





Grandparents Day Next Sunday - On January 31, 2021 Pope Francis designated the 4th Sunday of July as World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. He chose the 4th Sunday of July because of its proximity to July 26th which the Church celebrates as the Feast of Saints Joachim and Ann who were the parents of Mary and therefore the grandparents of Jesus. I'll have more on Grandparents Day next Sunday, but for now maybe grandchildren, in particular, can plan on doing something special with and for their grandparents next Sunday, July 23 or the days around the Feasts of Saints Joachim and Ann on July 26th.

New Playground Surface Coming - The surface of the playground at the back of the Parish Center is one of this year's summer projects. It has been 15 years since the original surface was put in, and its useful age is quickly expiring. The yearly repairs also deem it time to put in a new surface. Its so called "bounceability" has also diminished. (I must say I never remember anyone concerned about the bounceability of the parking lots that us kids played on growing up. I know, it is a sign of my aging to say that.) The removal and installation of the new surface will cost about \$60,000. An anonymous donor is covering the entire cost. As a result, this project will have no effect on either the school or parish budget. We are so very grateful for the generosity of this donor.

His Sacrifice, and Ours! - The Archbishop's Annual Appeal helps provide the critical funding needed to feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, counsel those in despair, offer muchneeded assistance to the unemployed and under-employed, and make medical care available to those without health insurance. The Parish Green will host the start and finish lines. You can also just come for the games, music and fellowship and wait for those doing the running and walking to return.

Fr. Vitus Mensah, OFM Conv. - Not many parishioners would have met him, only the 7am Mass crowd, but Franciscan Friar Father Vitus Mensah visited our Friary for a couple days last week. Fr. Vitus heads up the Franciscan

Friars St. Anthony of Padua Custody in Ghana, West Africa. He is in his first year of leadership among the Friars of Ghana. He was here to visit with Fr. Raymond who spent 9 years in Ghana and who helped to grow the mission. Fr. Vitus wanted to learn some of the history of the



mission first hand. He also met with Fr. Martin who for a number of years was the Director of our Franciscan Mission Association that was the arm that supported the work that the Friars did among the people in Ghana. I mention his visit because Ghana remains one of the missions that your dollars and prayers support that I reported on in last week's bulletin. See photo on page 6.

Your Maintenance and Repairs Dollars at Work - From time to time I try to share with you how your once a month Maintenance and Repairs (M & R) donations are used by the parish. Recently the hot water heater in the friary gave up the ghost. The Friars were grateful it was July and not January! A new on-demand system was installed. In doing so, there will be some savings on the natural gas bill since there is no longer a hot water tank.

You might recall that last summer that we had work done on the church/school parking lot and the small lot between the Friary and Parish Center. This involved sealing the cracks and a complete resealing of the those lots. This summer it is time to do the same for the Parish Green parking lot. There will also be some sealing of cracks in the school lot as well. This work is on the calendar and will be done in August before school is back in session. A smaller project that is scheduled to be done for school starts is the repainting of the flag pole in front of the school. The total of these projects is in the neighborhood of \$20,000.

There are other projects in the pipeline including the scoping of our underground drainage pipes (pun intended) and work that needs to be done on the bell tower for St. Paul Church. More on those projects at a later date. Most of these projects come out of the work of our Facilities Committee. As a parish we can tackle these items in a timely way because of your ongoing generosity and support of the weekly collections and especially the monthly M & R collection. These projects alone are almost 40% of the M & R budgeted income. Thank you for your generosity that allows us to do this work.

Jesus proposed another parable to the crowds, saying: "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off. When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well. The slaves of the householder came to him and said, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where have the weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' His slaves said to him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' He replied, 'No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, "First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn."" He proposed another parable to them. "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that a person took and sowed in a field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes a large bush, and the 'birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches." He spoke to them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed with three measures of wheat flour until the whole batch was leavened." All these things Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables. He spoke to them only in parables, to fulfill what had been said through the prophet: I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation of the world. Then. dismissing the crowds, he went into the house. His disciples approached him and said, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field." He said in reply, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels. Just as weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age.






