representing Christ, the Light of the World. Let us once again resolve to live as children of the Light who have been saved and redeemed by Jesus. Let us not give into the ways of the world, but rather let us bring Christ's Light where there is darkness, hope where there is doubt, and faith where there is fear. Let us bring love and charity to replace selfishness and self-centeredness. As you leave Mass today the ushers will be giving you an Easter gift. It is a book entitled, Holy Moments, written by Matthew Kelly. It is a little book with 23 short reflections on how to live out our Baptismal commitments that we renew today. These practical and very relatable examples can touch all of our relationships and our daily activities. My good people, let us rejoice and be glad for the Lord is Risen Alleluia, Alleluia!! In the name of Frs. Martin, Michael and Raymond, Deacon Don, the entire parish staff and my own have a very Blessed Easter and Easter Season these next 50 days!

Welcome! - A warm word of welcome to all who join us this day! We extend that welcome to all who may be back today visiting family and friends in the area. To those who are here today but have been away because of lingering apprehensions around COVID or because you just got out of the practice of coming to Mass each week, we are so glad you

are here. We also offer a very special welcome to you if you have been away from the Church or the regular practice of your faith. If there has been anything keeping you away from a more regular participation in the life of the parish, the Friars are most willing to help walk with you through whatever may have kept you away.

What we have to offer you each week, and indeed every day at Mass, is nothing that truly comes from us, but rather comes from Jesus Himself. That is because Jesus offers you His very self in the Eucharist. This greatest of gifts can be received no where else. Jesus gives Himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us and wants to be close to us. "By receiving Holy Communion we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). In being united to the humanity of Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life." (USCCB)

We gather as a worshiping community to give praise to God and thank him for his blessings. We gather not as those who have no sins, but as those traveling this life needing spiritual nourishment to reach where God is calling us to be with himself in heaven. We know we cannot do that without his help and we do so by praying with and for each other. We do so as a community of faith that assists each other along this journey of faith. You are invited by Jesus and us, this local worshiping community, to join us each week to be strengthened and nourished. So once again, welcome and thank you for joining us today! We hope to see you again real soon!

Paschal Candles - The preeminent symbol of the Easter season is the Paschal Candle which stands tall in the sanctuary. This year two parishioners have made memorial gifts to cover the cost of this year's Paschal Candles, one for St. Paul and one for Sacred Heart. PRESENTATION OF THE GIFTS Friendly reminder: those who have made the offering for the intention for each Mass are invited to present the bread and wine during the Offertory for that Mass.
