





It Was a Happy Feast Day! - Thank you to the members of the Pastoral Council, President Mary Corrigan, Maura Chasse, Dwight Davis, Betty Lasker, Fayne Molloy, Elaine Pavasaris, Nancy Timbrell and Bud Volz who arranged for the food and scooped out the ice cream as part of our Parish Feast Day celebration this past Thursday. Once again this year we had very nice weather and were able to enjoy a beautiful evening under the gazebo. Thanks to the over 100 people who joined us for Mass and/or the ice cream! On the other end of the day following our regular 7:00 am Mass, the former 1st Friday Breakfast crew offered a delicious breakfast on June 29th as well. It is good for us to gather around the table of the Lord and then to share community with each other too. My deepest appreciation to all who had a hand in making it happen including our choir who provided music for the evening Mass.

Parish Raffle - We are already in the final month of sales for our parish raffle. As of June 30th, 1,021 tickets have been bought which is 45% of last year's total of 2,229. In addition to the \$30,000 first prize, there are another 22 prizes totaling an additional \$38,000 including a \$10,000 second prize, an \$8,000 third prize, and twenty (20) \$1,000 prizes. All prizes are awarded in American Express Gift Cards. All checks should be made out to St. Paul's and tickets should be returned to St. Paul's. Tickets can be returned at the Parish Center, in the collection basket, or by mail using the selfaddressed envelope that was included in the mailing. Please make your returns by August 4th in advance of the drawing on August 12. Special thanks to the 261 parishioners who have bought at least one ticket thus far. This is the parish's only fund raiser of the year so your support is vital to our success. Good Luck to all!

Thanks to all who continue to volunteer and all who donate food and cash that enable us to help so many in need.

Thank you for Supporting the FMA! - Back in April Fr. Boguslaw Dabrowski, OFM Conv. was with us on behalf of the work of Conventual Franciscan missionaries around the world. Recently we sent a check in the amount of \$8,048 to the Franciscan Mission Association. Thank you for being so very generous! That was the first of three mission collections that are taken up each year. At the end of July, the Mission Co-Op collection will be held. We will have another visitor for that collection as Bishop Antonysamy Francis from the Diocese of Kumbakonam in India will be with us. More on that in the coming weeks.

His Sacrifice, and ours! - If you have not made a gift to this year's Archbishop's Annual Appeal (AAA) I ask you to do so as your means allow. With the early deadline for this bulletin, I



Gospel: Matthew 13:1-23

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore. And he spoke to them at length in parables, saving: "A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. Whoever has ears ought to hear." The disciples approached him and said, "Why do you speak to them in parables?" He said to them in reply, "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted. To anyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. This is why I speak to them in parabecause they look but do not see and hear but do not listen or understand. Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in them, which says: You shall indeed hear but not understand, you shall indeed look but never see. Gross is the heart of this people, they will hardly hear with their ears, they have closed their eyes, lest they see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their hearts and be converted, and I heal them. "But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it. "Hear then the parable of the sower. The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart. The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a time. When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away.




