





> April 16, 2023 Second Sunday of Easter Divine Mercy Sunday



"Let the Church always be a place of MERCY and HOPE, where EVERYONE is WELCOMED. LOVED and FORGIVEN."

Divine Mercy Sunday - Since 2001, the Second Sunday of Easter is also Divine Mercy Sunday. Pope St. John Paul II in his encyclical (*Dives in Misericordia* (*Rich in Mercy*) offered an extended meditation on the mystery of God's mercy, which he calls "the greatest of the attributes and perfections of God." He wrote: "As a gift to humanity, which sometimes seems bewildered and overwhelmed by the power of evil, selfishness, and fear, the Risen Lord offers His love that pardons, reconciles, and reopens hearts to love. It is a love that converts hearts and gives peace. How much the world needs to understand and accept Divine Mercy!" (13) Never fear to go to the Lord in confession and avail yourself of His Divine Mercy. Nothing is beyond his Mercy.

Congratulations! - During the Easter Vigil six young people (ages 4-13) were welcomed as members of the Catholic Church and/or were Baptized and/or received their 1st Holy Communions. Four were baptized: Anaiya Colon, Gavin Douglas and Lylianna McBriarty as well as Tyler Ciaffaglione who also received his 1st Communion. Cody Douglas also received his 1st Communion. (Lylianna and Tyler are in third grade and will receive their 1st Holy Communions next month with their classmates.) In addition, Troy Johnson, having been previously baptized in another Christian church, made his Profession of Faith in the Catholic faith. We congratulate all six of these young people and continue to offer to them our prayerful support. There are other young people who have also been prepared to receive Sacraments this spring, but will be doing so in the coming weeks. Thanks goes out to Robin Veronessi, our DRE, and Dan Tome, our Youth Minister, for helping to prepare them for these sacraments and to their parents and sponsors for helping them in their faith journeys!

In addition, Jeffrey Kemper, Myreon Colon and Angelica Rodriquez, who have been in our RCIA program since October, received all three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion) while Alexander Dionne received the Sacraments Confirmation and Holy Communion. Under the leadership of Fr. Raymond, and the very able assistance of Linda Guzzardi, they explored the essentials of the Catholic faith and completed their journey of being fully initiated into the Catholic faith.

Mystagogy and the Neophytes - So what is next for Jeffrey, Myreon, Colon and Alex now that they are fully initiated into the Catholic Church? The fourth and final stage of the RCIA is called "mystagogy," from the Greek words meaning "to lead through the mysteries." Traditionally, mystagogy extends throughout the Easter season until the feast of Pentecost. This is a period of accompaniment for new Catholics as they discover what it means to fully participate in the sacramental mysteries of the Church. The newly baptized are called

"neophytes," from the Greek words meaning "new plant," because the faith has been newly planted in them. Even though they have received the Sacraments, they still have much to learn about what it means to live as Catholic Christians. During mystagogy, Jeffrey, Myreon, Angelica and Alex will continue to meet and come to Mass together and reflect on their experience of conversion, learn more about the Church, and consider how they might get involved in ministry and outreach. They will need our ongoing support so that the faith newly planted in them can grow deep roots. Mystagogy is a lifelong process so I will have a few thoughts on that next week.

Holy Week and Easter Thanks! - I hope our liturgical celebrations of Holy Week and Easter were spiritually uplifting for all who attended. It was a blessing to have so many, just over 2,000, in attendance for the Easter Masses! So much goes into making these liturgies possible by a large number of people. Thanks to all who served the parish as Readers, Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion, Altar Servers, Masters of Ceremony, Sacristans, and as Ushers and Greeters. All of you play an integral role in each liturgy. I offer a very special word of thanks to Fr. Michael who coordinated all of the liturgies. Much time was put into planning, rehearsing, and executing. We are blessed that so many parishioners are willing to share the gifts of the Spirit so that we can build up the Body of Christ. Special thanks to Jeff Batter, the cantors, choir and our guest musicians! Your dedication to the rehearsal schedule was guite evident.

We owe a great deal of thanks once again to Fr. Raymond who coordinated the decorating at St. Paul's with the able help of Bill Dicicco, Patrick Walsh and Emily Armetta as well as Donna Bordonaro, Andrea Fiori-Brandl, and Judy Nowak who helped make it all just right! This year they also had the assistance of four of our Confirmation students Austin Boninsegna, Karolina Carlone, Maura Kane and Katie Tierney. They were able to learn and witness dedication at work! Mary Corrigan, Georgie Cote, Laurie Dauphin, Nancy Timbrell and Fr. Martin did the same at Sacred Heart Church. Thanks to everyone for sharing your talent and, most especially, your time!!

That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets. he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him. "Stay with us. for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then




