

His Sacrifice, and ours! - Since my last update, another 99 pledges or donations, in excess of \$24,000, have been made to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal (AAA). As of June 5th, 440 parishioners have pledged or donated \$98,917. This is 91% of our \$108,000 goal and 80% of our parish total last year which was \$122,750. The average gift this year is \$225. During the Lent and Easter season, we reflected a great deal about *His Sacrifice* for us. Hopefully the AAA can inspire us "to make sacrifices of our own in order to help others whose need is greater than ours." I encourage all who have made a gift in the past, but not yet made their gift yet this year to please do so. I also invite those who have not participated in the AAA to do so this year. Remember all gifts, no matter the amount, will help provide for the needs of our less fortunate sisters and brothers in Christ. *Thank you and God bless you for your generosity.*
