

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Coadjutor Archbishop Christopher J. Coyne - Normally my clock radio wakes me up, and along with it I get to listen to the morning news. This past Monday I must have been a little more drowsy than usual because I did not hear the news. So, much to my surprise, after the 7am Mass a parishioner says, "so we have a new Archbishop". Such announcements are almost always made at Noon time in Rome, which is 6am here. A guick search led to seeing that we did not have a new archbishop just yet, but we did know who the next one would be. The Bishop of Burlington, Vermont (which comprises all of Vermont), Christopher J. Coyne, was named by Pope Francis to be the Coadjutor Archbishop of Hartford. There is a letter from Archbishop Blair as an insert today that addresses his request for a coadjutor and the transition that will take place. (Skip ahead to the 6:55 mark.)

All bishops must submit a letter of resignation when they reach the age of 75. In anticipation of his 75th birthday on April 12, 2024, Archbishop Blair asked the Holy Father for the appointment of a coadjutor bishop. A coadjutor bishop is "a bishop appointed to a Catholic diocese or archdiocese to assist the diocesan bishop. Unlike an auxiliary bishop, the coadjutor (arch)bishop has the right of succession, meaning that he automatically becomes the new bishop when the diocesan bishop retires, resigns, or dies." In his letter, Archbishop Blair indicates that he intends to remain as Archbishop until he reaches retirement age.

Archbishop Coyne is a native of Boston and was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Boston on June 7, 1986. He was ordained a bishop on March 2, 2011 and was appointed as an Auxiliary Bishop of Indianapolis. He was installed as the 10th Bishop of Burlington, Vermont on January 29, 2015. Cardinal Sean O'Malley, the Archbishop of Boston, said this about



Archbishop Coyne: "Throughout his priesthood and episcopacy, he has ministered with the heart of a pastor. He exemplifies exactly what the Holy Father wants from his bishops, which is to be near their flock. He is a skilled communicator and gifted liturgist

who understands the need to meet people where they are with an open and compassionate heart." He will be formally welcomed to the Archdiocese of Hartford on Monday, October 9 at 2pm at the Cathedral of St. Joseph.

Archbishop Coyne earned a Master of Divinity from St. John's Seminary, Boston (1986) and a Licentiate (1992) and Doctorate (1994) in Sacred Liturgy from the Pontifical Athenaeum of Saint Anselm in Rome. According to his biography on the Burlington Diocese website, "Bishop Coyne is a lifelong Patriots, Celtics and Bruins fan, a (Maine) beach bum and an avid skier and golfer." I guess he is not a baseball fan or he has a hidden allegiance, maybe it's the Orioles! I do not think so!

Happy Independence Day! - Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord. Psalms 33: 12 On Tuesday we will celebrate our 247th anniversary as a nation, just three years short of our semiguincentennial. In the midst of time for a parade, a jaunt to the beach, 18 holes, a good old fashioned cookout, a baseball game and the night sky full of fireworks, or illuminations as John Adams called them, to round out the day, let us not forget to remember from whom all blessings come and the role that God and moral values played in the founding document of this nation. Our society is straying far from the vision of our forefathers, some who were not overly religious men but nonetheless appealed to a higher power on which to stake their claim for independence. Jefferson wrote and the 56 Signers affirmed: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." At the end of the Declaration, they again affirmed their "firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence" as they pledged to each other "their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor." Let us not acquiesce to the call of some to eliminate God from our culture and nation. Without God, who has blessed our country with such abundance, we will be no nation at all.

PASTORAL COUNCIL - JUNE MEETING

The Pastoral Council met on Monday, June 19, 2023. All current members of the council were present as well as Deacon Julio. The opening prayer was offered by Father Michael.

Jill Conaway submitted a written report highlighting a fall enrollment, as of now, of 246 students, along with ongoing initiatives and the date for the opening of school in the fall, which will be August 24th. Robin Veronesi also submitted a written report of the religious education program. The schedule for the 2023-24 school year has been developed and the process of securing speakers for the Confirmation retreats, as well as other events, is ongoing. Online registration for religious education classes will open in mid July. The children's Masses will continue throughout the summer and will be announced in the bulletin.

The Pastoral Council subcommittees have been formed and the chairs will be contacting those parishioners who expressed interest in joining one of the groups. These committees will work in conjunction with the Pastoral Council in providing support for our current parish ministries. They will also look to ways in which they can better serve the needs of parents and young families.

The Ministry Fair was well attended and resulted in many parishioners signing up for more information on various ministries and groups. This fair will be an annual event.

Parishioners have received this year's raffle tickets from St. Roch's. Thus far, over \$16,000 worth of tickets have been sold and stubs returned. To date, 63% of those purchasing tickets have purchased all 5 tickets. This is a very successful fund raiser for the parish, yielding, to date, over \$100,000 since our participation began.

The 2023-24 slate of officers was presented. Mary Corrigan will serve as president. Bud Volz will serve as vice president and Betty Lasker will continue as secretary. This year Tom Sullivan completed his tenure on the council and Nancy Timbrell finished her term as president. The by-laws call for her remaining on the Council for one more year as an ex officio member.

Father Joe reviewed the parish's participation in the Corpus Christi procession as well as plans for the 800th anniversary of Greccio, being led by Father Martin. More information on each, as well as up and coming activities for this year's Eucharistic Series, will be found in future bulletins and email blasts.

Deacon Julio reported that the parish and school continue to be in good financial shape. From the Forward with Faith Campaign, the parish has received its first monetary distribution of \$128,300 from the Hartford Bishops Foundation. This money will be used for all of the elements that were part

of the parish's part of the Forward With Faith campaign including the upgrades to our streaming capabilities and the sound system throughout the church.

This summer, the playground, parking lot, and bell tower will undergo repairs.

Plans continue to be finalized for the parish picnic, Feast of St. Peter and St. Paul. and the Berlin Fair. The bulletin and website have more detailed information.

Father Michael reported that the men's groups continue to meet. The Scripture Study group has wrapped up their session although a group will be taking place this summer that will focus on the Sermon on the Mount. The Women of Faith group will take a break this summer and resume meeting in the fall.

The meeting concluded with a review of the dates for next year's Pastoral Council meetings as well as the New Parishioner Orientation meetings. The next Pastoral Council meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 18, 2023. Parishioners are invited to attend.


Thank You!
